sebaceous

adj. relating to or secreting a fatty or oily substance,
 particularly in the skin or hair follicles, often associated

with the formation of acne or other skin conditions *synonym*: oily, greasy, fatty

(1) **sebaceous** glands, (2) **sebaceous** cyst

Acne is often caused by **sebaceous** oils clogging the pores on the skin.

lubricate

 to apply a substance, such as oil or grease, to reduce friction or wear on a surface

synonym: grease, oil, make slippery

(1) **lubricate** the economy, (2) **lubricate** the hinges with oil The mechanic **lubricated** the gears to prevent them from grinding.

follicle

- a small sac or cavity in the body, especially in the skin or scalp, that contains and nourishes a hair or feather; a small gland or sac that produces and releases a bodily secretion
- (1) follicle cell, (2) damaged follicle

The pigments in your hair **follicles** determine the color of your hair.

fungus

 a type of organism that includes yeasts, molds, and mushrooms, which are heterotrophic, meaning they do not produce their food and must consume organic matter to survive

synonym: mold, mildew, yeast

(1) fungus infection, (2) symbiotic fungus

Certain types of **fungus** can be toxic to humans, causing severe illness if ingested.

kink

 a tight curl, twist or bend in an object, particularly in a piece of wire, hose, or tubing; a peculiar or eccentric liking or habit

synonym: bend, twist, curl

(1) **kink** in the neck, (2) sexual **kink**

The kink in the hose was preventing water from flowing

correctly.

irregularly

 adv. in a manner that deviates from the normal or expected pattern, often marked by inconsistency or unpredictability

synonym: sporadically, unexpectedly, intermittently

(1) irregularly shaped, (2) breathe irregularly

He **irregularly** attends school, which reflects his poor grades.

leftover

adj. not consumed or used at the end of somethingsynonym: extra, residual, unused

(1) **leftover** from a party, (2) **leftover** goods

The chef will make soup with the **leftover** ham bone.

soak

v. to allow liquid to be absorbed, typically by immersing in it; to leave as a guarantee in return for money

synonym: saturate, steep, douse

(1) **soak** in a hot spring, (2) **soak** away stress

I **soaked** the shirt in the sink before washing it.

pry

v. to force open or to try to get information from someone by asking too many questions

synonym: probe, investigate, inquire

(1) **pry** a secret out of a person, (2) **pry** into the affairs He used a crowbar to **pry** open the locked door.

itch

v. to have an uncomfortable feeling on the skin that makes you want to scratch it

synonym: scratch, tingle, irritate

(1) **itch** constantly, (2) **itch** to speak

I can't stop **itching** my arm because of the mosquito bite.

proliferate

 ν . to grow or increase rapidly in number; to reproduce or spread rapidly, especially in an uncontrolled manner

synonym: multiply, spread, propagate

(1) proliferate cells, (2) proliferate weeds

The number of COVID cases continued to **proliferate** in many countries worldwide.

epidermis

n. the outermost layer of skin, composed of flat, scale-like cells that provide a protective barrier against external substances and help regulate body temperature

synonym: skin, cuticle, derma

(1) epidermis layer, (2) epidermis cells

Excessive exposure to UV radiation harms the **epidermis** and increases the risk of skin cancer.

churn

v. to stir or agitate a liquid, substance, or mixture vigorously to produce foam or because of violent movement; to cause a large number of people to move or leave; to produce something, such as money, through continuous activity or turnover

synonym: stir, agitate, whirl

clump

colonize

synonym: settle, occupy, inhabit

colonize planets, (2) colonize for cultivation
 European powers colonized much of the Americas in the
 16th and 17th centuries.

predisposition

- n. a tendency or inclination to a particular behavior or condition, often due to genetic or environmental factorssynonym: tendency, inclination, disposition
- (1) **predisposition** to anxiety, (2) genetic **predisposition** Smoking can increase a person's **predisposition** to lung cancer.

permeable

- adj. capable of being penetrated, passed through, or absorbed; allowing liquids, gases, or other substances to pass through a surface or material, often with easesynonym: porous, absorbent, permeative
- (1) **permeable** membrane, (2) air- **permeable** fabric The soil needs to be **permeable** so water can easily drain through it.

oxylipin

- n. a type of molecule derived from the oxidation of fatty acids, with a variety of functions in inflammation, immune response, and other physiological processes synonym: eicosanoid, oxigenated fatty acid, lipid mediator
 (1) oxylipin metabolism, (2) oxylipin signaling
- Fish oil is rich in **oxylipins** that have anti-inflammatory effects.

inflame

v. to cause very strong feelings such as anger or excitement in a person or a group of people

synonym: agitate, arouse, enrage

(1) **inflame** skin, (2) **inflame** his passion

Her eyes **inflamed** with crying.

hypothesize

v. to form or present a theory or explanation without sufficient evidence; to speculate

synonym: speculate, theorize, conjecture

(1) **hypothesize** as to outcomes, (2) **hypothesize** what could have happened

Scientists **hypothesize** that the new fish species evolved to survive in deep-sea environments.

embarrass

contagious
