livable

adj. capable of being lived in comfortably and sustainably;suitable for human habitation

synonym: habitable, comfortable, pleasant

(1) livable city, (2) livable housing

Finding a safe and **livable** neighborhood is important when looking for a new place to live.

heatstroke

 a serious and potentially life-threatening condition caused by prolonged exposure to high temperatures, which symptoms include high body temperature, rapid heartbeat, and confusion or loss of consciousness

synonym: heat exhaustion, hyperthermia, sunstroke

(1) **heatstroke** symptoms, (2) **heatstroke** prevention

The hiker experienced a severe **heatstroke** after hiking in the desert for several hours without enough water.

industrialize

- *v.* to organize the production of something into an industry *synonym*: motorize
- (1) **industrialize** service, (2) **industrialized** textile production

The nations of South East Asia will quickly **industrialize** and catch up with the West.

enclose

v. to surround, as with a fence, wall, or barrier; to put within boundaries; to include

synonym: surround, encase, contain

enclose a check with a letter, (2) enclose area
 The walls were enclosed to create a private outdoor space.

rudimentary

adj. relating to basic facts or principles; fundamental *synonym*: essential, fundamental, elementary

(1) a **rudimentary** plant, (2) **rudimentary** understanding He has only a **rudimentary** knowledge of this topic.

saga

 a long, detailed story or account of heroic deeds, family history, or notable events, often consisting of a series of connected episodes

synonym: epic, tale, chronicle

(1) fantasy saga, (2) historical saga

The epic **saga** of the family's journey through time captivated readers worldwide.

grandparent

- a parent of one's father or mother
- (1) great- **grandparent**, (2) person of **grandparent** age She was close to her paternal **grandparents** and often spent summers with them.

grandchild

- n. a child of someone's son or daughtersynonym: offspring, descendant, progeny
- (1) **grandchild-grandparent** relationship, (2) **grandchild** development

The grandparents take care of their **grandchild** while the parents are at work.

gore

v. to pierce with a sharp object, causing injury or death;(noun) coagulated blood from a wound

synonym: pierce, stab, puncture

brink

n. the point at which something is about to happen; the edge of a steep place

catastrophe

ancestor

terrifying

barnacle

a type of crustacean that attaches itself to hard surfaces underwater, such as rocks, ships, or docks; a metaphorical term used to describe a person or object that is difficult to remove or separate from another

person or object

synonym: cirripede, shellfish, crustacean

(1) barnacle growth, (2) barnacle removal

The bottom of the boat was covered in **barnacles**, slowing its speed in the water.

sliver

n. a small, thin, narrow piece or fragment of something, often characterized by its length or its sharpness or thinness; a small portion or amount of something, often used in a metaphorical sense to describe a trace or a hint of something

vegan

seaweed

methane

- a chemical compound with the chemical formula CH4 with no smell or color, often used as a fuel

decarbonize

v. to stop or reduce emitting carbon gases, especially carbon dioxide, by replacing energy made from fossil fuels with renewable energy
