## trickster

synonym: swindler, cheat, deceiver

#### concoct

## devious

#### solemn

# nightfall

# trench

 a long, deep ditch made in the ground, usually parallel to a plate boundary and marking a subduction zone; a long ditch built in the ground for carrying away water

# impenetrable
