synonym: unlikely, doubtful, implausible

(1) improbable story, (2) improbable event

It is **improbable** that we will find a solution to this problem overnight.

#### determinant

 a factor, circumstance, or condition that contributes to the shaping, influencing, or determining of a particular outcome or result

*synonym*: cause, factor, element

(1) environmental **determinant**, (2) a **determinant** of crop yields

One **determinant** of success is having a positive attitude and a strong work ethic.

## compel

v. to force or require someone to do something; to exert a strong, irresistible force or pressure that makes someone act in a certain way

synonym: force, oblige, coerce

(1) **compel** a person to submission, (2) **compel** attention The strict deadlines will **compel** the team to work efficiently.

# transgression

- n. the violation of a law, duty, or moral principlesynonym: misdeed, crime, wrongdoing
- (1) inexcusable **transgression**, (2) commit a **transgression**Reporters questioned the politician about his past **transgression**.

## accuse

v. to charge or criticize someone with a crime or wrongdoing

synonym: charge, blame, criticize

(1) **accuse** his rudeness, (2) **accuse** each other The witness **accused** the defendant of committing the robbery.

blurt

v. to utter suddenly and impulsively, without prior thought or consideration; to let something slip out unintentionally

synonym: blab, spill, reveal

(1) **blurt** about the inside story, (2) **blurt** in frustration

I didn't mean to **blurt** out the answer, but it came out before I could stop.

yell

to shout in a sudden and loud way

synonym: shout, scream, cry

(1) yell for help, (2) yell as loud as we can

When I asked my father for more money, he became furious and **yelled** at me.

timid

adj. showing a lack of courage or confidence; easily frightened, shy, or hesitant in the face of danger or potential risk

synonym: shy, bashful, nervous

(1) timid tone, (2) timid handshake

The **timid** dog cowered in fear when approached by a stranger.

contradict

v. to deny the truth of a statement by stating the opposite; to be in conflict with

synonym: conflict, oppose, belie

(1) **contradict** each other, (2) **contradict** the principle The book contains numerous statements that **contradict** previous reports.

teller

 a person who works in a bank or financial institution and is responsible for processing customers' deposits, withdrawals, and other transactions, also referred to as a bank teller; a person who tells stories or relates information to an audience

synonym: cashier, bank clerk, clerk

(1) fortune- teller, (2) teller machine

The bank **teller** carefully counted the money before handing it to the customer.

comp

 short for "compensate," meaning to give goods or services to someone without asking for payment

synonym: waive, cover, provide

(1) **comp** their meal, (2) **comp** the employees with a bonus The casino **comped** her room and meals for being a high-rolling gambler.
