patriarchy

 a social system in which men hold primary power and predominate in roles of political leadership, moral authority, and control of a property

synonym: male-dominated society, male domination

(1) patriarchy system, (2) ancient patriarchy

The feminist movement aims to challenge and dismantle **patriarchy** society and promote gender equality.

uphold

v. to support or defend something, such as a law, idea, decision, etc.

synonym: defend, maintain, sustain

(1) uphold the law, (2) uphold tradition

The judge may **uphold** the decision of the lower court.

insurmountable

adj. impossible to overcome or conquer; too difficult or daunting to overcome

synonym: invincible, hopeless, overwhelming

(1) **insurmountable** odds, (2) **insurmountable** disadvantage

The challenge seemed **insurmountable**, but they overcame it with hard work and determination.

glacier

 a slowly moving mass of ice formed from snow on mountains or near the North Pole or the South Pole

synonym: iceberg, ice floe

glacier retreat, (2) glaciers move tardily
 The glaciers of the ice age have shaped Fjord.

fearless

adj. having no fear; brave

synonym: brave, courageous, daring

(1) fearless attitude, (2) fearless bravery

The **fearless** firefighter rushed into the burning building to save a trapped child.

reciprocity

 a mutual exchange of help and advantages; privileges granted in return for similar privileges

synonym: mutuality, interchange, exchange

(1) reciprocity relationship, (2) reciprocity exchange

The policy of **reciprocity** between the two countries allowed for visa-free travel.
