#### viol

- a stringed instrument, typically with six strings and frets, played with a bow, also called a viola da gamba
- synonym: viola, viola da gamba, string instrument
- (1) viol instrument, (2) viol music

The **viol** player was rehearsing for an upcoming concert.

#### wreck

- a ship that has sunk or has been destroyed; a vehicle that has been badly damaged in an accident synonym: collapse, destruction, devastation
- (1) the house was a wreck, (2) a worthless wreck The divers accidentally discovered a wreck on the ocean floor.

#### misunderstand

- to interpret or understand something in the wrong way synonym: misinterpret, misperceive, misapprehend
- (1) misunderstand each other, (2) misunderstand entirely about her

You should not **misunderstand** the meaning of freedom.

rev

a measure of the rate at which an engine or motor rotates, often expressed in revolutions per minute (RPM); (verb) to increase the number of rotations per minute

*synonym*: revolution, RPM, speed

(1) low- rev engine, (2) rev up the crowd He stepped on the gas pedal, and the engine released a loud rev.

#### pretension

the act of claiming or asserting something, especially without good reason or without evidence; an unfounded or excessive claim or ambition

synonym: presumption, pretense, affectation

(1) **pretension** to authority, (2) baseless **pretension** His **pretensions** of being a gourmet were quickly exposed when he could not identify basic herbs and spices.

#### puncture

 a small hole or wound made by piercing, such as with a needle, nail, or pointed object

synonym: piercing, prick, hole

(1) bicycle puncture, (2) needle puncture

The tire had a **puncture** and needed to be replaced.

#### quitter

 a person who gives up easily or does not have the determination to finish what they have started

synonym: coward, deserter, surrender

(1) easy quitter, (2) serial quitter

He was labeled as a **quitter** after he abandoned the project halfway.

#### institutionalize

v. to establish or make something a part of an institution (= a place such as a university, hospital, etc.)

synonym: formalize, establish, regularize

(1) **institutionalize** a system, (2) **institutionalize** customary laws

The new policy aims to **institutionalize** the use of renewable energy sources.

#### pandemic

 an outbreak of a disease that affects many people over a very wide area

synonym: outbreak

(1) flu pandemic, (2) global pandemic

They fear a pandemic of a new type of virus.

#### befall

v. to happen or occur, especially unexpectedly or by chance; to affect or happen to someone or something in a negative or unfortunate way

synonym: occur, happen, take place

(1) **befall** tragedy, (2) misfortunes **befall** 

I hope nothing bad will **befall** my family during the storm.

veil

n. a piece of fine cloth worn by women to cover or conceal the face; (verb) to cover, conceal, or obscure

synonym: cover, mask, (verb) conceal

(1) **veil** of mystery, (2) **veil** her face He lifted her **veil** with both hands.
