awe

 a feeling of respect and wonder inspired by someone or something greatly admired

synonym: wonder, amazement, reverence

grace

commit

v. to do something illegal or wrong

thrive

pardon

commute

expunge

debt

disadvantage

 a drawback or a negative aspect of something; (verb) to put someone or something in an unfavorable position synonym: detriment, drawback, (verb) disfavor

A lack of education can be a significant **disadvantage** in today's job market.

bias

 a strong feeling in favor of or against one group of people, an idea, or thing, often not based on fair judgment

privilege

 a special right or advantage that only one person or group of people has, usually because they are rich and powerful in a society

statistics

- the discipline that concerns the collection, organization, analysis, interpretation, and presentation of data

president

 the leader of a republic, for example, the US; the person in charge of the organization such as a company, university, club, etc.

synonym: leader, CEO, chairperson

historic

adj. famous or significant in history, or potentially so synonym: memorable, momentous, historical

religion

 a deep conviction in a supernatural power that controls human destiny

synonym: faith, creed, belief

tradition

 a belief, custom, or way of doing something that has been passed down from generation to generation within a group or society

synonym: custom, practice, ritual

a tradition of a culture, (2) against tradition
 a tradition in many families to have a big Thanksgiving dinner with all their relatives.

philosophy

- n. the study of general and fundamental questions, such as those about existence, reason, knowledge, values, mind synonym: doctrine, attitude, creed
- (1) **philosophy** of education, (2) western **philosophy** Ethics is a branch of **philosophy**.

medical

adj. relating to the treatment of illness or injuries; relating to the practice of medicine

synonym: health, disease, treatment

(1) a **medical** opinion, (2) temporary **medical** treatment The **medical** team worked quickly to save the patient's life.

resentment

- n. bitterness or indignation at being treated unfairlysynonym: bitterness, enmity, animosity

transition

n. the process or period of changing from one state or circumstance to another

synonym: change, growth, shift

apartheid

 a system of racial segregation and discrimination that was enforced in South Africa from 1948 to 1994; any similar system of discrimination or segregation based on race, ethnicity, or other factors

synonym: segregation, discrimination, oppression

The South African government enforced **apartheid** laws that segregated people based on race.

democracy

 a form of government in which the people have the authority to deliberate and decide legislation, or to choose governing officials to do so

synonym: self-government, republic, commonwealth

(1) **democracy** advocate, (2) principles of **democracy Democracy** often entails inclusive capitalism as well.

poison

n. a substance that can cause illness, injury, or death when ingested, inhaled, or absorbed through the skin; something harmful, malicious, or toxic; the act of damaging or ruining a relationship; (verb) to introduce a substance into something or someone harmful and potentially deadly

synonym: toxin, venom, pollutant

penalty

criminal

n. a person who has committed a crime

explore

obligation

 the state of being morally or legally bound to do or pay something

synonym: burden, commitment, debt

You are under no **obligation** to finish the job.

governor

 the person who holds the highest executive office in a state or province

synonym: administrator, executive, leader

(1) **governor** general, (2) a prefectural **governor**

The state **governor** visited the affected areas and promised to aid the victims.

release

- v. to set free or allow to escape from confinement synonym: free, let go, discharge
- (1) **release** a prisoner, (2) **release** CO2 into the air
 The animal rights group worked to **release** the dolphins back into the wild.

convict

- v. to prove or declare someone to be guilty of a crime;
 (noun) a person serving a sentence in a jail or prison
 synonym: condemn, sentence, judge
- (1) **convict** him of manslaughter, (2) **convict** in a jail He was **convicted** on fraud charges and sentenced to five years in prison.

cartoon

 a simple drawing depicting a humorous or critical situation, often accompanied by a caption

synonym: illustration, drawing, caricature

(1) **cartoon** character, (2) **cartoon** industry

He spent his afternoon watching **cartoon** movies on TV.

mustache

- n. an unshaved growth of hair on the upper lip synonym: whisker
- (1) a gray **mustache**, (2) big **mustache**The actor's **mustache** has become an icon.

defendant

 a person or party who is accused of a crime or who is being sued in a court of law

synonym: accused, prisoner, litigant

(1) **defendant** in court, (2) the **defendant's** testimony The **defendant's** lawyer argued that his client was not responsible for the crime.

obvious

adj. easy to see, discover or understand synonym: apparent, conspicuous, evident

guilty

adj. feeling responsible for or having done something wrong or criminal

synonym: culpable, blameworthy, at fault

(1) feel a bit **guilty**, (2) **guilty** verdict

After much contemplation, the suspect decided to plead

guilty to the theft charge.

undermine

v. to make someone or something less powerful, less effective, weaker gradually; to make someone's fame, confidence, or authority less effective or weaker gradually

synonym: damage, subvert, weaken

(1) **undermine** a good relationship, (2) **undermine** their adversary's reputation

They tried to **undermine** her position by slandering her.

commitment

 a promise or firm decision to do something or to behave in a certain way

synonym: burden, obligation, promise

His business **commitments** took him to the United States.

circumstance

the specific conditions or events that surround a particular situation or occurrence

synonym: condition, context, environment

(1) circumstance of birth, (2) circumstance of injury

She explained the **circumstances** surrounding the accident.

evenly

adv. in equal amounts or shares; in a balanced or impartial way

synonym: constantly, smoothly, equally

(1) **evenly** colored, (2) almost **evenly** divided

This product can spread the cement **evenly**.

mass

 a large amount of a substance with no definite shape or form; a large number of people or things grouped or crowded together

synonym: abundance, crowd, mob

(1) a mass of molten rock, (2) critical mass

The **mass** of people who do not own property is politically impotent.

incarceration

n. the state of being confined in prison or jail *synonym*: confinement, imprisonment, detention

(1) mass incarceration, (2) incarceration rates

The judge sentenced him to five years of **incarceration** for embezzlement.

widespread

adj. existing or happening in various places or among many people

synonym: across-the-board, overall, general

(1) widespread use, (2) widespread fear of nuclear war

In medieval times, death punishment was **widespread** and socially accepted.

consume

v. to spend something, especially fuel, energy, or time, in a large amount

synonym: absorb, ingest, use up

(1) **consume** a large of alcohol, (2) **consume** electricity A smaller car will **consume** less fuel.

contrast

- v. to put in opposition to show or emphasize differences synonym: differ, vary, counterpoint
- (1) **contrast** with a decade ago, (2) **contrast** two things It's intriguing to compare and **contrast** the two authors.

juvenile

adj. relating to or characteristic of youth or young people; immature

synonym: youthful, boyish, childlike

(1) exhibit **juvenile** behavior, (2) **juvenile** justice
The detective suspected that the vandalism was the work of **juvenile** delinquents.

offend

- v. to cause someone to feel upset, angry, or annoyed synonym: insult, hurt, anger
- (1) **offend** his sensibilities, (2) **offend** a customer His rude comments **offended** many people at the party.

condemn

- v. to express strong disapproval or criticism of something synonym: criticize, denounce, censure
- (1) **condemn** violence, (2) **condemn** crime
 The government was **condemned** for its handling of the crisis.

pun

 a humorous play on words or use of words that sound similar but have different meanings, often for a comedic effect; a form of wordplay

synonym: joke, quip, wordplay

(1) witty pun, (2) silly pun

The comedian's **pun** had the audience laughing out loud.

involve

v. to include or affect someone or something as a necessary part of something else

synonym: implicate, include, engage

(1) **involve** a lot of paperwork, (2) **involve** a high degree of risk

The investigation **involves** several government agencies and is expected to take several months.

conflict

 a strong disagreement, argument, or a violent clash between two opposing groups or individuals

synonym: clash, discord, competition

(1) the **conflict** between good and evil, (2) the longstanding **conflict**

He and I often had **conflicts**, not only in personality but also in ideology.

responsible

adj. answerable or accountable for something within one's power, control, or management

synonym: accountable, answerable, liable

(1) **responsible** action, (2) **responsible** for a customer service

She's a **responsible** pet owner who ensures her dog gets enough exercise and a healthy diet.

nation

 a large organized community of people living in a particular country or region and having a particular culture

synonym: country, state, sovereign entity

(1) nation-state, (2) a seafaring nation

The **nation** of Japan is known for its unique culture and advanced technology.

warlord

a military leader who has gained control over a region or territory, typically through force or intimidation; a commander of an army or group of soldiers who operates outside the control of a legitimate government synonym: chieftain, commander, leader

(1) tribal warlord, (2) regional warlord

The warlord's army was well-equipped and well-trained, making them a formidable force to reckon with.

republic

a state or country in which the people and their elected representatives hold supreme power and which has an elected or nominated president rather than a monarch

synonym: democracy, federation, commonwealth

enlist

to sign up to serve in the military or a particular organization

to persuade someone to work for a company; to find new members for an organization, the armed forces, etc. synonym: raise, enroll, enlist

deploy

- to move troops or weapons into a position or military action; to bring into something in an effective way synonym: set up, expand, launch
- (1) **deploy** troops for battle, (2) **deploy** safety measures This country **deployed** its weapons in the east region.

deserve

v. to be worthy of or entitled to something, especially something good or valuable

synonym: merit, earn, justify

(1) **deserve** respect, (2) **deserve** this prize

The employee **deserved** the promotion for their hard work and dedication.

violent

adj. involving or caused by physical force or aggression against someone or something

synonym: aggressive, intense, turbulent

threaten

 to utter intentions of injury or punishment against someone

rhetoric

 speech or writing intended to please or persuade someone; the art or study of using language effectively and persuasively in spoken or written form synonym: oratory, eloquence, persuasion

innocent

gang

framework

inviting

 adj. having an attractive or tempting quality that draws people in; encouraging or alluring in a way that makes people want to take part or participate

conduct

- v. to organize and carry out a particular activity synonym: behave, lead, carry on

pipeline

automatic
