adj. belonging to or used by a group rather than individuals;for common use

synonym: collaborative, combined, collective

(1) **communal** swimming pool, (2) **communal** combination of funds

**Communal** elections were held in several European countries.

#### curator

 a person whose job is to manage the objects or artworks in a museum, art gallery, etc.

synonym: conservator, custodian, administrator

(1) curator of a library, (2) interim curator

The museum **curator** conserved the ancient manuscripts.

### specifically

adv. only associated with or meant for one thing

synonym: especially, particularly, notably

(1) designed **specifically** for men, (2) for **specifically** 

American customers

This ad campaign is aimed **specifically** at young women.

#### burnout

the state of being exceedingly exhausted or unwell,
 either physically or mentally, as a result of overworking

synonym: breakdown, exhaustion, fatigue

(1) burnout syndrome, (2) mental burnout

He suffered from job **burnout** because of hard work.

### identical

adj. being the exact same one

synonym: duplicate, exact, analogous

(1) pair of **identical** twins, (2) an **identical** equation Infant formulas are nutritionally almost **identical** to a mother's breast milk.

### twin

- n. either of two children born at the same time from the same mother
- (1) a **twin-lens** camera, (2) a **twin** room Its **twin** brothers are difficult to tell apart except for their parents.

#### overwhelm

- v. to defeat someone or something by using a great deal of force; to have a strong emotional effect on somebodysynonym: conquer, crush, dominate
- (1) he was **overwhelmed** with gratitude, (2) **overwhelm** opponents by numbers

Too much variety may **overwhelm** and confuse viewers.

#### exhausted

adj. extremely tired

synonym: drowsy, depleted, fatigued

(1) the **exhausted** food sources, (2) **exhausted** parents The **exhausted** runner fell to the ground and gasped.

#### nevertheless

adv. in spite of that; yet

synonym: nonetheless, yet, still

(1) keep working **nevertheless**, (2) **nevertheless**, she persevered

She was tired and hungry, but **nevertheless**, she persevered.

#### dive

v. to jump into the water with your head and arms going in first, or to move down to a deeper level underwatersynonym: dip, leap, plunge

(1) **dive** into anime communities, (2) **dive** off a cliff The sperm whale can **dive** to 1,000 meters.

#### unlock

 to open something, such as a door, window, etc., usually using a key

synonym: open, solve, unravel

(1) **unlock** a door with a key, (2) **unlock** value

The customs officer required the traveler to **unlock** his suitcase.

### cycle

an interval during which a recurring sequence of events occurs; a bicycle or motorcycle

synonym: revolution, rotation, bike

(1) the **cycle** of the seasons, (2) go to the workplace by **cycle** 

The food chain causes a material cycle.

### inspiration

 something that motivates or encourages someone to create or achieve something, or a feeling of excitement or creativity

synonym: motivation, drive, encouragement

(1) source of **inspiration**, (2) get **inspiration** from nature He found **inspiration** in the works of his favorite authors.

### conduct

- v. to organize and carry out a particular activitysynonym: behave, lead, carry on
- (1) **conduct** a background check, (2) **conduct** research Police will **conduct** random breath testing for drunk driving.

### abdominal

adj. of or relating to the part of the body that contains the stomach, intestines, and other organs

synonym: belly, ventral

(1) an abdominal operation, (2) abdominal muscles

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He felt a sharp pain in his abdominal area.

### diagnose

v. to determine or distinguish the nature of a problem or an illness through a careful analysis

synonym: identify, analyze, interpret

(1) **diagnose** the problem, (2) **diagnose** with CT scans This device is used to **diagnose** brain cancer and other tumors.

#### induce

v. to persuade someone to do something; to cause to act in a specific manner

synonym: cause, encourage, persuade

(1) **induce** a crisis, (2) **induce** him to see a doctor The lack of sleep **induces** both physical and psychological diseases.

#### relax

v. to become or cause someone to become less active or tense and calmer

synonym: soften, comfort, soothe

(1) **relax** a series of muscles, (2) **relax** at home The rules were **relaxed** after the new executive arrived.

### physiological

adj. relating to the normal functioning of living organisms and their organs and systems; concerning the physical or biochemical processes and activities that occur within the body

synonym: biological, organic, bodily

(1) **physiological** response, (2) **physiological** activity The doctor explained the various **physiological** changes that occur during pregnancy.

### symptom

 any sensation or change in body or mind that is experienced by a patient and is associated with a particular disease

synonym: sign, manifestation, syndrome

(1) **symptoms** of low testosterone, (2) neurotic **symptoms** The patient displays a **symptom** of a side effect.

#### conductor

n. someone who leads the performance of musicians or a piece of music; (in physics) an object, substance, or material that readily allows the flow of electricity, heat, etc.

*synonym*: director, manager

(1) **conductor** directing a symphony, (2) oxide **conductor** Diamonds are employed as thermal **conductors** as well.

### emotion

- a strong feeling such as love, anger, etc. deriving from one's situation, mood, or relationships with others
- synonym: feeling, sentiment, passion
- (1) control my **emotion**, (2) afraid to show **emotion**Some **emotions** are common across cultures and backgrounds.

### onstage

adv. onto or on a stage in a theater; in front of an audience

(1) appeared **onstage**, (2) walk **onstage** 

He performed his magic trick **onstage**, leaving the audience in awe.

#### stack

 a pile of something arranged or laid one on top of another; a large tall chimney through which combustion gases and smoke can be evacuated

synonym: accumulation, heap, pile

(1) high **stack**, (2) a large **stack** of paper

The earthquake caused a **stack** of lumber to crumble noisily.

#### peer

- n. a person who has the same age, status, or abilitysynonym: fellow, associate, counterpart
- (1) peer group, (2) peer review

Among young people, peer pressure can be pretty influential.

### deny

v. to state that one refuses to admit the existence or truth of something

synonym: refute, reject, repudiate

(1) adamantly deny killing, (2) deny the allegationsHe is still denying stealing the money from the cash register.

#### manifest

v. to show something such as feeling, attitude, quality, etc. clearly through signs or actions

synonym: exhibit, make plain, demonstrate

manifest as the word, (2) manifest displeasure
 The Prime Minister manifested his regret for his neighbors

#### definition

 a concise explanation of the meaning of a word, phrase, or symbol

synonym: description, connotation, meaning

(1) a precise **definition**, (2) the **definition** of a word Parallel lines are, by **definition**, lines on the same plane that never cross.

### component

 one of several parts that combines with others to form something bigger

synonym: element, part, factor

(1) key **component**, (2) spare **components** for cars

The researchers try to discover a common **component** in all types of successful organizations.

### origin

- n. the first existence or beginning of somethingsynonym: root, source, ancestor
- (1) **origin** of information, (2) racial **origin**There are various hypotheses concerning the **origin** of life.

#### inclusive

adj. including much or everything, and especially including stated limits; not excluding any of the people, things, ideas, etc. involved in something

synonym: cover-all, all-embracing, comprehensive

(1) a fully **inclusive** price, (2) **inclusive** education

The university has established a capacity for each nationality as part of its **inclusive** policy.

### expand

v. to increase or to make something greater in size, number, or importance

synonym: extend, grow, boost

(1) expand a lineup, (2) expand agricultural output

They hope to **expand** their business worldwide.

#### involve

v. to include or affect someone or something as a necessary part of something else

synonym: implicate, include, engage

(1) **involve** a lot of paperwork, (2) **involve** a high degree of risk

The investigation **involves** several government agencies and is expected to take several months.

### personalize

v. to make something or an experience specific to an individual or group, often through adding personal details or tailoring it to their preferences or needs; to add personal details or information to something

synonym: customize, individualize, tailor

(1) **personalize** social media profile, (2) **personalize** my workspace

I like to **personalize** my phone case with a picture of my dog.

### separate

- v. to force, take, or pull apart; mark as different synonym: disunite, isolate, ramify
- (1) **separate** video into chapter, (2) **separate** cream from milk

We need to **separate** the aspect of his personality from the part of his competence when making an investment decision.

#### emotional

adj. relating to people's feelingssynonym: affecting, impactful, impressive

(1) emotional health, (2) emotional distress

Human **emotional** responses vary widely depending on the society to which they belong.

invest

v. to put money, effort, time, etc. into something to make a profit or achieve a result

synonym: fund, sponsor, support

(1) **invest** in stocks, (2) **invest** capital

The government should view children as national assets and actively **invest** in them.

### accomplishment

n. the successful completion of a task or goal; an ability that has been acquired by training

synonym: success, achievement, complete

(1) proud of his **accomplishments**, (2) the **accomplishment** of a social goal

Graduating from college was a major **accomplishment** for her.

### exhaustion

 the state of being extremely tired and lacking energy or strength

synonym: fatigue, weariness, tiredness

(1) **exhaustion** of energy, (2) emotional **exhaustion** The long work hours were taking a toll on her mental **exhaustion**.

#### broad

adj. very wide; general

synonym: wide, expansive, comprehensive

(1) attract **broad** attention, (2) a **broad** mind

He accumulated wealth across a broad spectrum of assets.

### specific

adj. clearly defined or particular to a certain thing or situation; distinct, explicit, and precise

synonym: particular, definite, distinct

(1) **specific** instructions, (2) industry- **specific** regulations The scientist conducted a study that provided **specific** details about the species' behavior.

### ongoing

*adj.* continuing to exist or develop, or currently happening *synonym*: continuous, current, proceeding

(1) still ongoing, (2) ongoing support

The new prime minister has vowed to take measures against the **ongoing** economic crisis.

#### cease

v. to stop an action or event

synonym: stop, end, terminate

(1) cease to exist, (2) cease drinking

The company decided to **cease** production of the product.

#### formula

 a group of symbols, letters, or numbers that represent a rule, law, or mathematical statement

synonym: expression, recipe, procedure

(1) structural formula, (2) a binomial formula

The teacher told the students to memorize the math **formula**.

#### context

 the circumstances, facts, or conditions that surround a particular event, situation, or statement and that give it meaning

synonym: background, setting, environment

(1) historical context, (2) legal context

It's important to understand the **context** of a situation before making a decision.

### stressor

- n. something that causes stress or emotional tensionsynonym: pressure, strain, burden
- (1) **stressor** event, (2) **stressor** management

The deadline for the project was a major **stressor** for the team.

### perceive

 to become aware or conscious of something through the senses

synonym: sense, discern, feel

(1) perceive a threat, (2) perceive light

Australia is widely **perceived** as having low levels of corruption.

#### threat

 a strong indication or likelihood of harm, danger, or adverse consequences; an expression of intent to inflict harm or injury on someone or something, often made as a means of coercion or intimidation

synonym: menace, danger, hazard

(1) economic threat, (2) environmental threat

The **threat** of severe weather prompted the city to issue an evacuation warning.

### largely

adv. virtually entirely; to a large degree synonym: mainly, chiefly, broadly

(1) **largely** accepted, (2) **largely** mitigate the issue Nevada is **largely** a desert state.

### evolutionary

adj. relating to or denoting how living things develop or change from earlier forms

synonym: developmental, mutative, transformative

(1) ecology and **evolutionary** biology, (2) the **evolutionary** process

**Evolutionary** algorithms can find ways to optimize that humans do not anticipate.

flee

v. to leave by running away, especially out of fear or danger

synonym: exit, escape, run away

(1) flee their homes, (2) flee abroad

It is a basic instinct to **flee** from a dangerous situation.

intent

 a strong determination or attention to do or achieve something; (adjective) having a strong determination to do or achieve something

synonym: purpose, aim, goal

(1) the **intent** of a question, (2) **intent** gaze

The designer's **intent** was to create a minimalist aesthetic for the interior of the building.

chase

v. to pursue something or someone to catch or capture them; to go after something vigorously or with determination; (noun) a pursuit or a hunt; a narrow groove or channel cut into a surface, often used for decorative purposes

synonym: pursue, hunt, track

### (1) chase a dream, (2) wild goose chase

The police officer **chased** the suspect through the crowded streets until they finally caught him.

#### savannah

a mixed forest and grassland ecosystem where the trees are far enough apart that the canopy doesn't close
 synonym: grassland, plain

(1) savannah region, (2) tropical savannah

The birds live in tropical forests, **savannahs**, and arid semi-desert environments.

#### adrenaline

 a substance secreted by the adrenal medulla in response to stress, which makes the heart beat faster and prepares the body to react to danger

synonym: epinephrine

(1) adrenaline receptor, (2) adrenaline addiction

The band has released a lot of **adrenaline-pumping** rock music.

### cortisol

 a hormone produced by the adrenal gland that is involved in regulating the body's metabolism, immune system, and blood pressure

synonym: stress hormone, hydrocortisone

(1) cortisol stress, (2) excessive cortisol

**Cortisol** levels in the body are often elevated during times of stress.

### digestion

n. the process of breaking down food in the body into smaller, more usable components, typically involving enzymes and other bodily processes; the process of assimilating, understanding, or absorbing information or ideas

synonym: absorption, assimilation, metabolism

(1) poor digestion, (2) impaired digestion

Overeating can lead to discomfort and slower digestion.

#### immune

adj. protected against a particular disease or toxin due to the presence of specific antibodies or sensitized white blood cells

synonym: resistant, unsusceptible, unaffected

(1) **immune** from criminal prosecution, (2) the cell of the **immune** system

The vaccination does not necessarily make you completely **immune**.

#### hormone

- a chemical substance made by organs that encourages or influences the development, growth, sex, etc., of an animal and is carried around the body in the blood
- (1) hormone secretion, (2) female hormoneThe doctor diagnosed me with a hormone disorder.

### cognition

n. the psychological process of perception and learning and reasoning; the mental action or process by which knowledge and understanding are developed in the mind

synonym: awareness, understanding, comprehension

(1) social cognition, (2) cognition disorderThe professor focused on the research of infant cognition.

stake

 a share or financial investment in something such as a business; a wooden or metal post set up to mark something

synonym: share, interest, post

(1) execution by burning at a **stake**, (2) buy the company's **stake** 

The **stake** of the company is too high nowadays.

alas

 adv. (also exclamation) an expression of grief, condolence, or regret that is used to acknowledge a situation or outcome that is unfortunate or disappointing

synonym: alack, regrettably, unluckily

(1) **alas**, we did not win the game, (2) **alas**, I cannot attend the party

**Alas,** I realized I had left my keys at home and couldn't enter the building.

#### commute

v. to regularly travel a particular journey, especially between one's home and place of work; (noun) a regular journey of some distance to and from your place of work

synonym: travel, journey, trip

(1) commute to work, (2) daily commute

He had to **commute** two hours each way to get to work.

### classic

adj. judged or deserving to be regarded as one of the best or most important of its kind over a period of time; of a well-known type

synonym: definitive, traditional, typical

(1) a **classic** experiment, (2) Chinese **classic** literature He displayed the **classic** symptoms of depression.

### suddenly

adv. quickly and unexpectedly

synonym: abruptly, unexpectedly, unawares

(1) **suddenly** attacked by an enemy, (2) die **suddenly** Who answers **suddenly** knows little.

### grateful

*adj.* feeling or showing an appreciation of kindness; thankful *synonym*: thankful, appreciative, indebted

(1) a **grateful** breeze, (2) put a **grateful** expression. She was **grateful** for the help he provided.

### chronic

adj. being long-lasting and recurrent or characterized by long suffering; habitual

synonym: established, regular, constant

(1) risk of **chronic** disease, (2) **chronic** alcohol consumption

**Chronic** hyperglycemia is a trigger for a variety of serious diseases.

#### concrete

adj. existing in a physical or material form rather than an abstract one; based on facts rather than ideas or

guesses; made of or covered with cement *synonym*: actual, factual, hardened

(1) a concrete noun, (2) concrete examples

The president asked for a more **concrete** plan.

### grumpy

 adj. easily annoyed or irritable; inclined to complain or show dissatisfaction, often in an ill-tempered way

synonym: crabby, grouchy, irritable

(1) grumpy cat, (2) grumpy mood

The **grumpy** older man snapped at the children for playing too loudly.

### cranky

 adj. easily irritated or annoyed; bad-tempered; in a state of discomfort or pain, often resulting in irritability or moodiness

*synonym*: crabby, irritable, grumpy

(1) cranky mood, (2) cranky toddler

I feel **cranky** today; please forgive me if I seem irritable.

### jerk

v. to make a sudden, sharp movement, or cause something to do this

synonym: wrench, jolt, twitch

(1) **jerk** her head back, (2) **jerk** the rope

The driver suddenly **jerked** the steering wheel to the left to avoid hitting the deer.

#### jack

 a mechanical device used for lifting or supporting heavy objects

synonym: lever, crank, wrench

(1) a jack of all trades, (2) a line-in jack

He used a **jack** to lift the car to change the tire.

### driveway

 a private road leading from a street or road to a house or garage, typically providing access for vehicles

synonym: entrance, access, approach

(1) long driveway, (2) snow-covered driveway

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I accidentally backed into my wife's car while backing out of the **driveway** this morning.

#### tense

adj. unable to relax because of being nervous or worried; stretched tight or rigid

synonym: tight, stretched, strained

(1) **tense** atmosphere, (2) have a **tense** face

This story makes me **tense**.

#### breath

the air that is taken into and expelled from your lungs;
 the process of taking into and expelling air from your lungs

*synonym*: air, puff, whiff

(1) hold your **breath**, (2) **breath** of wind

He bated his **breath** when talking about this affair.

### communicate

 to share or exchange information with others by speaking, writing, moving your body, or using other signals

synonym: convey, share, transmit

- (1) **communicate** his anxieties to the psychiatrist,
- (2) communicate well with my advisor

Dolphins use sound to communicate with each other.

### process

n. a series of actions or operations performed to achieve a particular outcome or goal; a systematic procedure or approach used to accomplish a specific task or objective; a method of treating milk to make it suitable for consumption or use in other dairy products

synonym: procedure, method, system

(1) **process** improvement, (2) decision-making **process** The **process** for applying for a visa can be lengthy and complicated.

#### recover

- v. to return to a former condition, health, mind, or strength synonym: come back, convalesce, heal
- (1) recover a loss, (2) recover approval ratings

She is still **recovering** from a shot to her shoulder.

### medical

adj. relating to the treatment of illness or injuries; relating to the practice of medicine

synonym: health, disease, treatment

(1) a **medical** opinion, (2) temporary **medical** treatment The **medical** team worked quickly to save the patient's life.

### overlap

- v. to partially cover something by going beyond its edge synonym: overlay, cover, bespread
- (1) **overlap** one another, (2) **overlap** in many areas There was no **overlap** between their proposals.

### depression

 a mental condition in which a person feels very unhappy and without hope for the future; a severe recession in an economy or market

synonym: recession, slump, despair

(1) the Great **Depression**, (2) the root problem of her **depression** 

**Depression** symptoms might include a decrease in appetite and weight loss.

### anxiety

 a feeling of worry, nervousness, or unease about something that is happening or might happen in the future

synonym: concern, dread, agita

(1) diagnosis of **anxiety** disorder, (2) **anxiety** for knowledge She waited for her daughter with **anxiety**.

grief

- n. a very great sadness, especially when somebody diessynonym: anguish, desperation, dismay
- (1) have **grief** and sorrow, (2) a lot of **grief** Each person has a unique **grief** experience.

### rage

n. a strong feeling of anger or violence

synonym: fury, anger, outrage

(1) uncontrollable **rage**, (2) fall into a **rage**She was filled with a burning **rage** at the injustice she had witnessed.

### repress

 to restrain or control by force; to suppress feelings or memories

*synonym*: suppress, control, curb

(1) cannot **repress** laughter, (2) **repress** gene expression He **repressed** the memories of his traumatic childhood.

### layperson

 a person who is not trained or skilled in a specific profession or field; a non-expert or amateur

synonym: novice, amateur, non-expert

(1) **layperson** perspective, (2) in **layperson's** terms

The instructions should be clear enough for the **layperson** to understand.

### struggle

v. to make a great effort to do something when it is difficult, or there are a lot of problems; to use force or violence to break away from restraint or constriction

synonym: toil, strive, compete

(1) **struggle** against discrimination, (2) **struggle** to get the job

He could not **struggle** against temptation.

### fantasy

a fiction with a large amount of imagination in it; a
pleasant situation that you imagine but that is unlikely to
happen

synonym: fiction, illusion, fabrication

fantasy novel, (2) confuse fantasy with reality
 Composition by artificial intelligence is no longer a fantasy.

relate

 ν. to establish a connection or association between two or more things; to narrate or tell about an event, experience, or relationship; to empathize or feel sympathy with someone or something

synonym: connect, link, associate

(1) **relate** a story, (2) **relate** a message

He tried to **relate** his experience to the group, but they couldn't understand.

### overwhelming

adj. very great or intense; so powerful that you cannot fight or react against it

synonym: overpowering, astounding, amazing

(1) **overwhelming** majority, (2) an **overwhelming** victory He has shown signs of uneasiness and **overwhelming** worry.

### trap

 a piece of equipment or hole for catching animals or people; (verb) to catch animals or people and prevent them from escaping

synonym: catch, snare, pinfall

(1) set a **trap**, (2) **trap** an animal The enemy fell right into the **trap**.

### therapy

 the act of caring for someone through medication, remedial training, etc.

synonym: antidote, medicine, treatment

therapy for a patient, (2) field of gene therapy
 underwent aversion therapy for my addiction to alcohol.

#### warn

v. to make someone aware of potential danger or difficulty, particularly one that may occur in the future

synonym: alert, caution, admonish

(1) **warn** a reckless driver, (2) **warned** me of the plan I attempted to **warn** him, but he ignored me.

### emergency

 a sudden unforeseen crisis usually involving danger that requires immediate action

synonym: crisis, trouble, difficulty

(1) **emergency** action, (2) acute **emergency**. The president declared a state of **emergency**.

### recognize

v. to acknowledge or realize something or someone; to identify, remember, or become aware of something that was previously known or encountered

synonym: acknowledge, identify, admit

(1) **recognize** talent, (2) **recognize** achievement It's important to **recognize** your strengths and weaknesses.

### compassion

 a strong feeling of sympathy and sadness for another's suffering or bad luck

synonym: pity, empathy, understanding

(1) feel **compassion** for the poor, (2) have **compassion** toward the accident

His infinite love and **compassion** for everyone never weary.

### unreasonable

adj. not fair, sensible, or likely to be true synonym: unjustified, unfair, excessive

(1) **unreasonable** demand, (2) an **unreasonable** amount of money

It would be **unreasonable** for me to expect you to work overtime without any extra compensation.

### barrier

 a fence or other obstruction that makes it hard to move or get in; any condition that makes it difficult to make progress or to achieve an objective

synonym: border, barricade, fence

(1) cost barrier, (2) information barrier

The police placed a **barrier** across the street to halt traffic.

### uncomfortable

adj. providing or feeling physical discomfort or slight pain synonym: comfortless, discomforting, painful

(1) an **uncomfortable** silence, (2) with an **uncomfortable** face

His abusive words made me uncomfortable.

#### tunnel

 an underground or underwater passage, typically for trains or cars

synonym: passageway, underground passage

(1) **tunnel** construction work, (2) **tunnel** disease
The workers had to dig through solid rock to create the vehicular **tunnel** allowing the cars to pass through the mountain.

#### stick

v. to put something, usually a sharp object, into something; to restrict yourself to doing or using one certain thing and not change; (noun) a thin piece of wood or other material

synonym: pierce, adhere, stay

(1) **stick** a key in a lock, (2) fire **stick** 

You **stick** a bill in the change machine, and the coins pop out.

### opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

(1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

### internal

adj. of or relating to the inside of something

synonym: interior, inner, domestic

(1) **internal** organs, (2) the **internal** economy

The prime minister canceled visits to other countries to resolve **internal** disputes.

### explicit

adj. stated clearly and in detail, leaving no room for confusion or doubt

synonym: clear, unambiguous, unequivocal

(1) **explicit** content, (2) **explicit** instructions

The movie had an **explicit** sex scene that some viewers might find offensive.

#### cave

n. a large hole in the side of a hill, cliff, mountain, or under the ground

synonym: cavern, grotto, burrow

(1) domiciliary **caves**, (2) the mouth of the **cave** Bats reside in sheltered **caves**.

bat

n. a nocturnal animal with wings that flies and feeds at night, similar to a mouse; a piece of wood with a handle used for hitting the ball in sports including baseball, cricket, and table tennis

synonym: cane, rod, stick

(1) bat cave, (2) bat an eye
