bystander

 a person who witnesses an event or situation but does not actively participate or intervene

synonym: spectator, observer, witness

The **bystander** effect is a phenomenon where people are less likely to intervene in an emergency if others are present.

hieroglyph

a writing system using picture symbols, such as the one used in ancient Egypt
