#### determinant

# compromise

to settle a problem or disagreement by mutual concession

synonym: agree, settle, negotiate

They never **compromised** on development despite the lack of funds.

### immediately

adv. now or without delay

synonym: directly, instantly, promptly

(1) **immediately** recall a product, (2) write him an answer **immediately** 

A suspension order from the court is effective **immediately**.

#### victim

 a person who has been harmed, injured, or otherwise negatively affected by a particular action, circumstance, or event

synonym: prey, target, sufferer

(1) **victim** support, (2) **victim** compensation

The **victim** of the crime deserves justice and support to recover from the trauma.

#### headline

a heading at the top of a newspaper or magazine story or page

synonym: title, caption

(1) headline article, (2) banner headline

The engagement of the two golf players became **headline** news.

# plummet

v. to fall or drop suddenly and steeply; to decline rapidly or sharply

synonym: drop, plunge, fall

(1) **plummeting** sales, (2) **plummet** against other major currencies

The stock prices have **plummeted** in the last hour, causing concern for investors.

# develop

v. to grow or expand; to improve or refine through a process of progress and refinement, often to achieve greater sophistication or complexity; to elaborate or add detail to something that is in the process of being created

# strategy

 a detailed plan of action designed to achieve a long-term or overall goal.

synonym: approach, procedure, scenario

#### crisis

 a time of great disagreement, confusion, or danger when problems must be resolved or critical decisions must be taken

*synonym*: concern, problem, emergency

(1) financial crisis, (2) crisis management

The Chinese word for **crisis** comprises two characters, one for danger and the other for opportunity.

# destroy

 to ruin or damage severely or completely; to eradicate or eliminate completely

synonym: demolish, ruin, obliterate

(1) destroy the ecosystem, (2) destroyed evidence

The building was destroyed in the fire and had to be rebuilt.

#### recall

v. to remember something

synonym: remember, retrieve, recollect

(1) recall the incident, (2) recall his name

She vividly **recalls** getting laid off several years ago.

# responsible

adj. answerable or accountable for something within one's power, control, or management

synonym: accountable, answerable, liable

(1) **responsible** action, (2) **responsible** for a customer service

She's a **responsible** pet owner who ensures her dog gets enough exercise and a healthy diet.

#### recommend

v. to suggest that someone or something would be a suitable fit for a particular purpose or role

synonym: advise, suggest, instruct

#### ethical

gauge

adj. of or relating to principles about what is right and wrong, or the branch of knowledge dealing with these

*synonym*: honorable, moral, virtuous

- n. an instrument for measuring and displaying the amount, level, or contents of something; (verb) to judge tentatively or form an estimate of something

synonym: measure, benchmark, judge

#### ethic

n. a set of moral or philosophical principles or values that guide the behavior or actions of an individual, group, or society; the study or inquiry into the nature of morality and moral systems

#### stakeholder

 a person or group that has an interest or concern in something, especially a business

# weigh

# employ

synonym: hire, engage, use

#### adviser

# eventually

# damage

suffer

# layoff

 the temporary or permanent dismissal of employees from a company or organization due to a lack of work or financial difficulties; involuntary termination of employment

synonym: dismissal, redundancy, termination

(1) temporary layoff, (2) mass layoff

The workers protested against the unfairness of the **layoff**, claiming they should have been consulted first.

#### addition

 the act or process of adding something to something else; the process of adding numbers

synonym: accumulation, expansion, addendum

(1) chemical addition, (2) addition of vectors

In addition, private corporations provide healthcare services.

#### rebound

v. to spring back into a former shape or position after being compressed or stretched

*synonym*: spring back, resile, recover

(1) **rebound** from a setback, (2) **rebound** back into positive growth

The basketball bounced off the rim and **rebounded** to the player.

#### threat

 a strong indication or likelihood of harm, danger, or adverse consequences; an expression of intent to inflict harm or injury on someone or something, often made as a means of coercion or intimidation

synonym: menace, danger, hazard

evacuation warning.

#### conflict

 a strong disagreement, argument, or a violent clash between two opposing groups or individuals

synonym: clash, discord, competition

He and I often had **conflicts**, not only in personality but also in ideology.

#### decision

 n. the act or process of making up someone's mind about something; a choice or judgment reached after considering options

synonym: choice, determination, judgment

#### utilitarian

adj. designed to be practical and functional rather than decorative or luxurious

synonym: functional, practical, pragmatic

#### utilitarianism

- the belief that the actions are the right if they are useful or for the benefit of a majority

# philosophy

# cyanide

 a highly toxic compound consisting of a carbon atom triple-bonded to a nitrogen atom, most often encountered as hydrogen cyanide or one of its salts, often used in industrial processes, insecticides, and as a lethal poison

#### industrious

# analyst

 someone whose job is to examine something to learn or understand more about it

synonym: reviewer, investigator, judge

#### decide

#### cite

 to refer to something such as a passage, book, etc. as evidence for a theory or as a reason why something has happened

synonym: quote, mention, note

(1) **cite** various authorities, (2) **cite** a fact as evidence The devil can **cite** Scripture for his purpose.

# priority

 something that is more important than other things and should be dealt with first

*synonym*: importance, precedence, primacy

(1) **priority** call, (2) **priority** seating for elderly Her **priority** is to be a mother.

#### estimate

 to guess or calculate the cost, size, value, etc. of something

synonym: calculate, gauge, evaluate

(1) **estimate** a fair value, (2) **estimate** this chicken to weigh three pounds

We **estimated** the season's total trade deficit at \$50 billion.

# regain

v. to get something back or recover something after it has been lost or taken away

synonym: recover, reclaim, retrieve

(1) **regain** our reputation, (2) **regain** my health After years of hard work, he finally **regained** his financial stability.

# prompt

v. to make someone decide to or try to do something, or to make something happen

synonym: actuate, inspire, incite

(1) **prompt** a feeling of hunger, (2) **prompt** a debate That incident **prompted** a nationwide chain reaction regarding the crackdown on illegal groups.

murder

- n. the crime of killing somebody intentionallysynonym: slaying, killing
- (1) **murder** in the second degree, (2) attempted **murder** This intriguing **murder** mystery remains unsolved.

# tamper

v. to interfere with something in a way that causes damage or unauthorized alteration; to meddle with or manipulate something without permission or authority; (noun) a tool or device used for interfering with or altering something in a way that is unauthorized or illegal

#### resistant

# government

 the group of people with authority to control a country or state

institute

 an organization that has a specific purpose, particularly one dealing with science, education, or a particular profession; (verb) to initiate, introduce, or establish something

#### strict

- adj. strongly limiting someone's freedom; allowing no deviation from a standard, rule, belief, etc.

# regulation

 an official rule made and maintained by a government or some other authority; the act of controlling or directing something according to a rule synonym: constraint, restriction, rule

#### initial

# investigate

# copycat
