#### exhaustion

#### irritable

adj. easily or frequently agitated, annoyed, or angered; prone to becoming tense or angry in response to minor stimuli or events

*synonym*: cranky, grumpy, touchy

irritable bowel syndrome, (2) irritable mood
 Lack of sleep can make me irritable and easily annoyed.

# onslaught

n. a fierce or violent attack; a sudden and intense outburst of something, usually negative

synonym: attack, assault, charge

(1) **onslaught** of criticism, (2) urban **onslaught**The village was unprepared for the sudden **onslaught** of the enemy army.

# mourning

n. the act or expression of sorrow or grief for someone who has died; a period of time set aside for such grieving

synonym: grieving, sorrow, lamentation

# exemplify

## pendulum

n. a weight hung from a fixed point used to regulate the movement of a clock or other mechanism

synonym: oscillator, balance, clock

# hinge

a joint that holds the edge of a door, window, lid, etc.
 and allows it to open or close

#### cordon

 a line or circle of police, soldiers, or other guards preventing access to or from an area; a barrier or blockade

synonym: barrier, barricade, line

The police set up a **cordon** around the crime scene to keep bystanders out.

# happenstance

an occurrence that happens by chance; a fortuitous event, or a coincidence

*synonym*: coincidence, chance, accident

(1) happenstance event, (2) meet by happenstance It was a mere happenstance that they both ended up at the same restaurant.

#### vibrate

v. to move or cause anything to move fast and in small increments from side to side

*synonym*: oscillate, convulse, jerk

#### inhabit

v. to live in a specific location; to reside

synonym: settle, occupy, populate

#### delineate

- v. to describe or portray something in detail; to clearly and precisely define the boundaries or outline of something
   synonym: outline, sketch, depict

#### demarcate

v. (another term for demark) to set, mark, or draw the boundaries or limits of something

synonym: differentiate, delimit, mark off

#### antidote
