synonym: loyal, chauvinistic, jingoistic

#### decentralize

v. to move the power, control, or authority of an organization, government, or system from a single place to several smaller ones

synonym: deconcentrate, disperse, distribute

We need to **decentralize** our data to recover quickly from a disaster.

## bureaucracy

 a system of government in which most of the important decisions are made by state officials rather than by elected representatives

synonym: administration, government, system

(1) government **bureaucracy**, (2) arbitrary **bureaucracy**The bumbling **bureaucracy** made it difficult to get the permits we needed.

## playbook

 a set of strategies or tactics used in a particular situation, often in a business or political context; a guidebook or manual that outlines a specific plan of action

synonym: strategy, game plan, manual

(1) **playbook** strategy, (2) political **playbook** The coach's **playbook** helped the team win the championship.

## landslide

 a large, sudden movement of a mass of rock, earth, or other material down a slope

synonym: avalanche, mudslide, rockfall

(1) landslide victory, (2) prevent a landslide

The massive **landslide** buried the small village under a thick layer of rock and dirt.

## pandemic

 an outbreak of a disease that affects many people over a very wide area

synonym: outbreak

(1) flu pandemic, (2) global pandemic

They fear a **pandemic** of a new type of virus.

## speculate

v. to form a theory or conjecture or guess about a subject without solid evidence

synonym: assume, conjecture, infer

(1) **speculate** about the reason, (2) **speculate** on the outcome

He speculated that this investment would lead to success.

#### dedicate

v. to give all of your energy, time, etc., entirely to a specific person, activity, or cause; to set apart for a particular purpose or use

synonym: consecrate, devote, commit

(1) **dedicate** a few hours, (2) **dedicate** a chapter to the subject

He **dedicated** his life to helping others.

#### infuse

 to fill something with a particular quality, feeling, or influence; to imbue

synonym: instill, fill, permeate

(1) **infuse** with spirit, (2) **infuse** life with meaning She **infused** fresh herbs into the soup for added flavor.

#### confine

- v. to restrict the movement of someone or something synonym: restrict, limit, contain
- (1) **confine** themselves solely, (2) **confine** the scope of use The animal was **confined** in a small cage.

#### turnout

 the number of people who are present at an event or vote at an election

*synonym*: attendance, number, crowd

(1) the voter **turnout**, (2) an enormous **turnout** of people The gig attracted a large **turnout**.

## legalese

 the language or vocabulary used in legal documents, often characterized by long, complex sentences, technical jargon, and archaic terms

synonym: jargon, legal terminology

(1) use of legalese, (2) dry legalese

The legal document was filled with confusing **legalese** that required a lawyer to interpret.

#### resilient

adj. able to withstand or recover quickly from difficult conditions

*synonym*: robust, sturdy, tough

(1) a hard and **resilient** steel, (2) **resilient** population

She is a **resilient** person and has always bounced back from setbacks.

## inequity

n. a lack of fairness or justice; an unfair or unequal situation or practice

synonym: injustice, unfairness, bias

(1) inequity in education, (2) market inequity

n. a person, group, or force that opposes or fights against another; an enemy or opponent

synonym: opponent, enemy, foe
