### congressperson

 a person who belongs to a congress, especially a member of the US House of Representatives; congressman (congressperson is used to avoid gender discrimination)

synonym: lawmaker, politician, representative

(1) hawkish **congressperson**, (2) former **congressperson**The term of a **congressperson** is two years.

### opportune

 adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

opportune occasion, (2) an opportune remark
 The phone rang at the most opportune time.

### fuss

- n. a state of agitation or excitement; an angry disturbancesynonym: commotion, agitation, disturbance
- (1) make a **fuss**, (2) get into a **fuss**There was a **fuss** about the broken vase, but it was quickly forgotten.

### dew

 the tiny drops of water that have condensed on a cool surface overnight

synonym: condensation, vapor, fog

(1) a drop of **dew**, (2) morning **dew** Moisture in the atmosphere condenses at night and forms dew.

### desegregation

the action or process of eliminating segregation, typically of races or ethnic groups, in educational, social, or other institutions

synonym: integration, assimilation

(1) desegregation plan, (2) legal desegregation **Desegregation** of schools was a major social issue in the 1960s.

### boycott

to refuse to buy, use, or patronize a particular product or service as a form of protest or to bring about change; (noun) a deliberate and organized refusal to buy or use a product, service, or organization as a form of protest or to apply pressure for change

synonym: protest, abstain, avoid

- (1) **boycott** campaign, (2) **boycott** the discussion Many people have decided to **boycott** the company due to their unethical practices.
- a speech or lecture given by a religious leader, n. especially a minister or priest, as part of a worship service

synonym: homily, discourse, lecture

(1) lengthy sermon, (2) a lay sermon The preacher delivered a powerful **sermon** on the importance of forgiveness.

sermon

- one of a group of early Christian leaders who were n. chosen and trained by Jesus to spread his teachings synonym: messenger, envoy, delegate
- (1) **Apostle** Paul, (2) an **apostle** of revolution The twelve **apostles** were Jesus' closest followers and were chosen to spread his teachings.

# apostle

### **Christ**

 the man that Christians believe is the prophet and the son of God, and whose life and sermons form the basis for Christianity

synonym: Savior, Jesus Christ, Jesus

(1) teaching of Christ, (2) before Christ

**Christmas** is the day to celebrate the birth of Christ.

### nonviolence

n. the use of peaceful means, such as civil disobedience or passive resistance, rather than violence to achieve a goal, especially in the context of political or social change

synonym: pacifism, nonresistance, peacekeeping

(1) **nonviolence** movement, (2) **nonviolence** protest Martin Luther King Jr. was a champion of **nonviolence** in the fight for civil rights.

### worldview

 a particular philosophy or cognitive orientation of life or conception of the world

synonym: perspective, position, viewpoint

(1) mainstream **worldview**, (2) the **worldview** of the ancient civilization

The war between the two countries was also a battle between competing **worldviews**.

## someplace

adv. somewhere without specifying a particular or exact location

synonym: somewhere, anywhere, wherever

(1) from **someplace** deep inside, (2) **someplace** quiet Let's go **someplace** new and try something we have not done before.

## pretension

n. the act of claiming or asserting something, especially without good reason or without evidence; an unfounded or excessive claim or ambition

*synonym*: presumption, pretense, affectation

pretension to authority, (2) baseless pretension
 pretensions of being a gourmet were quickly exposed

when he could not identify basic herbs and spices.

### almighty

adj. having supreme or ultimate power or authority; complete and total; omnipotent

synonym: omnipotent, all-powerful, supreme

(1) almighty power, (2) almighty dollar

The **almighty** ruler of the kingdom held ultimate power over his subjects.

### preach

- v. to deliver a religious or moral message to an audience synonym: expound, advocate, sermonize
- (1) preach the gospel, (2) preach to the massesThe pastor preached about the importance of forgiveness.

### confession

 a formal statement in which one admits that they have done something wrong or illegal

synonym: admission, avowal, acknowledgment

(1) a **confession** of guilt, (2) a **confession** of faith The prisoner made a full **confession** and admitted to his crime.

# lynch

v. to put to death or punish (usually by hanging) without legal authorization or due process, often as an act of mob justice or vigilante action; (noun) a violent punishment, often extrajudicial, in which a mob or group of people seize and kill someone, usually by hanging, as a form of punishment or vengeance

synonym: hang, execute, mob

(1) lynch law, (2) lynch him to death

The mob wanted to **lynch** the suspect before he could be tried in court.

# segregation

n. the act or process of separating or isolating people, things, or groups based on race, gender, religion, social class, or other characteristics; a political or social system that enforces such separation or isolation

synonym: isolation, separation, discrimination

# (1) racial segregation,(2) segregation of powerSegregation based on race or ethnicity is illegal and unjust.

### confederate

 a person who is allied or associated with another person or group, especially in a political or military context; a supporter of the Confederate States of America

synonym: ally, associate, partner

(1) **confederate** soldier, (2) **Confederate** government The two countries are **confederates** and have a strong alliance.

### revere

v. to feel deep and profound respect or admiration for someone or something; to hold in high esteem

synonym: worship, venerate, admire

(1) **revere** a hero, (2) **revere** a deity

Many people **revere** their religious leaders and look up to them for guidance.

### barefoot

adj. without shoes or other foot coverings; wearing nothing on the feet

synonym: bare, shoeless, unshod

(1) barefoot walk, (2) barefoot fashion

The **barefoot** hiker enjoyed feeling the earth beneath their feet.

### assassin

 a person who murders a prominent or well-known person for political reasons or in exchange for money

synonym: killer, manslayer

(1) fall victim to an **assassin**, (2) would-be **assassin** She hired an **assassin** to kill her opponent.

### eloquent

adj. able to speak or write clearly and impressively synonym: persuasive, fluent, well-spoken

an eloquent speaker, (2) eloquent writing
 She gave an eloquent speech at the graduation ceremony.

### determinant

 a factor, circumstance, or condition that contributes to the shaping, influencing, or determining of a particular outcome or result

synonym: cause, factor, element

(1) environmental **determinant**, (2) a **determinant** of crop yields

One **determinant** of success is having a positive attitude and a strong work ethic.

### greet

v. to say hello to someone; to express welcome on meeting someone

synonym: welcome, salute, acknowledge

(1) greet a customer, (2) greet an idea

He **greeted** his friends with a warm smile and a hug.

### sane

adj. mentally sound or normal; having a rational mind synonym: rational, sound, normal

(1) for a **sane** reason, (2) **sane** judgment Despite the difficult circumstances, he remained **sane**.

### disrupt

v. to prevent or stop something, especially an event, activity, or process, from continuing in the usual way by causing a problem or disturbance

synonym: interrupt, disturb, break into

(1) **disrupt** a well-ordered condition, (2) **disrupt** sleep I'm so sorry to **disrupt** you when you're pretty busy.

# inauguration

 the formal beginning or initiation of something, especially the beginning of a political leader's term in office; a ceremony marking the beginning of an organization or event

synonym: swearing-in, investiture, initiation

- (1) **inauguration** ceremony, (2) presidential **inauguration** The **inauguration** of the new station was a great success.
- n. the state or quality of being allowed and acceptable under the law; the state or quality of being founded on a

# legitimacy

# reasonable or acceptable reason

synonym: legality, lawfulness, authenticity

(1) democratic **legitimacy**, (2) challenge the **legitimacy** I'm going to deny the **legitimacy** of his claim.

### mend

- v. to repair or fix something that is broken or damaged synonym: fix, repair, rectify
- (1) **mend** broken relationship, (2) **mend** my ways He **mended** the torn shirt with a needle and thread.

### liberate

to set free; to release or rescue from captivity or oppression

synonym: emancipate, release, set free

(1) **liberate** people from oppression, (2) **liberate** potential The prisoners were **liberated** after the war ended.

### stern

adj. serious, unyielding, or strict in manner or attitude synonym: severe, harsh, strict

stern warning, (2) a stern look
 The students' antics did not amuse the stern teacher.

### mumble

v. to speak quietly, unclearly, or in a way that is difficult to understand; to murmur or mutter inarticulately

*synonym*: murmur, mutter, whisper

(1) **mumble** a reply, (2) **mumble** under your breath She tended to **mumble** when she was nervous or unsure of herself.

### scar

a mark that remains on the skin after a wound has healed

*synonym*: blemish, imperfection, blotch

(1) burn scar, (2) carry a scar

Even after the wound has healed, a **scar** remains.

### bruise

 a mark caused by a blow, typically one that is purple or black on the skin synonym: contusion, injury, wound

(1) livid **bruise**, (2) earlier emotional **bruise**She had a **bruise** on her arm from where she fell on the playground.

crusade

 a series of wars fought by Christians in the middle ages to recover the holy land from the Muslims; a series of actions advancing a principle or tending toward a particular end

synonym: holy war, religious war, expedition

(1) a **crusade** against smoking, (2) environmental **crusade** During the **Crusade** period, many European Christians went on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land.
