lunar

adj. of or pertaining to the moon

synonym: moony

adaptable

adj. able or willing to modify or be modified to deal with new situations

synonym: flexible, adjustable, elastic

predetermine

 to decide or determine in advance; to establish or influence beforehand

synonym:

determine in advance, predestine, decide beforehand

asynchronous

adj. not happening at the same time or speed synonym: non-synchronous, out of sync, not simultaneous

rendezvous

 a meeting or appointment that has been arranged beforehand; a gathering of people in a pre-arranged location

synonym: meeting, appointment, encounter
