misogyny

 a dislike of, contempt for, or ingrained prejudice against women

synonym: sexism, chauvinism

His speech was filled with **misogyny** and caused widespread outrage.

airwave

 a system of transmitting sound, video, or other data through the air using radio waves or other electromagnetic waves

synonym: broadcast, transmission, radio signal

(1) walkie-talkie **airwave**, (2) commercial **airwave**The radio station broadcasts my favorite song over the **airwaves**.

depict
