# grade

## **bubble**

n. a thin, round, and often transparent mass of gas that is surrounded by a thin layer of liquid; a state of economic or social prosperity that is unsustainable and eventually collapses

synonym: blob, balloon, mania

(1) **bubble** in the champagne glass, (2) economic **bubble** Many people worry that the current real estate market is a **bubble** that could burst soon.

#### excitement

- n. a feeling of great enthusiasm and eagernesssynonym: thrill, exhilaration, incitement
- (1) the **excitement** in the business world, (2) aesthetic **excitement**

The excitement of the upcoming concert was palpable

among the crowd.

## excite

- v. to make someone feel suddenly enthusiastic or eager synonym: thrill, exhilarate, animate

# frail

- adj. weak, delicate, and easily broken or worn out; lacking physical, mental, or emotional strength
- synonym: weak, delicate, fragile
- (1) frail body, (2) frail condition

My grandfather's health has declined, and he is now quite frail.

# patron

- n. a person who gives financial or other support to a person, organization, or activity; a loyal or regular customer of a particular shop, restaurant, etc.
- synonym: contributor, sponsor, supporter
- the patron saint of a place, (2) political patron
   they have been a patron of this restaurant for many years.

## refuse

- v. to show that one is not willing to do or accept something synonym: turn down, deny, decline
- (1) **refuse** a request, (2) **refuse** the company My initial reaction was to **refuse**.

# oppress

- to treat people in a cruel and authoritarian way, especially by denying them the same freedoms, rights, etc. as other people
- synonym: antagonize, distress, burden
- (1) **oppress** the minority, (2) **oppress** the people with force Historically, many countries have often **oppressed** certain religions to gain the support of the majority of the population.

#### march

v. to walk militarily with stiff, regular steps

*synonym*: parade

(1) **march** against the war, (2) **march** east The troops **marched** shoulder-to-shoulder.

# nonviolence

n. the use of peaceful means, such as civil disobedience or passive resistance, rather than violence to achieve a goal, especially in the context of political or social change

synonym: pacifism, nonresistance, peacekeeping

(1) **nonviolence** movement, (2) **nonviolence** protest Martin Luther King Jr. was a champion of **nonviolence** in the fight for civil rights.

# impressive

adj. arousing admiration due to size, quality, or skillsynonym: impactful, remarkable, exceptional

(1) **impressive** performances, (2) an **impressive** array of facts

The budget reduction was an **impressive** feat for our nation.

# shock

 a strong feeling or physical reaction to a sudden and unexpected event or experience, especially something unpleasant

synonym: amazement, surprise, stunner

(1) death from shock, (2) shock-resistantHe got an electric shock at work.

## seamstress

a woman who sews, especially one who earns her living by sewing

synonym: sewer, needleworker, dressmaker

(1) **seamstress** shop, (2) skilled **seamstress**My grandmother is a talented **seamstress** and can sew anything from curtains to dresses.

# inequality

 the unfairness of a society in which some people have more opportunity, money, etc. than others; (mathematics) relation between two values when they are different

synonym: imbalance, prejudice, unfairness

(1) **inequality** in salary, (2) algebraic **inequality**There are several causes of economic **inequality** within societies.

#### confuse

v. to mistake one thing for another; to make somebody hard to understand

*synonym*: confound, obscure, disorient

(1) **confuse** the listener, (2) **confuse** fantasy with reality Her remarks **confused** the debate.

# autobiography

*n.* a written account of someone's own life, written by that person

*synonym*: bio, life story, biography

(1) **autobiography** of his early life, (2) fictionalized **autobiography** 

She wrote an **autobiography** detailing her journey from poverty to success.

# lengthy

adj. tediously continuing for a long time; very long in time or size

synonym: extended, interminable, long

(1) to be a **lengthy** process, (2) **lengthy** load times

The **lengthy** medical treatment had weakened his muscles.

# assignment

 a duty or task given to someone, usually as part of their job or studies

synonym: task, duty, designation

(1) finish the **assignment**, (2) **assignment** of interest My **assignment** was overwhelming and complicated, but it was also exciting.

#### stride

v. to walk with long steps in a particular direction; (noun) an important and positive progress

synonym: step, walk, march

(1) **stride** across a room, (2) **stride** down a slope She **strides** confidently across the stage to accept her

# initially

adv. at the beginning; at first synonym: originally, primarily, firstly

(1) initially anticipated, (2) diagnosed initially as a tumor

This train departed later than initially scheduled.

#### holster

 a case or pouch designed to hold a handgun securely and provide quick access when needed

synonym: case, sheath, scabbard

(1) holster weapon, (2) ankle holster

He reached for his gun in its leather **holster** as the intruder approached.

#### mess

- a state of confusion, dirtiness, or untidiness; (verb) to fail to do something or to make something dirty or untidy
- synonym: disarray, confusion, predicament
- (1) have a whole **mess**, (2) get into a **mess** He made a frightful **mess** in his room.

# grandchild

- n. a child of someone's son or daughtersynonym: offspring, descendant, progeny

# proverb

 a short saying that expresses a truth or gives advice based on practical experience

synonym: adage, saying, maxim

a hackneyed proverb, (2) ancient proverb
 famous proverb "actions speak louder than words"

reminds us to focus on deeds instead of words.

#### remark

*n.* a comment or observation, or something said or written about a particular subject or situation; (verb) to give a

spoken statement on a particular subject or situation synonym: comment, observation, statement

- (1) a flattering **remark**, (2) **remark** dripping with bitterness His candid **remark** at the meeting sparked a lively discussion among the attendees.
- to break something; (noun) a woman's chest, or the measurement around a woman's chest; (noun) an occasion for something excessive, such as work, eating, drinking, etc.

synonym: ruin, fall apart, (noun) breast

- (1) **bust** my leg, (2) the **bust** of the statue I'm **bust** with preparation for tomorrow's meeting.
- to carry or transport something, especially by hand or with some effort; to haul or convey something from one place to another

synonym: carry, haul, transport

(1) **tote** a cell-phone, (2) **tote** her books in a colorful backpack

Can you help me tote these groceries to the car?

to captivate or fascinate; to hold the complete attention of

synonym: captivate, trance, enchant

(1) **mesmerize** a subject, (2) **mesmerize** with magic The magician's performance **mesmerized** the audience.

adj. easy to see, discover or understand synonym: apparent, conspicuous, evident

- (1) **obvious** reasons, (2) his conclusion was **obvious** There are **obvious** differences between the two wine-producing regions.
- a contest or competition, typically one in which participants exert themselves physically or mentally to achieve victory or surpass others

mesmerize

agon

synonym: struggle, conflict, fight

(1) emotional **agon**, (2) an **agon** of creativity

The weightlifting competition brought together athletes from different countries for an international **agon**.

# primarily

adv. mainly

synonym: largely, mainly, mostly

(1) intended **primarily** for young people, (2) **primarily** affect adults

All peaceful cooperation is based **primarily** on mutual trust.

#### racism

n. prejudice, discrimination, or antagonism directed against a person or people based on their membership in a particular ethnic group, typically one that is a minority or marginalized

synonym: prejudice, discrimination, bias

(1) systemic **racism**, (2) research on anti- **racism**The school's lack of diversity was a clear indication of the **racism** present in the community.

#### racial

adj. of or related to the race (= classification of humans into groups based on physical traits or social relations)

*synonym*: ethnic, tribal, ethnical

(1) **racial** prejudice, (2) **racial** and ethnic backgrounds A minor **racial** conflict later led to a civil war.

#### sensitive

adj. able to notice slight changes, signals, or influences; able to feel or perceive other's feelings; susceptible to the things people say or do

*synonym*: exposed, susceptible, keen

(1) **sensitive** documents, (2) baby with **sensitive** skin The teacher is very **sensitive** to children's feelings.

# sociologist

- a person who studies the institutions and development of human society
- (1) religious sociologist, (2) French sociologist

**Sociologist** studies the changes in family structure due to modernization.

#### robin

 a small bird from the thrush family, typically having a red breast and found across Europe, Asia, and North America

synonym: thrush, red-breast, redbird

(1) robin eggs, (2) robin's nest

I love listening to the cheerful song of the **robin** in my garden.

# fragility

 the quality of being easily broken, damaged, or destroyed; the state of being delicate or vulnerable

synonym: delicacy, weakness, frailty

(1) fragility of life, (2) emotional fragility

The **fragility** of the glass required careful handling during shipping.

# argue

v. to express differing opinions or points of view, often in a heated or contentious manner; to present a case or reasoning to persuade or convince others

synonym: debate, dispute, quarrel

(1) argue a case, (2) argue passionately

The couple began to **argue** over which restaurant to go to for dinner.

# privilege

 a special right or advantage that only one person or group of people has, usually because they are rich and powerful in a society

synonym: benefit, authorization, advantage

(1) a breach of **privilege**, (2) **privilege** of membership In the Middle Ages, the right to hunt in the wild was the **privilege** of royalty and nobility.

# contemplate

v. to think about a possible future action or to think about something for a long time thoughtfully

synonym: think over, ponder, consider

(1) contemplate a marriage, (2) contemplated leaving

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school

I recently **contemplated** dropping out of school and getting a full-time job.

#### confront

v. to face, meet or deal with a problem or difficult situation or person

synonym: engage, encounter, contend

(1) **confront** a global warming, (2) **confront** the issue He finally decided to **confront** problems directly.

evil

adj. profoundly immoral, cruel, and wicked; having or exerting a harmful effect on people

*synonym*: malign, corruption, immorality

(1) **evil** ways, (2) a charm against **evil** Corruption is an **evil** act for any reason.

## actualize

- v. to make real or concrete; to bring into existence or implementation; to fulfill or realize a potential or intention
   synonym: realize, accomplish, effectuate
- (1) **actualize** your ideas, (2) **actualize** the company's vision I need to **actualize** my plan to make it a reality.

# appointment

 a formal arrangement to meet someone at a particular time and place, especially for a reason connected with their work; the act of putting a person into a job or position of responsibility

synonym: assignment, selection, commission

(1) **appointment** calendar, (2) take up an **appointment** We had to reschedule the dentist's **appointment**.

# principal

adj. most important, main, or chief synonym: main, leading, chief

(1) **principal** actor, (2) **principal** responsible

The **principal** reason for the company's success is its innovative products.

## debunk

- v. to expose or dismiss as false, exaggerated, or worthlesssynonym: expose, discredit, demystify
- (1) **debunk** an urban legend, (2) **debunk** theory The myth was **debunked** by scientists, who provided evidence to the contrary.

# myth

- n. an ancient story or set of stories accepted as history, especially explaining the worldview of a peoplesynonym: fable, legend, lore
- (1) the **myth** of an old religion, (2) perpetuate a **myth** With the financial bubble bursting, the **myth** of economic growth in investment banking collapsed.

# apologize

v. to express regret for committing wrongdoing or causing a problem

synonym: excuse, justify, atone

(1) **apologize** for being late, (2) **apologize** ahead of time **I apologize** for neglecting your email.

#### misinformation

- n. information that is false or inaccurate, or the act of giving wrong information, especially deliberatelysynonym: falsity, misreport, misstatement
- (1) **misinformation** about a vaccine, (2) combat **misinformation** on social media

The government called for caution against pseudoscientific **misinformation** about vaccines.

#### miraculous

- adj. very effective or lucky, or completely unexpectedsynonym: amazing, astonishing, awesome
- (1) a **miraculous** encounter, (2) go through a **miraculous** change

He made a **miraculous** recovery.

# gap

 a conspicuous disparity or difference separates something such as a figure, people, their opinions, situation, etc.

synonym: opening, lacuna, spread

(1) the **gap** between ideal and reality, (2) distance **gap**Many people are working together to close the gender **gap**.

## educate

v. to provide or receive instruction or training over a period of time at a school, university, etc.

synonym: instruct, teach, train

(1) educate student, (2) educate public

The school's mission is to **educate** young children and prepare them for the future.

# responsible

adj. answerable or accountable for something within one's power, control, or management

synonym: accountable, answerable, liable

(1) **responsible** action, (2) **responsible** for a customer service

She's a **responsible** pet owner who ensures her dog gets enough exercise and a healthy diet.

# burden

 a duty, responsibility, etc. that is oppressive or worrisome; a load, typically a heavy one that is difficult to carry

synonym: obligation, duty, load

(1) carry a **burden**, (2) **burden** of disease

That car has a low environmental **burden**.

#### lifetime

- n. the duration of someone's life or something's existence;synonym: lifespan, duration
- (1) **lifetime** benefits, (2) **lifetime** ban from the sport She had lived through two world wars in her **lifetime**.

# amazing

adj. extremely surprising, especially in a way that you like or admire

synonym: exceptional, extraordinary, wonderful

(1) **amazing** advances, (2) the most **amazing** feeling The golfer recorded an **amazing** distance.

# emerge

v. to move out of or away from something and become visible

*synonym*: arise, occur, appear

(1) **emerge** as a butterfly, (2) **emerge** from poverty During colonial eras, new migratory patterns **emerged**.

#### accidental

*adj.* happening or existing by chance or unintentionally *synonym*: inadvertent, fortuitous, coincidental

(1) **accidental** death, (2) cover **accidental** damage This system prevents **accidental** deletion of data.

# boycott

v. to refuse to buy, use, or patronize a particular product or service as a form of protest or to bring about change; (noun) a deliberate and organized refusal to buy or use a product, service, or organization as a form of protest or to apply pressure for change

synonym: protest, abstain, avoid

(1) **boycott** campaign, (2) **boycott** the discussion Many people have decided to **boycott** the company due to their unethical practices.

arrest

- v. to take into custodysynonym: capture, detain, imprison
- (1) arrest the thief, (2) arrest the progress

A police officer has the authority to **arrest** a criminal.

#### church

 a building or institution dedicated to religious worship or activities; a Christian religious organization or denomination

synonym: chapel, cathedral, synagogue

(1) church bell, (2) small church

The **church** on the corner is hosting a free community meal tonight.

## bomb

 a weapon that explodes and is used to kill or injure people or to cause damage to something

synonym: missile, explosive, ammunition

(1) atomic **bombs**, (2) disarm the **bomb**The use of cluster **bombs** is strictly prohibited by international law.

# shotgun

 a firearm that is designed to be fired from the shoulder and that typically fires several small metal balls or pellets called shot

synonym: scattergun, blunderbuss

(1) a **shotgun** marriage, (2) a 12-gauge **shotgun**The robbers used a **shotgun** to threaten the store clerk.

# constant

adj. happening repeatedly or all the time synonym: ceaseless, stable, unchanging

(1) a **constant** wind, (2) a **constant** temperature **Constant** dropping wears away the stone.

# threat

 a strong indication or likelihood of harm, danger, or adverse consequences; an expression of intent to inflict harm or injury on someone or something, often made as a means of coercion or intimidation

synonym: menace, danger, hazard

(1) economic **threat**, (2) environmental **threat**The **threat** of severe weather prompted the city to issue an evacuation warning.

# persistent

 adj. continuing firmly or obstinately in the course of action despite difficulty or opposition; lasting or enduring without fading or being lost over time

synonym: tenacious, steadfast, unrelenting

(1) persistent cough, (2) persistent data

Despite the setbacks, he remained **persistent** in his pursuit of his dreams.

# employ

v. to give somebody a job and pay them for it; to make use of

synonym: hire, engage, use

(1) **employ** job seekers, (2) **employ** a new method

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When making arrests, police officers frequently **employ** excessive force.

# eventually

adv. finally, particularly after a long time or a lot of struggle, complications, and so on

*synonym*: finally, someday, ultimately

(1) **eventually** become obsolete, (2) **eventually** succeed The corporation **eventually** dominated the entire tobacco business.

## slave

 a person who is, either legally or illegally, owned by someone; a person entirely dominated by some influence or a person

synonym: captive, bondservant, hard worker

(1) a **slave** of drink, (2) a **slave** trader

You should work hard but not be a **slave** to it.

# whitewash

 a substance made of lime and water used to cover walls or fences; a deliberate attempt to conceal or gloss over unpleasant or controversial facts or events

synonym: cover-up, mask, camouflage

(1) whitewash paint, (2) academic whitewash

The politician was accused of attempting to **whitewash** his involvement in the controversial project.

# graduate

 a person who has a first degree from university or college; (verb) to complete the first course of university or college and get a degree

synonym: alumna, alum, grad

graduate degree program, (2) honor graduate
 Many employers hire graduate trainees to train as managers.

#### brilliant

adj. extremely clever, skilled, or impressive synonym: luminous, intelligent, clever

(1) brilliant idea, (2) brilliant performance

The more **brilliant** you are, the more people around you look at you with envy and jealousy.

# individual

- n. a single person or thing, as distinct from a groupsynonym: person, being, self
- (1) a private **individual**, (2) **individual** freedom
  As an **individual**, he had the right to make his own decisions and live his life as he saw fit.

#### movement

 a group of people working together to achieve a shared goal, especially a political, social, or artistic one; the process of moving or being moved, physically or figuratively

synonym: motion, progression, action

(1) a circular **movement**, (2) **movement** of troops

The **movement** of the dancers on stage was graceful and elegant.

# specifically

adv. only associated with or meant for one thingsynonym: especially, particularly, notably

(1) designed **specifically** for men, (2) for **specifically** American customers

This ad campaign is aimed specifically at young women.

## convict

- v. to prove or declare someone to be guilty of a crime; (noun) a person serving a sentence in a jail or prison synonym: condemn, sentence, judge
- (1) **convict** him of manslaughter, (2) **convict** in a jail He was **convicted** on fraud charges and sentenced to five years in prison.

#### draft

 a preliminary version of something that is not yet in its final form

synonym: blueprint, outline, rough drawing

(1) a working **draft**, (2) write the first **draft**During debates in the legislature, the **draft** of the law caused a lot of controversies.

# submission

 the act of giving a document, proposal, etc., to somebody for consideration or judgment; the act of giving in or yielding to a superior force or authority synonym: obedience, yielding, compliance

(1) **submission** agreement, (2) **submission** of a final report The **submission** deadline for the project is next week.

#### intellect

- n. the ability to think logically and comprehend information, especially at an advanced levelsynonym: mind, brightness, cleverness
- (1) enrich my **intellect**, (2) human **intellect**Your **intellect** is capable of distinguishing among similar objects.

# strike

- v. to wallop somebody or something with the hand, fist, or weapon; to have an emotional or cognitive impact upon synonym: hit, impact, influence
- strike up a conversation, (2) strike a blow
   we strike to achieve more wages and safer working conditions.

# problematic

- *adj.* full of difficulties; difficult to deal with or solve *synonym*: inappropriate, inconvenient, worrisome
- (1) a **problematic** situation, (2) seems to be highly **problematic**

Direct democracy is effective in quickly resolving **problematic** situations within a community.

# maid

- a girl or young woman employed to do domestic worksynonym: servant, housekeeper, domestic
- maid service, (2) a waiting maid
   The live-in maid came in to clean the room every day.

tight

- adj. fixed, fastened, or kept together firmly or closely synonym: closed, secured, cramped
- a tight game, (2) student on a tight budget
   The national election was held amid tight security.

#### scenario

a description of possible actions or events in the future;
 a written outline of a play, film, or literary work

*synonym*: plan, scheme, procedure

(1) the worst case **scenario**, (2) number of different **scenarios** 

The president prepared several possible **scenarios** for an enemy attack.

#### assassin

- n. a person who murders a prominent or well-known person for political reasons or in exchange for moneysynonym: killer, manslayer
- (1) fall victim to an **assassin**, (2) would-be **assassin**She hired an **assassin** to kill her opponent.

## domestic

adj. relating to or inside a particular country, not foreign or international

synonym: endemic, private, household

- (1) domestic airline, (2) a domestic animal
- GDP stands for gross domestic product.

# sink

v. to submerge or go down below the surface of a liquid or substance; to decline or deteriorate; to cause something to go down into a liquid substance or sink into something else

*synonym*: descend, drop, plummet

(1) sink a lot of capital, (2) sink a buzzer-beater The abandoned ship slowly began to sink into the murky waters of the harbor.

sob

- v. to cry or weep with short, sudden sounds synonym: cry, weep, wail
- (1) **sob** out a story, (2) **sob** quietly

She **sobbed** uncontrollably after hearing the news.

# inconsolably

adv. without being able to be comforted or relieved; in a way that cannot be consoled or comforted

synonym: unhappily, disconsolately

(1) inconsolably sad, (2) inconsolably crying

After losing his beloved pet, he was **inconsolably** depressed for weeks.

monster

 an imaginary creature that is large and has various human and animal parts; someone or something large and powerful

synonym: giant, freak, behemoth

(1) horde of **monsters**, (2) **monster** film

This car has a monster engine.

preach

- v. to deliver a religious or moral message to an audience synonym: expound, advocate, sermonize
- preach the gospel, (2) preach to the masses
   The pastor preached about the importance of forgiveness.

sin

 n. the offense against a religious or moral law or against God

synonym: misdeed, guilt, wrong

(1) forgive a sin, (2) sin of omission

Some overzealous environmentalists claim celebrities are committing carbon dioxide **sins**.

outcome

n. the result or effect of an action, event, etc.

synonym: result, consequence, effect

(1) improved student **outcomes**, (2) a desirable **outcome** They awaited news of the **outcome** of the election.

sibling

 a brother or sister; member of a family born to the same parents

*synonym*: brother, sister, relative

(1) have a **sibling** quarrel, (2) play with my **siblings** Children often copy their parents or elder **siblings**.

proof

 a fact or piece of information that shows something is true or exists

synonym:

testimony, evidence, assurance

(1) documentary **proof**, (2) a geometric **proof Proof** is better than argument.

# harrowing

adj. causing distress or suffering; extremely distressingsynonym: traumatic, torturous, distressing

(1) **harrowing** battle, (2) **harrowing** journey
Her **harrowing** experience in the war had left her with deep emotional scars.

# struggle

 to make a great effort to do something when it is difficult, or there are a lot of problems; to use force or violence to break away from restraint or constriction

synonym: toil, strive, compete

(1) **struggle** against discrimination, (2) **struggle** to get the job

He could not **struggle** against temptation.

#### communal

adj. belonging to or used by a group rather than individuals; for common use

synonym: collaborative, combined, collective

(1) **communal** swimming pool, (2) **communal** combination of funds

**Communal** elections were held in several European countries.

#### dare

v. to have the courage to do something

synonym: challenge, risk, attempt

(1) dare not go, (2) dare to take risks

I wouldn't **dare** to speak to him like that.

# disrespect

an expression of lack of regard or contempt for someone or something

synonym: impoliteness, rudeness, insult

(1) mean no **disrespect**, (2) **disrespect** for a customer His **disrespectful** behavior towards his elders earned him a stern warning from his parents.

#### dessert

- n. a sweet food served as the last course of a meal synonym: sweet, cake, confection
- dessert knife, (2) easy dessert recipe
   Let's go to an all-you-can-eat dessert restaurant.

# recognize

v. to acknowledge or realize something or someone; to identify, remember, or become aware of something that was previously known or encountered

synonym: acknowledge, identify, admit

(1) recognize talent, (2) recognize achievementIt's important to recognize your strengths and weaknesses.

employer

 a person or organization that pays workers to work for them

*synonym*: boss, owner, company

(1) illegal **employer**, (2) **employer** responsibility An **employer's** attitude toward its employees significantly impacts their productivity.

#### yell

- v. to shout in a sudden and loud way
- synonym: shout, scream, cry
- (1) **yell** for help, (2) **yell** as loud as we can When I asked my father for more money, he became furious and **yelled** at me.

# temper

 a person's state of mind, emotions, or attitude; a tendency to become angry or excited easily; the elasticity and hardness of a metal object

synonym: mood, disposition, nature

(1) a hasty temper, (2) bridle my temper

The **temper** of the steel needs to be just right to ensure the product's durability.

#### console

 to provide emotional support or encouragement to someone synonym: soothe, calm, pacify

(1) **console** her for the loss of her son, (2) **console** the spirits of the victims

She **consoled** her crying friend with words of encouragement.

# mourning
