proclaim

- v. to announce or state something publicly and forcefully synonym: announce, declare, trumpet

detain

 to keep someone in official custody; to prevent them from leaving

synonym: hold, keep, detainment

fearless

synonym: brave, courageous, daring

exile

the state of being forced to leave one's country or home,
 typically for political or punitive reasons

synonym: banishment, expulsion, deportation

(1) exile community, (2) political exile

The **exiled** king lived in poverty in a foreign country for many years.

frightening

adj. causing fear or alarm, or very surprising and alarming synonym: scary, terrifying, alarming

(1) cast **frightening** eyes, (2) **frightening** experience The news of the pandemic was a **frightening** reminder of the fragility of human health.

elevate

- v. to raise something from a lower to a higher position; to give a promotion to or assign to a higher positionsynonym: lift, heighten, promote
- (1) **elevate** educational standards, (2) **elevate** a close relationship

daring

adj. brave and taking risks

synonym: audacious, bold, venturesome
