hymn

 a song of praise or worship, especially one in a religious service or ceremony

recount

shun

v. to avoid deliberately or keep away from someone or something

synonym: avoid, evade, steer clear of

He **shunned** going to the party and decided to stay home instead.

deem

- v. to consider or decide something in a particular way synonym: believe, consider, suppose
- (1) **deem** socially responsible, (2) **deem** wrong or inappropriate

Regarding earthquakes, some commercial buildings were **deemed** unsafe.

underlie

laureate
