#### frontline

adj. in the most critical or dangerous position; in the military line or part of an army closest to the enemy

synonym: battlefront, cutting edge

#### clinician

 a practitioner, especially of medicine or psychology, who has direct contact with patients

*synonym*: psychiatrist, therapist, doctor

#### empower

- v. to give someone the power or authority to do something synonym: authorize, endow, entitle

#### throe

 a severe or intense spasm of pain, such as a pang of childbirth or the spasms of a dying person; a period of intense stress or difficulty

synonym: spasm, pang, throb

#### coronavirus

n. a large family of viruses that can cause illness in humans and animals, which name comes from the crown-like spikes on the surface of the virus, which can be seen under a microscope, and COVID-19 is caused by a specific type of coronavirus known as SARS-CoV-2

synonym: covid

(1) **coronavirus** antibody test kit, (2) **coronavirus** bankruptcy

#### heartbreak

- n. a feeling of great sadness or disappointmentsynonym: grief, sorrow, bitterness

## preemption

 the act of taking action or claiming possession of something before someone else can, often with the legal authority to do so; the displacement of something by something else; the right of a state to regulate matters within its jurisdiction

synonym: precedence, seizure, takeover

#### multiplex

n. a cinema complex with several screens or theaters showing different films at the same time; an electronic device that allows several signals to be transmitted or processed simultaneously through a single channel; (adjective) relating to or consisting of multiple interconnected parts or elements

synonym: multiplexer, complex, cinema

(1) **multiplex** telegraphy, (2) **multiplex** DNA analysis The new **multiplex** cinema has 12 screens showing the latest movies.

#### dashboard

 a control panel set within the central console of a vehicle or small aircraft; a diagram that depicts critical information, typically one that provides a business overview

synonym: control panel

(1) auto **dashboard**, (2) business **dashboard**He noticed that the oil warning light on the **dashboard** of his car had turned on.

#### turnaround

 the amount of time needed to prepare a vessel or ship for a return trip; a change or improvement in the condition, performance, or affairs of something

synonym: recovery, improvement, reversal

The company's **turnaround** was a result of new management strategies.

#### nonstop

adj. without intermediate stops between source and destination

synonym: continuous, ceaseless, endless
