## machine-learning

- n. the process through which computers change the way they perform jobs without following explicit instructions by using algorithms and statistical models to analyze and draw inferences from patterns in data
- (1) machine-learning method, (2) machine-learning processor

Many software engineers are developing applications to build **machine-learning** algorithms more quickly.

### longline

- n. a type of fishing gear consisting of a long main line with many smaller baited lines attached to it at intervals; a type of clothing or fashion style that is distinguished by long, flowing lines and loose, comfortable shapes
- (1) fishing **longline**, (2) **longline** buoy **Longline** fishing gear has been criticized for its impact on marine ecosystems.

fillet

n. a piece of meat, fish, or poultry that has been deboned and cut into a flat piece, typically with a tapered edge; a rounded or curved strip of material, often used as a decorative accent in architecture or woodworking

synonym: strip, band, ribbon

brink

 the point at which something is about to happen; the edge of a steep place

synonym: edge, verge, threshold

(1) **brink** of war, (2) on the **brink**

#### blockchain

 a system in which a growing list of payment records, called blocks, made in cryptocurrency is maintained across several computers that are securely linked (1) **blockchain** platform, (2) the scalability of **blockchain** Cryptocurrencies are only one form of implementation of **blockchain** technology.

#### decentralize

v. to move the power, control, or authority of an organization, government, or system from a single place to several smaller ones

synonym: deconcentrate, disperse, distribute

(1) **decentralize** authority, (2) **decentralize** organizational structure

We need to **decentralize** our data to recover quickly from a disaster.

### inquisitive

 adj. curious and interested in learning or finding out about things; questioning or prying into matters that are not one's concern; curious or nosy

synonym: curious, inquiring, nosy

The **inquisitive** child asked endless questions about the world around her.

### annoy

- v. to make someone angry, anxious, or irritating slightly synonym: aggravate, irritate, unsettle

# glacier

- a slowly moving mass of ice formed from snow on mountains or near the North Pole or the South Pole
   synonym: iceberg, ice floe
- (1) **glacier** retreat, (2) **glaciers** move tardily The **glaciers** of the ice age have shaped Fjord.

# recycle

v. to sort and collect things to process them and produce valuable materials that can be used again

*synonym*: reclaim, reuse, reprocess

(1) recycle the cardboard boxes, (2) recycle milk packaging

We largely **recycle** the circuit board of cell phones because they contain a lot of valuable metals.

#### granular

adj. consisting of or resembling small grains or particles;having a rough, irregular texture or appearancesynonym: gritty, grainy, sandy

#### distracted
