# struggle

# adapt

### modern

# reimagine

# congressperson

# therapeutic

adj. relating to or involved in the treatment of illness or injury synonym: healing, remedial, curative

(1) **therapeutic** massage, (2) **therapeutic** administration Yoga is known to have **therapeutic** benefits for the mind and body.

### patient

 a person who is receiving medical treatment, care, or attention from a healthcare professional, such as a doctor, nurse, or therapist; a personal quality or characteristic

synonym: client, recipient, subject

patient in the hospital, (2) patient with weight loss
 The doctor carefully examined the patient's medical history.

#### intense

adj. (especially of a feeling) very strong; extremely sharp or severe

synonym: extreme, fierce, harsh

(1) **intense** heat, (2) develop **intense** itching That statement by the prime minister drew **intense** international criticism.

#### resurrect

- v. to bring back to life or bring into existence again synonym: revive, bring back, bring to life

# bureaucracy

 a system of government in which most of the important decisions are made by state officials rather than by elected representatives synonym: administration, government, system

### storytelling

unjust

### oversight

 the act of supervising or watching over something; a mistake caused by not paying enough attention to something


