### pyramid

#### invention

### hieroglyph

a writing system using picture symbols, such as the one used in ancient Egypt

#### feat

 a notable or impressive achievement, especially one that requires great skill or bravery

### guidance

ceramics

slate

carving

#### underworld

### episode

#### astronaut

a person trained by a space agency to travel outside the n. Earth's atmosphere

#### rocket

a large tube-shaped object that moves very first by a stream of gases let out behind it, used for space travel or as a weapon

synonym: projectile, missile

### indigenous

adj. someone or something that is native to or occurring naturally in a particular place

#### racism

prejudice, discrimination, or antagonism directed against a person or people based on their membership in a particular ethnic group, typically one that is a minority or marginalized

#### exacerbate

### inequality

 the unfairness of a society in which some people have more opportunity, money, etc. than others; (mathematics) relation between two values when they are different

### appreciate

### diversity

 the quality or fact of many different types of things or people being included in something; a range of different things or people

### county

### battleground

### placement


