The patient was diagnosed with an **incurable** disease and given only a few months to live.

biopsy

n. the process of removing and examining tissue from the body of the sick person to determine the existence or cause of a disease

synonym: examination, autopsy

(1) biopsy of bone marrow, (2) liquid biopsy

The doctor performed an excisional breast biopsy.

visceral

 adj. relating to or affecting the internal organs; instinctive or emotional rather than rational; characterized by deep-seated emotional reactions or responses

synonym: instinctive, intuitive, gut

(1) visceral organ, (2) visceral fear

After watching the horror movie, she had a **visceral** reaction and couldn't sleep all night.

forego

v. to precede or go before something in time or order; to give up, relinquish or do without something, usually by choice or obligation

synonym: antecede, precede, relinquish

The company decided to **forego** the expensive advertising campaign and instead rely on word of mouth.

onslaught

n. a fierce or violent attack; a sudden and intense outburst of something, usually negative

synonym: attack, assault, charge

(1) onslaught of criticism, (2) urban onslaught

The village was unprepared for the sudden **onslaught** of the enemy army.

defer

v. to delay or hold back something until a later time; to refer to another source of authority

synonym: postpone, delay, hold off

(1) defer decision, (2) defer payment

I have to **defer** the meeting until next week.

chemo

 short for chemotherapy, a treatment for cancer that uses drugs to destroy cancer cells

synonym: chemotherapy, antineoplastic

(1) chemo patient, (2) chemo-radiotherapy

The side effects of **chemo**, such as nausea and hair loss, were a major concern for the patient.

indecision

 n. the inability to make a decision; a state of uncertainty or hesitation

synonym: hesitation, vacillation, ambivalence

The manager's **indecision** caused delays in the project.

pretended
