outcompete

 to be more successful in competition than someone or something

synonym: outperform, outdo, surpass

(1) **outcompete** peers, (2) **outcompete** domestic producers To **outcompete** its rivals, the company invested heavily in research and development.

chimney

 a vertical structure that channels smoke or gas from a fire or furnace out of a building; a hollow column or tube that facilitates air or fluid flow throughout a system

synonym: flue, smokestack, stack

(1) smoke **chimney**, (2) **chimney** sweep

The **chimney** in the factory was constantly emitting dark smoke.

refinery

 a facility that is used to process, purify, and refine raw materials such as oil or metal into a more useful or valuable form

synonym: plant, factory, processing plant

The oil **refinery** was shut down due to safety concerns after a major accident.

purify

 to remove harmful substances from something and increase the concentration of it

synonym: refine, filter, clarify

(1) purify hydrogen gas, (2) purify the blood

The equipment is frequently used to **purify** and distribute drinking water.

compress

v. to press or squeeze together to make something take up less space

synonym: condense, constrict, squeeze

(1) **compress** the chest, (2) **compress** gas

She **compressed** the files into a single ZIP archive to save space on her computer.

inject

 to put a liquid such as a drug or other substance into a person's or an animal's body using a needle and syringe (= small tube)

synonym: shoot, infiltrate, insinuate

(1) **inject** under the skin, (2) **inject** a personal opinion into a debate

Let's try to **inject** a bit of enthusiasm into your performance.

hydrocarbon

- an organic compound consisting entirely of hydrogen and carbon
- (1) **hydrocarbon** production, (2) **hydrocarbon** molecules in crude oil

Burning **hydrocarbons** releases water vapor and carbon dioxide.

stopgap

 something intended for temporary use while you are looking for something more suitable

synonym: impromptu, make-do, expedient

He had no choice but to adopt a **stopgap** measure because of his limited budget.

recapture

synonym: restrict, limit, confine

philanthropy

the practice of voluntarily helping the poor, especially by giving money

synonym: altruism, benevolence, generosity

(1) **philanthropy** organization, (2) private **philanthropy** Tech billionaires often spend the majority of their time on **philanthropy**.

deforestation

- n. the act of cutting down or burning trees in a large areasynonym: clear-cutting, desertification

environmentalist
