diverge

- v. to move or extend in different directions from a common point; to branch off or deviate from a path or coursesynonym: separate, split, part
- (1) **diverge** from tradition, (2) **diverge** from the main topic As tectonic plates **diverge**, new oceanic crust is formed along mid-ocean ridges.

recollection

the act of remembering or the state of being remembered

synonym: memory, reminiscence, remembrance

(1) a vague **recollection**, (2) **recollection** of a traumatic event

The older man's **recollections** of his youth were filled with stories of adventure and romance.

magnify

v. to make something look bigger than it really is, especially by looking at it through a lens; to make something bigger, stronger, or louder

synonym: enlarge, elaborate, intensify

(1) **magnify** the danger, (2) **magnify** the image for display Terrorists often attempt to **magnify** the economic impact of their acts of destruction.

lollipop

a type of candy made of hard candy or toffee on a stick;a round or oval-shaped candy or sweet on a stick

synonym: sucker, candy, sweet

(1) **lollipop** candy, (2) giant **lollipop**

The child happily licked the rainbow-colored lollipop.

thunderstorm

n. a storm with lightning and thunder, typically with heavy rain and strong gusts of wind

synonym: tempest, lightning storm, deluge

(1) severe **thunderstorms**, (2) **thunderstorm** advisory The forecast called for a chance of **thunderstorms** in the afternoon.

retroactive

- adj. taking effect from a date in the past rather than the present; applying to a prior period or eventsynonym: retrospective, backward-looking
- (1) **retroactive** interference, (2) **retroactive** changes The **retroactive** pay increase was a nice surprise for the employees.

interrogate

- v. to examine someone with questions over a lengthy period, especially in an aggressive mannersynonym: question, examine, probe
- (1) **interrogate** an enemy soldier, (2) **interrogated** by police The lawyer spent considerable time to adequately **interrogate** the witness.

confession

- a formal statement in which one admits that they have done something wrong or illegal
- synonym: admission, avowal, acknowledgment
- (1) a **confession** of guilt, (2) a **confession** of faith The prisoner made a full **confession** and admitted to his crime.

eyewitness

- n. someone who sees an event, especially a crime or accident, happen and can describe what happenedsynonym: observer, spectator, witness
- (1) a memory of an **eyewitness**, (2) **eyewitness** report The **eyewitness** testimony was crucial in solving the case.

courtroom

- n. a room in which a court of law is heldsynonym: law court, tribunal
- (1) **courtroom** drama, (2) **courtroom** trial

 The eyewitness took the stand in the **courtroom** and gave testimony crucial to the case.

inadmissible

adj. not admissible or allowed, particularly in a legal or formal setting; not acceptable or appropriatesynonym: unacceptable, impermissible, prohibited

juror

 synonym: jurist, arbiter, assessor

ironclad
