synonym: decoke, decarburise, decarburize

We have to seek methods to **decarbonize** its fossil fuel economy.

aspiration

 a strong desire to achieve something; the action or process of drawing breath

synonym: ambition, inhalation, intake

hopeless

adj. having no hope; despairing; having no chance of success

synonym: despairing, helpless, futile

depletion

the reduction of something, especially a natural resource, to a critically low level

synonym: exhaustion, deficiency, reduction

(1) **depletion** of bodily fluids, (2) **depletion** of ozone The **depletion** of natural resources is a major concern for environmentalists.

humming

adj. producing a continuous, low, vibrating sound like that of the bee

synonym: buzzing, droning, vibrating

(1) **humming** sound, (2) **humming** bird

The **humming** of the bees filled the air as she walked

through the garden.

pollute

v. to make an area or substance, such as land, air, water, etc., dirty or harmful to living things by adding waste matter or harmful chemicals

synonym: contaminate, corrupt, degrade

(1) pollute the air, (2) pollute the thread

We should do our best not to **pollute** the environment.

overheat

v. to become too hot, or to cause something to become too hot

synonym: become too hot, heat up too much

(1) **overheat** while charging, (2) starts to **overheat** The car engine **overheated** and had to be repaired.

arcane

adj. mysterious or known only by a select few synonym: mysterious, obscure, hidden

(1) arcane knowledge, (2) arcane subject

The **arcane** rituals of the secret society were known only to a select few.

rudder

n. a flat, vertical blade at the rear of a vessel that can be turned horizontally to steer the vessel by changing its direction of movement; a device used in aircraft to control its yaw (side-to-side movement)

synonym: helm, tiller, steering gear

(1) rudder control, (2) rudder movement

The small boat's **rudder** was damaged in the storm, making it difficult to steer.

epiphany

a moment of sudden and great realization or revelation;
 a Christian festival, held on 6 January, celebrating the visit of the three wise men to the infant Jesus

synonym: revelation, enlightenment, insight

(1) **epiphany** about life, (2) Feast of **Epiphany**She had an **epiphany** while meditating and realized the answer to her problem.

awaken

- v. to stop sleeping or to cause someone to stop sleeping synonym: rouse, arouse, revive

elevate

v. to raise something from a lower to a higher position; to give a promotion to or assign to a higher position

synonym: lift, heighten, promote
