humility

synonym: humbleness, modesty, unpretentiousness

coworker

slap

 a person who works with another in the same company or organization

synonym: colleague, peer, associate

- (1) **coworker** relationship, (2) argue with a **coworker** My ex- **coworker** and I had different working styles but managed to get along.
- to strike something or someone with an open palm or flat object, producing a sharp sound or sensation; to place something firmly, suddenly, or unexpectedly

synonym: smack, hit, whack

pretension

cobble

 a rounded, irregularly shaped stone used for paving streets or for building walls; (verb) to make or repair something in a rough and hurried way

synonym: pebble, boulder, stone

The town is known for its historic **cobble** streets, which were laid by hand in the 19th century.

straddle
