 a narrative or lyrical poem that tells a story, often with a simple, repetitive structure and a musical quality; a song in this style

synonym: folk song, jingle, ditty

(1) traditional **ballad**, (2) Irish **ballad**

The singer's **ballad** brought the audience to tears.

neurological

adj. of or relating to the science of neurology or the nervous system

synonym: nervous, neural, brain-related

(1) fever with **neurological** signs, (2) **neurological** symptoms

The patient was diagnosed with a **neurological** disorder affecting their motor skills.

lobe

 a rounded projection or division, especially of the brain, lung, or liver

synonym: part, section, division

(1) **lobe** of the liver, (2) frontal **lobe**

The lungs are divided into five lobes.

thud

 a dull, heavy sound made when a heavy object falls or strikes a surface, often with a low frequency and resonance

synonym: bang, collision, crash

(1) thud of footsteps, (2) a distant thud

The loud **thud** of the door closing echoed through the empty hallway.

occiput

n. the back part of the head or skull

synonym: back of the head, skull base

(1) occiput muscles, (2) occiput pain

The massage therapist focused on the client's occiput region

crunch

n. a loud, crackling noise made by something being crushed or broken; a difficult or critical situationsynonym: crushing, snapping, crisis

flake

 a small, thin piece or layer of something, often with a flat or irregular shape; a person who is unreliable or inconsistent

synonym: chip, bit, shred

(1) flakes of snow, (2) flake graphite

She found a paint **flake** on the wall and realized it was time to repaint the room.

empathy

 the ability to share another person's feelings or experiences by imagining that person's situation

synonym: compassion, sympathy, tenderness

(1) full of **empathy**, (2) **empathy** for patients

Empathy is also necessary to understand history.

oxytocin

- a hormone secreted by the pituitary which stimulates contractions of the uterus during labor (= the process of pushing out a baby) and the ejection of milk
- (1) **oxytocin-degrading** enzyme, (2) **oxytocin** receptor Women may increase **oxytocin** production through romantic love.

trustworthy

adj. reliable and dependable

synonym: reliable, dependable, honest(1) trustworthy ally, (2) trustworthy source

People tend to believe trustworthy friends with their secrets.

misconception

 a belief or an idea that is wrong because it has been based on faulty thinking, understanding, or hypothesis synonym: fallacy, incomprehension, misunderstanding

floss

 a thin thread or cord used to clean the spaces between the teeth

synonym: thread, yarn, string

neuroscience

- the scientific study of the function, structure, and disorder of the brain and the nervous system

Our university is famous for its professors, who are well-versed in behavioral **neuroscience**.

amygdala

- n. one of two parts of the almond-shaped neural structure that are linked to emotions, especially fear and pleasure, memory, and the sense of smell

epicenter

 the point on the earth's surface directly above the focus of an earthquake
