scorpion

 a small creature similar to an insect with a segmented body, a pair of pincers, and a long, thin tail that ends in a venomous sting

synonym: arachnid, stinger

The **scorpion's** venom can be lethal to humans.

radula

- an anatomical structure utilized by mollusks that are frequently compared to a tongue

hypodermic

 adj. relating to the area below the skin; referring to a method of administering drugs or vaccines through a hypodermic needle or syringe

synonym: injectable, subcutaneous, intravenous

(1) **hypodermic** abscess, (2) **hypodermic** injection

The doctors administered the vaccine through a **hypodermic** needle.

villain

 a character in a story, movie, or play which often opposes the hero, typically characterized as immoral, evil, or cruel

synonym: scoundrel, rogue, antagonist

(1) evil villain, (2) authoritarian villain

The **villain** in the movie was a complex character with a tragic backstory.

superhero

- a fictional hero who possesses extraordinary powers and abilities and is dedicated to protecting the public
- (1) **superhero** movies, (2) **superhero** comics

Superman is a classic **superhero** known for his superhuman strength and flying ability.

biochemical

adj. relating to the chemical processes and substances that occur within living organisms

synonym: molecular, biological

(1) biochemical reaction, (2) complex biochemical **Biochemical** research is essential to understanding the complex chemical reactions in living organisms.

brute

a violent, wild, or feral animal; a person who is cruel, n. uncivilized, or lacking in intelligence or sensitivity; a physical force or power

synonym: beast, savage, animal

(1) brute beasts, (2) brute force

The **brute** behavior of the football players caused the game to be canceled.

arsenal

a collection of weapons or military equipment stored in preparation for war or conflict; a collection of resources or tools available for use in a particular field or endeavor

synonym: storage, stockpile, armory

(1) arsenal of knowledge, (2) political arsenal The police found a hidden **arsenal** of weapons in the suspect's house.

toxin

a poisonous substance produced by a living organism, such as a plant, animal, or microorganism; a chemical compound that can cause harm or illness to a living organism

synonym: poison, venom, contaminant

(1) toxin exposure, (2) toxin production Mold exposure can release dangerous **toxins** into the air.

conquer

- to bring under control by force or authority synonym: defeat, overpower, subdue
- (1) **conquer** fatal disease, (2) **conquer** the world You must **conquer** your anxiety about driving.
- stronghold
- a fortress or secure place that is difficult to capture, especially one used as a center of military operations *synonym*: fortress, bastion, citadel

clot

hemotoxin

 a poisonous substance that attacks the blood and circulatory system, often causing internal bleeding or organ failure; commonly found in snake and spider venom

(1) spider **hemotoxin**, (2) **hemotoxin-induced** tissue death The **hemotoxin** produced by some species of jellyfish can cause paralysis and respiratory failure.

neuron

- a cell that is specialized to carry information within the brain and between the brain and other parts of the body
 synonym: nerve cell

 Our body transfers information along each **neuron** using an electrical impulse.

neurotoxin

- a poisonous substance that damages or destroys nerve tissue and causes neurological damage or dysfunction; a toxin that specifically targets the nervous system
- snake neurotoxin, (2) lethal neurotoxin
 Certain types of fish contain neurotoxins that can harm humans if ingested.

poke

- v. to push or prod with a sharp object or the finger synonym: prod, jab, push
- (1) **poke** around the desk, (2) **poke** a fire

rupture

explode

synonym: detonate, blast, rupture

cytotoxin

 a poisonous substance that specifically targets and damages or kills cells, often associated with bacterial or viral infections

synonym: chemotoxin, poison, venom

(1) cytotoxin release, (2) bacterial cytotoxin

The snake's **cytotoxin** attacks the nervous system of its prey.

obsess

v. to fill the mind of someone continually so that one can't think of anything else

synonym: torment, beset, engross

inject

 to put a liquid such as a drug or other substance into a person's or an animal's body using a needle and syringe (= small tube)

synonym: shoot, infiltrate, insinuate

paralysis

 a condition in which you are unable to move or lose control of part or most of the body because of illness or injury

synonym: immobility, stiffness, palsy

(1) moral **paralysis**, (2) **paralysis** in the leg Massive demonstrations lead to total **paralysis** of transportation.

disrupt

v. to prevent or stop something, especially an event, activity, or process, from continuing in the usual way by causing a problem or disturbance

synonym: interrupt, disturb, break into

(1) **disrupt** a well-ordered condition, (2) **disrupt** sleep I'm so sorry to **disrupt** you when you're pretty busy.

channelopathy

n. a disorder caused by some dysfunction of ion channels, which are proteins in the cell membrane that form pores for the passage of ions into and out of cells, which can cause a variety of symptoms affecting different organs and systems in the body

synonym: ion channel disease

neuroblastoma

morphine

opioid

- n. substances that have an effect similar to opium, such as morphine, used in medicines to treat severe pain, but some people take them illegally for pleasure and become addicted
- (1) an **opioid** analgesic, (2) **opioid** receptor Treatment for **opioid** dependence may be a long-term process.

viper

n. venomous snake

synonym: snake, serpent, adder

The pit viper coiled up, ready to strike at its prey.

captopril

 a drug used to treat hypertension and heart failure by relaxing blood vessels and reducing the workload of the heart

synonym: ACE inhibitor, hypertension medication

(1) **captopril** tablets, (2) treat hypertension with **captopril** My doctor prescribed **captopril** to lower my blood pressure.

binge

 a period of excessive or uncontrolled consumption, often of food or alcohol; a spree or bout of reckless behavior or indulgence

marvelous
