adj. having or showing no moral principles; not honest or fair synonym: unethical, immoral, dishonest

nefarious

 adj. extremely wicked or criminal; evil or immoral; often used to describe someone engaged in sinister or unlawful activities

synonym: wicked, evil, villainous

The undercover investigator exposed the **nefarious** plan before any harm could be done.

foe

an enemy or opponent; someone or something that is opposed to or in conflict with another

synonym: enemy, adversary, opponent
