# basin

aspect

toxin

contaminate

 to make something impure, unclean, or poisonous by contact or mixture

synonym: crop, reaping, yield

# consumption

# identity

# hard-won

adj. achieved with great effort, perseverance, or sacrifice;

# tight

# climate

the weather in a particular location averaged over some long period

synonym: atmosphere, weather, environment

a cold climate, (2) effects of climate change

#### oscillate

 to swing or move back and forth like a pendulum or a wave; to fluctuate or alternate between two points or states; to hesitate or be indecisive

synonym: fluctuate, swing, vibrate

# strength

 the quality or state of being physically, or sometimes mentally, strong

plot

a secret plan or scheme to achieve a specific goal; the n. plan or main story of a literary work; (verb) to plan secretly, usually something illegal

anomaly

something or someone that deviates from what is n. expected or normal, often in a way that is difficult to explain or understand

# invasive

#### crab

 a sea creature with two large claws and a flattened back (e.g., blue crab or king crab); a sour or grumpy person who is prone to complaining or criticizing

I ordered a plate of fresh **crab** at the seafood restaurant.

# ecology

- *n.* the study of the relationships between living organisms, including humans, and their physical environment

# economy

n. the system by which a country or region produces manages, and distributes goods and services, including the money and finances involved in these activities; (of an airline) the lowest-priced, most basic option for seating in commercial travel

# frequency

 an ordered array of colors into which a light beam can be split

# severity

- n. the quality or condition of being severe, strict, or harshsynonym: harshness, rigidity, austerity

# illustrate

### modern

# bode

- v. to be a sign or indication of a particular outcome or event in the future, can be positive or negative
- synonym: portend, foretell, augur

# economical

- adj. providing a satisfactory return on the money, time, or effort; not using more money, fuel, etc. than necessarysynonym: frugal, thrifty, parsimonious

# fishery

- an area of water where fish are caught in large quantities for living; a business or practice of catching and selling fish

#### marine

- adj. relating to the sea and the creatures and plants that live there
- synonym: sea-dwelling, maritime, aquatic
