## irrespective

- adv. without taking something into account; regardless of synonym: heedless, inattentive, regardless
- (1) **irrespective** of age, (2) **irrespective** of his will Our company hires **irrespective** of national origin.

#### buzzword

- a word or phrase that is fashionable or popular within a particular industry, field, or culture, often used to convey a sense of innovation or sophistication
- synonym: cant, catchphrase, trendy word
- (1) **buzzword** bingo, (2) business **buzzwords**

Synergy has become such a **buzzword** in the business world that it has lost its meaning.

## underpin

- v. to support or strengthen the foundations of something synonym: support, foundation, base
- (1) **underpin** a structure, (2) **underpin** democratization The research findings **underpin** the theory that human

activities cause global warming.

## humongous

adj. extremely large; gigantic; huge; excessively big synonym: gigantic, enormous, colossal

(1) **humongous** appetite, (2) **humongous** amount The new office building was **humongous** and could fit hundreds of employees comfortably.

#### converse

v. to talk informally

synonym: discourse, discuss, exchange

(1) **converse** with an acquaintance, (2) ask a **converse** question

She enjoyed the opportunity to **converse** with a person who spoke her language.

#### transcribe

- v. to copy or reproduce something in written or printed form; to translate spoken language into written textsynonym: copy, record, transliterate
- (1) **transcribe** notes, (2) **transcribe** documents

  She needs to **transcribe** the interview recording to write the article for the magazine.

## welsh

v. to fail to honor a debt or commitment; to renege on a promise or agreement

synonym: default, renege, fail to pay

(1) **welsh** on a promise, (2) **welsh** on the deal The sheepherder had to **welsh** some of the animals due to illness.

#### institutionalize

v. to establish or make something a part of an institution (= a place such as a university, hospital, etc.)

synonym: formalize, establish, regularize

(1) **institutionalize** a system, (2) **institutionalize** customary laws

The new policy aims to **institutionalize** the use of renewable energy sources.

## app

 n. (abbreviation for application) software designed to run on smartphones and other mobile devices or inside a web browser on a PC

synonym: application, software

(1) killer app, (2) cannot log in to the app

The discovery of a critical bug caused the company to delay the **app's** release.

## underserved

- adj. inadequately or insufficiently provided with help, products, or services
- (1) **underserved** market, (2) traditionally **underserved**This area is medically **underserved**.

## dignify

v. to make something worthy of respect or honor; to elevate or give importance to something that may otherwise be considered insignificant

*synonym*: elevate, ennoble, honor

(1) **dignify** the role, (2) **dignify** the occasion It's important to **dignify** other people's opinions and not dismiss them without consideration.

## electrify

v. to make a machine or system work by using electricity; to make someone extremely enthusiastic about or interested in something

synonym: wire, amaze, astonish

(1) **electrify** the audience, (2) **electrify** a manufacturing process

The product developed through years of research continues to **electrify** the market.

## storytelling

- n. the act or art of narrating or writing storiessynonym: narrating, relating, recounting
- (1) **storytelling** performance, (2) courtroom **storytelling** She was skilled in **storytelling** techniques, such as using different voices for other characters.

#### starve

v. to suffer or die from lack of food; to cause someone or something to suffer or die from lack of food; to deprive something of necessary nourishment or sustenance

synonym: famish, hunger

(1) **starve** for a victory, (2) **starve** to death If you don't eat soon, you're going to **starve**.

#### retell

- v. to tell someone about something again or differently synonym: reiterate, repeat, restate
- (1) **retell** a story, (2) **retell** an old tale He **retells** the truth to plead not guilty.

#### recount

- v. to describe what happened or to narrate a story synonym: narrate, tell, report
- (1) **recount** the adventure, (2) **recount** a conversation with him

They **recount** events that have already occurred.

## confuse

v. to mistake one thing for another; to make somebody hard to understand

synonym: confound, obscure, disorient

(1) **confuse** the listener, (2) **confuse** fantasy with reality Her remarks **confused** the debate.

#### distort

v. to change something's shape, appearance, or sound so that it appears weird or unclear

synonym: fudge, deform, contort

(1) distort the facts, (2) distort the economy

Economists contend that taxes **distort** consumer behavior in general.

## pronounce

 to say or speak (a word or words) correctly or in a particular way

synonym: articulate, enunciate, voice

(1) **pronounce** a judgment, (2) **pronounce** a name

She struggled to **pronounce** the word in a foreign language.

#### Sanskrit

- an ancient language of India and an important sacred language in Hinduism, Buddhism, and Jainism; used as a scholarly and literary language in South Asia for thousands of years
- (1) **Sanskrit** language, (2) **Sanskrit** literature Some Indian classical dances and music are based on **Sanskrit** scriptures and texts.

## medicinal

- adj. of or relating to the treatment or cure of diseasesynonym: curative, therapeutic, healing
- (1) **medicinal** chemistry, (2) traditional **medicinal**The **medicinal** properties of this herb have been known to help with various ailments.

## persevere

- v. to persist in the course of action, despite opposition or difficulty; to continue with determination despite setbacks, obstacles, or discouragement
- synonym: persist, endure, continue
- (1) **persevere** through hardships, (2) **persevere** in my goals Even when faced with challenges, it's important to **persevere** and never give up.

## aborigine

- a person or group of people who are the original or indigenous inhabitants of a region or country, particularly in Australia or other parts of the world
- synonym: native, indigenous, autochthonous
- (1) **aborigine** settlement, (2) **aborigine** art

  The government has been working to improve the living conditions of **aborigine** communities.

## willpower

- n. the control exerted to do something or restrain impulses synonym: determination, resolve, self-discipline
- (1) demonstrate **willpower**, (2) lack of **willpower** With strong **willpower** and determination, he could quit smoking for good.
