# **Session 1: Word List**

#### neuron

- a cell that is specialized to carry information within the brain and between the brain and other parts of the body
- synonym: nerve cell
- (1) excite the **neurons**, (2) **neuron** cell body

Our body transfers information along each **neuron** using an electrical impulse.

#### hone

v. to sharpen or perfect something; to improve a skill or ability through practice

synonym: sharpen, refine, perfect

(1) **hone** abilities, (2) **hone** intuition

The athlete worked with a coach to **hone** her techniques and improve her performance.

#### comprehend

- v. to understand the nature or meaning of something fully synonym: understand, grasp, apprehend
- (1) **comprehend** English, (2) **comprehend** instructions She struggled to **comprehend** complex math problems.

# syllable

- a single unit of spoken language more significant than a phoneme containing a vowel sound and usually one or more consonants
- (1) syllable structure, (2) single syllable

Emphasize the second **syllable** when pronouncing it.

#### crane

 a large, tall machine used for moving heavy objects by suspending them from a beam or hook

synonym: hoist, derrick, winch

(1) **crane** operator, (2) **crane** construction

The construction workers used a **crane** to lift the heavy beams.

### homophone

 a word that is pronounced the same as another word but differs in meaning and may differ in spelling

synonym: homonym, same-sounding word

(1) **homophone** confusion, (2) **homophone** pair "Knight" and "night" are **homophones**, despite having different spellings and meanings.

### multilingual

adj. skilled in or using multiple languages; involving or relating to multiple languages or language groups

synonym: polyglot

(1) **multilingual** education, (2) **multilingual** staff My friend is **multilingual**, speaking five different languages fluently.

#### overwrite

v. to replace or overwrite existing data or information with new data, often in the context of computer files or software

synonym: rewrite, correct, revise

(1) **overwrite** setting, (2) **overwrite** memory Don't forget to back up your data before you **overwrite** any files on your computer.

# hippocampus

- a major component of the brain of humans and other vertebrates that is part of the limbic system and is vital for memory
- (1) involvement of the **hippocampus**, (2) neurons in the **hippocampus**

The **hippocampus** is crucial for learning and memory storage.

#### interweave

v. to combine or blend substantive parts or elements; to interlace; to mix or intermingle

synonym: intertwine, intertwist, interlace

(1) interweave threads, (2) interweave ideas

The author expertly tried to **interweave** the story's plot and characters.

### disrupt

v. to prevent or stop something, especially an event, activity, or process, from continuing in the usual way by causing a problem or disturbance

synonym: interrupt, disturb, break into

(1) **disrupt** a well-ordered condition, (2) **disrupt** sleep I'm so sorry to **disrupt** you when you're pretty busy.
