forearm

frightening

adj. causing fear or alarm, or very surprising and alarming synonym: scary, terrifying, alarming

The news of the pandemic was a **frightening** reminder of the fragility of human health.

malnourished

adj. not getting enough of the right type of food to stay healthy and strong

synonym: undernourished, underfed

(1) premature **malnourished** infant, (2) **malnourished** population

Malnourished children are at risk of developmental delays and chronic health problems.

hairstyle

 the way in which a person's hair is cut, styled, or arranged on their head

synonym: hairdo, coiffure, haircut

(1) modern hairstyle, (2) bob hairstyle

My sister got a new **hairstyle** for her job interview.

congratulation

n. the act of expressing that someone has an occasion for celebration or the expression of pleasure at the success or good fortune of another

synonym: praise, compliment, felicitation

The **congratulations** from her friends and family were overwhelming after she won the championship.

confuse

synonym: confound, obscure, disorient

(1) **confuse** the listener, (2) **confuse** fantasy with reality Her remarks **confused** the debate.

resent

v. to feel anger, bitterness, or indignation towards someone or something as a result of unfair treatment or

perceived injustice; to harbor negative feelings towards someone or something

synonym: dislike, begrudge, envy

synonym: mourn, lament, sorrow

- (1) **grieve** for loss, (2) **grieve** at the sad news She **grieved** the loss of her parents.
- something that is not as good or true as it seems to be and is intended to deceive people; a person who pretends to be something they are not

synonym: bogus, counterfeit, fraudulent

- (1) a **sham** battle, (2) turn out to be all **sham** The data he prepared was completely **sham**.
- close familiarity or friendship; a close, familiar, and usually affectionate or loving personal relationship with another person

synonym: closeness, familiarity, nearness

- (1) on terms of **intimacy**, (2) build **intimacy**They were looking for **intimacy** in their relationship and wanted to be close to each other.
