synonym: covid

sham

 something that is not as good or true as it seems to be and is intended to deceive people; a person who pretends to be something they are not

synonym: bogus, counterfeit, fraudulent

(1) a **sham** battle, (2) turn out to be all **sham** The data he prepared was completely **sham**.

inefficient

adj. lacking the ability or skill and not making the best use of time, money, energy, etc.

synonym: ineffective, counterproductive, inadequate

(1) inefficient use, (2) inefficient management

The system is still so **inefficient** that it is useless.

anemia

 a medical condition in which the body lacks enough red blood cells or hemoglobin, causing fatigue, weakness, or difficulty breathing; a lack of vitality or liveliness in something

synonym: bloodlessness, pallor, weakness

(1) anemia symptoms, (2) anemia disease

The doctor diagnosed the patient with **anemia** due to a lack of iron in their blood.

malnutrition

n. the condition of having an improper or inadequate diet, typically resulting in weakness, illness, and developmental problems; the state of being undernourished or lacking essential nutrients

synonym: undernourishment, starvation, hunger

(1) severe malnutrition, (2) childhood malnutrition

The doctor advised the patient to eat a balanced diet to avoid **malnutrition**.

plaza

 a public square, marketplace, or similar open area in a town, especially in Spanish-speaking countries

synonym: park, square, center

Three young men were busking in the shopping plaza.

offline

adj. not connected to the internet

synonym: disconnected, not connected, unplugged

(1) **offline** course, (2) **offline** mode

The computer is **offline** and cannot be accessed at the moment.

updatable

adj. capable of being updated or modified with new information, data, or software

synonym: upgradeable, modernizable

(1) **updatable** operating system, (2) **updatable** database The software is **updatable**, so users can always access the latest version with improved features.

smartphone

- a mobile phone that functions as a computer and connects to the Internet
- (1) **smartphone** app developer, (2) **smartphone** addict Internet traffic volumes have increased significantly with the advent of **smartphones**.

polio

 an acute infectious disease caused by a virus that attacks nerve cells in the spinal cord and brain, leading to paralysis, muscle weakness, and potentially lifelong disability

synonym: poliomyelitis, infantile paralysis

vaccinate

swipe

frontline
