slum

 a heavily populated urban area characterized by poor, run-down housing and infrastructure, often associated with poverty and social neglect

synonym: shantytown, slumdwellings, ghetto

polio

n. an acute infectious disease caused by a virus that attacks nerve cells in the spinal cord and brain, leading to paralysis, muscle weakness, and potentially lifelong disability

paralyze

scar

 a mark that remains on the skin after a wound has healed

*synonym*: blemish, imperfection, blotch

(1) burn scar, (2) carry a scar

Even after the wound has healed, a **scar** remains.

infect

v. to affect a person, an animal, or a plant with a disease-causing organism

synonym: pollute, contaminate, affect

(1) **infect** other animal species, (2) **infect** a computer with a virus

Children often **infect** parents with this head cold.

#### malnourished

adj. not getting enough of the right type of food to stay healthy and strong

synonym: undernourished, underfed

(1) premature **malnourished** infant, (2) **malnourished** population

**Malnourished** children are at risk of developmental delays and chronic health problems.

#### confine

- v. to restrict the movement of someone or something synonym: restrict, limit, contain
- (1) **confine** themselves solely, (2) **confine** the scope of use The animal was **confined** in a small cage.

#### aback

adv. to be very surprised or shocked by somebody or something

synonym: surprised, astounded, shocked

(1) flat aback, (2) aback shock

The sudden news of the merger took me **aback**.

#### overlook

v. to fail to notice something; to watch over someone; to provide a view from above

synonym: disregard, look down, supervise

(1) **overlook** a street, (2) **overlook** that fact

We cannot **overlook** an opportunity for great success.

#### **immunization**

 the process of making a person or animal immune to a specific disease by administering a vaccine or other preventative measure

synonym: vaccination, shot, inoculation

(1) **immunization** program, (2) childhood **immunization** Due to the success of **immunization** programs, certain diseases, such as smallpox, have been eradicated.

#### uncounted

adj. too numerous to be counted; too many to be counted or estimated accurately

synonym: unaccounted, myriad, countless

(1) uncounted ballots, (2) uncounted stars

The **uncounted** number of volunteers who helped during the disaster was truly inspiring.

### unprotected

adj. not guarded, covered, or shielded; vulnerable; without protection or defense

synonym: uncovered, defenseless, vulnerable

(1) **unprotected** area, (2) **unprotected** Wi-Fi It's important never to have **unprotected** sex to prevent the spread of STDs.

#### stateless

adj. having no nationality or citizenship; not being affiliated with any particular state or government

synonym: without citizenship, homeless

(1) become **stateless**, (2) **stateless** person

The **stateless** refugees were not allowed to enter the country.

#### sub-Saharan

adj. of or relating to or situated in the area south of the Sahara Desert

(1) **sub-Saharan** Africa, (2) **sub-Saharan** countries
The coffee producers in **sub-Saharan** countries are at the sharp end of fluctuations in price.

#### unbanked

- adj. not having a bank account or access to any financial services
- (1) unbanked customers, (2) those who are unbanked
- 2.5 billion people in the world remain **unbanked**.
