opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

(1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

firsthand

adv. from the source; directly; (adjective) received directly from a source

synonym: direct

(1) hear customer's voices **firsthand**, (2) conduct **firsthand** research

The manager tried to hear customers' voices **firsthand**.

intimacy

 close familiarity or friendship; a close, familiar, and usually affectionate or loving personal relationship with another person

synonym: closeness, familiarity, nearness

(1) on terms of **intimacy**, (2) build **intimacy**

They were looking for **intimacy** in their relationship and wanted to be close to each other.

trapeze

 a horizontal bar or rope that is suspended from two points, used by acrobats and circus performers to perform aerial feats and acrobatics

synonym: swing bar, aerial hoop

(1) **trapeze** artist, (2) do the flying **trapeze**

The daring **trapeze** act left the audience gasping in amazement.

terrify

v. to frighten someone very much

synonym: unnerve, scare, horrify

(1) terrify people, (2) the threats terrify him

It would be best not to **terrify** your associates into doing complex tasks.

WOO

 to seek the affection or favor of someone; to court or pursue someone romantically or with flattery synonym: court, pursue, charm

(1) **woo** consumers, (2) **woo** voters with promises He tried to **woo** her with his charm and wit.

ambiguity

n. the quality of being open to more than one interpretation; the uncertainty of meaning

synonym: uncertainty, vagueness, obscurity

(1) free from **ambiguity**, (2) avoid **ambiguity** in writing The **ambiguity** in the instructions made it difficult for her to complete the task.

reframe

v. to reinterpret, rephrase, or redefine an issue, situation, or question in a different way

synonym: redefine, restructure, reposition

(1) **reframe** resource allocation, (2) **reframe** problem The therapist tried to **reframe** his negative thoughts.

lexicon

- all the words and phrases of a particular language or branch of knowledge, such as nautical or medicalsynonym: glossary, dictionary, vocabulary
- (1) Greek-English **lexicon**, (2) **lexicon** of business phrases This bilingual **lexicon** was essential for his language improvement.

inject

 to put a liquid such as a drug or other substance into a person's or an animal's body using a needle and syringe (= small tube)

synonym: shoot, infiltrate, insinuate

(1) **inject** under the skin, (2) **inject** a personal opinion into a debate

Let's try to **inject** a bit of enthusiasm into your performance.

broaden

synonym: expand, widen, enlarge
