## process

#### launch

## spreadsheet

## traditionally

adv. in accordance with tradition; typically or commonly done in a particular way

## margin

the space around the edge of a page or document;
 (finance) the net sales minus the cost of goods and services sold

## queer

adj. strange or odd, typically in an interesting or attractive way

## fast-forward

quotation

 a group of words taken from a text or speech and repeated by someone other than the original author or speaker

## eventually

adv. finally, particularly after a long time or a lot of struggle, complications, and so on

*synonym*: finally, someday, ultimately

incumbent

 a person who currently holds a particular position or job, especially in politics or public office; a duty or obligation that is required as part of a particular role or job

synonym: holder, occupant, officeholder

incumbent party, (2) incumbent duties
 The incumbent president is seeking re-election for another term in office.

## alderperson

- n. an elected member of a municipal legislative body, typically known as the city council or town council synonym: city representative, town councilor
