synonym: suitable, timely, practical

salmonella

- a type of bacteria that causes food poisoning and other illnesses, commonly found in contaminated food or water

synonym: pollute, contaminate, affect

microbe

 a tiny living thing that can only be seen with a microscope and that may cause disease

synonym: germ, microorganism, bacterium

fungus

 a type of organism that includes yeasts, molds, and mushrooms, which are heterotrophic, meaning they do not produce their food and must consume organic matter to survive

synonym: mold, mildew, yeast

Certain types of fungus can be toxic to humans, causing

severe illness if ingested.

degrade

v. to make something worse, especially in quality; to show or treat someone in a way that makes them seem no value and do not have the respect or reasonable opinion of others

synonym: demean, disgrace, impair

You should not **degrade** yourself by allowing them to use you.

woe

Our body's immune system produces antibodies to **counteract** disease.

sparing

- adj. characterized by using or giving very little of something;frugal or economical in the use of resources or materialssynonym: frugal, economical, thrifty
- a sparing amount of sugar, (2) time sparing
 The sparing use of resources is important for conservation efforts.

incentivize
