humble

reputation

attract

charisma

 a compelling charm or attractiveness that can inspire devotion and admiration from others, often associated with leadership or celebrity status

imperial

adj. relating to or associated with an empire or the person or country that rules it

adj. relating to or affecting the human spirit or soul as opposed to material or physical things

synonym: otherworldly, ethereal, transcendental

adviser

- (also tsar or tzar) a title of rulers or monarchs, especially n. in Russia, before the Russian Revolution of 1917; an authoritarian or powerful political leader or high-level officeholder

The **czar** of healthcare is responsible for improving the quality and accessibility of healthcare for all citizens.

devout

- adj. deeply committed to a specific religious faith or practice, often showing great reverence or piety
- synonym: pious, religious, faithful
- (1) **devout** Buddhist, (2) act in a **devout** manner The **devout** monk spent hours each day in prayer and contemplation.

mystic

adj. having spiritual powers or qualities that are beyond ordinary understanding; (noun) someone who believes in the existence of realities beyond human comprehension

czar

supernatural

adj. of or relating to existence outside the natural world; not able to be explained by natural laws

transfix

 to cause someone to become motionless or spellbound, often through shock or amazement; to pierce or impale with a pointed object

tumult

a state of great confusion, commotion, or disturbance; a loud, confused noise, as of people shouting

 The political turmoil caused great tumult in the country.

cling

v. to hold onto something tightly; to be closely attached to someone or something

synonym: stick, adhere, attach

(1) **cling** onto power, (2) **cling** tightly to the skin He **clings** to the hope that he will find a job soon.

revolution

 a large-scale attempt to overthrow the government of a country, often using violence or war;

synonym: coup, innovation, rebellion

(1) beginning of the industrial **revolution**, (2) a political **revolution**

The **revolution** by the citizen resulted in a redistribution of wealth.

struggle

v. to make a great effort to do something when it is difficult, or there are a lot of problems; to use force or violence to break away from restraint or constriction

synonym: toil, strive, compete

He could not **struggle** against temptation.

intensify

 to increase or make something increase in extent or strength

synonym: amplify, boost, strengthen

turmoil

a state of great disturbance, confusion, or uncertainty,
 often marked by intense activity or strong emotions

heir

 a person who has the legal right to receive someone's money, property, or a title from another person when that person dies

throne

 a chair or seat of state for a monarch or other high-ranking person; the position of being a king or queen

hemophilia

 a genetic disorder in which the ability of the blood to clot is severely reduced, resulting in excessive bleeding and bruising

suffer

medical

crisis

adj. relating to the treatment of illness or injuries; relating to the practice of medicine

- a time of great disagreement, confusion, or danger when problems must be resolved or critical decisions must be taken

reject

v. to refuse to accept, consider, or use something or someone

improvisation

 the act of making something up on the spot or creating or performing something without preparation

synonym: spontaneity, ad-lib, extemporization

cement

make fast as if with cement; (noun) a building material that is a powder made of a mixture of calcined limestone and clay, used with water, sand, and small stones to make concrete

synonym: adhesive, glue

(1) **cement** a close relationship, (2) **cement** blend They are eager to **cement** a positive reputation.

royal

adj. relating to or belonging to the king or queen or a member of their family

synonym: imperial, noble, aristocratic

(1) a royal palace, (2) prince royal

She is willing to give up her position in the **royal** family to marry him.

magical

adj. produced by or containing supernatural powerssynonym: enchanting, occult, supernatural

(1) magical place, (2) magical powers

When I was a child, my mother often cast **magical** spells to ease my pain whenever I was injured.

guarantee

v. to promise something will happen formally, especially that certain conditions about a product, service, or transaction would be met

synonym: assure, promise, warrant

(1) **guarantee** a high quality, (2) **guarantee** women equality We cannot **guarantee** enough raw material sources.

privilege

 a special right or advantage that only one person or group of people has, usually because they are rich and powerful in a society

synonym: benefit, authorization, advantage

(1) a breach of **privilege**, (2) **privilege** of membership In the Middle Ages, the right to hunt in the wild was the **privilege** of royalty and nobility.

prescribe

 v. (of a doctor) to advise and order the use of particular medicine or treatment for someone, especially in writing; to issue commands or orders for something

synonym: define, specify, stipulate

(1) **prescribe** a drug, (2) **prescribe** in the preceding paragraph

Federal bankruptcy laws **prescribed** the reorganization process.

aspirin

- n. a drug used to reduce pain, fever, and inflammation
- (1) prescribe **aspirin**, (2) **aspirin** sensitivity

She took a tablet of **aspirin** to soothe the fever.

worsen

- v. to become or make something worse synonym: languish, degenerate, degrade
- (1) **worsen** a relation, (2) **worsen** the food problem Unilateral import bans have **worsened** that country's terms of trade.

incident

an event or occurrence, often unexpected or unplanned;
 something that happens

synonym: event, occurrence, accident

(1) traffic **incident**, (2) security **incident**

The **incident** at the airport caused a delay in my flight.

prophecy

- a statement or prediction that something will happen in the future, typically one made by a religious leader
 synonym: prediction, foretelling, divination
- (1) **prophecy** fulfillment, (2) **prophecy** of doom

The fortune teller's **prophecy** that I would meet my soulmate next year has yet to come true.

deserted

adj. empty or abandoned; lacking inhabitants or visitors; left alone or left behind

synonym: abandoned, empty, vacated

(1) deserted city, (2) deserted island

The **deserted** street was quiet and eerie, with no signs of life.

crown

 a circular ornamental headdress, worn as a symbol of authority by a king, usually made of gold and precious stones

synonym: tiara, headdress, royalty

(1) the imperial **crown**, (2) the **crown** and throne The bishop bestowed the golden **crown** on the king.

regard

v. to think about or consider somebody or something in a specified way

synonym: consider, see, reckon

(1) **regard** him as an enemy, (2) **regard** the situation as unfortunate

Frugality and industry are still **regarded** as virtues.

amplify

- v. to enhance something, particularly sound or brightness synonym: intensify, boost, argument
- (1) **amplify** a signal, (2) **amplify** the effect You might need to **amplify** this point.

unheard

adj. not heard, listened to, or noticed; not having been brought to public attention

synonym: unknown, obscure

(1) an **unheard** story, (2) previously **unheard-of** economic development

The **unheard** melody was beautiful and touched everyone's hearts.

noble

adj. having or showing excellent personal qualities or high moral principles that people admire

synonym: dignified, aristocratic, benevolent

(1) a **noble** family, (2) **noble** gas

He is a **noble-minded** man

despise

v. to feel strong dislike or contempt for someone or something, often because of a perceived fault or failing; to have a low or unfavorable opinion of something

synonym: hate, loathe, detest

(1) despise a particular food, (2) secretly despiseI despise injustice and those who perpetrate it.

cease

v. to stop an action or event synonym: stop, end, terminate

(1) cease to exist, (2) cease drinking

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The company decided to **cease** production of the product.

scandalous

 adj. causing public outrage or offense by being morally or socially unacceptable; involving shameful or improper behavior

synonym: disgraceful, shocking, shameful

(1) **scandalous** behavior, (2) **scandalous** revelations The media exposed the **scandalous** affair between the politician and his assistant.

skeptical

adj. doubting that something is accurate or useful *synonym*: doubtful, distrustful, suspicious

(1) a **skeptical** attitude, (2) **skeptical** scientists
His religious and philosophical beliefs were utterly **skeptical**.

corruptible

adj. capable of being made to do something dishonest or immoral

synonym: bribable, dishonest, venal

(1) **corruptible** officials, (2) **corruptible** judges Bureaucracies are more **corruptible** than other systems or organizations.

convinced

adj. completely certain about something; having a strong belief or conviction in a particular religionsynonym: confident, positive, indoctrinated

(1) **convinced** of the idea, (2) **convinced** criminal The public is **convinced** that the prime minister has committed fraud.

maintain

 to continue to uphold or sustain; to keep in a particular state or condition; to assert or declare something to be true

synonym: preserve, uphold, sustain

(1) **maintain** order, (2) **maintain** good health I need to **maintain** my car regularly to prevent any major mechanical issues.

eliminate

- v. to remove or get rid of someone or something synonym: wipe out, destroy, eradicate
- (1) **eliminate** contestants, (2) **eliminate** sexual barriers We can **eliminate** this possibility from those consumptions.

sham

 something that is not as good or true as it seems to be and is intended to deceive people; a person who pretends to be something they are not

synonym: bogus, counterfeit, fraudulent

(1) a **sham** battle, (2) turn out to be all **sham** The data he prepared was completely **sham**.

conviction

 a strong belief or opinion, especially one that is based on principles or evidence; (criminal law) a final judgment of guilty in a criminal case and the punishment that is imposed

synonym: belief, certainty, faith

(1) moral **conviction**, (2) **conviction** for murder She spoke with **conviction** about the importance of education.

plot

 a secret plan or scheme to achieve a specific goal; the plan or main story of a literary work; (verb) to plan secretly, usually something illegal

synonym: scheme, plan, design

(1) plot twist, (2) plot a revolution

The **plot** of the novel centers around a group of friends who uncover a conspiracy to control the world's water supply.

assassination

n. the act of killing a public figure, especially a political leader, usually for political or religious motives

synonym: murder, killing, execution

(1) failed **assassination** attempt, (2) **assassination** plot The **assassination** of the president sent shockwaves through the nation.

mysterious

adj. difficult to understand, explain, or identify; having an aura of secrecy, intrigue, or puzzlement

synonym: enigmatic, cryptic, puzzling

(1) mysterious object, (2) mysterious stranger

The **mysterious** disappearance of the ship remains unsolved.

unfold

 to open up or spread out something that is folded or rolled up; to reveal or disclose something that was previously hidden or unknown

synonym: open, spread out, expose

(1) **unfold** the story, (2) **unfold** the stroller

The mystery **unfolded** as the detectives gathered more clues.

memoir

 a historical account or biography written from the writer's knowledge of famous people, places, or events

synonym: bio, biography

(1) family **memoir**, (2) publish a **memoir**

He wrote his **memoirs** while awaiting trial.

pastry

 a baked food made of flour, fat, water, and sometimes eggs, sugar, and other ingredients, used as a base or casing for sweet or savory dishes

synonym: bakery, baked goods, sweet treats

(1) pastry chef, (2) fruit pastry

The chef's specialty is a savory **pastry** with spinach and feta cheese.

cyanide

n. a highly toxic compound consisting of a carbon atom triple-bonded to a nitrogen atom, most often encountered as hydrogen cyanide or one of its salts, often used in industrial processes, insecticides, and as a lethal poison

synonym: nitrile, poison, toxin

(1) cyanide poisoning, (2) hydrogen cyanide

The use of cyanide as a chemical weapon is prohibited

under international law.

unbeknownst

adv. without the knowledge or awareness of someone;without someone's knowledge or participationsynonym: secretly, covertly

conspirator

- a person who is involved in a conspiracy (= a secret agreement between two or more people to perform something), especially to commit a crime or an illegal act
 synonym: accomplice, confederate, partner in crime
- (1) unmask a **conspirator**, (2) co-**conspirator**The police arrested several **conspirators** involved in the plot to overthrow the government.

substitute

 a person or thing acting or serving instead of another one; (verb) to act as a something or someone instead of another one

synonym: alternate, replacement, reserve

substitute coffee, (2) substitute teacher
 substitute skim milk for regular milk because we are on a strict diet.

poison

n. a substance that can cause illness, injury, or death when ingested, inhaled, or absorbed through the skin; something harmful, malicious, or toxic; the act of damaging or ruining a relationship; (verb) to introduce a substance into something or someone harmful and potentially deadly

synonym: toxin, venom, pollutant

poison ivy, (2) poison bilateral relations
 The plant's leaves contain a deadly poison that can cause hallucinations and seizures.

harmless

adj. not able or not likely to cause damage or harm synonym: benign, innocuous, inoffensive

(1) **harmless** in most people, (2) **harmless** substances Most people thought of him as a **harmless** eccentric.

substance

 n. the real physical material of which a thing or person consist; the most important or main part of some idea or experience; an illegal drug

synonym: essence, core, material

(1) an explosive **substance**, (2) **substance** abuse problem The **substance** of the argument was well-presented.

shock

 a strong feeling or physical reaction to a sudden and unexpected event or experience, especially something unpleasant

synonym: amazement, surprise, stunner

(1) death from shock, (2) shock-resistantHe got an electric shock at work.

despair

 the feeling that there is no hope and you cannot do anything to improve a difficult situation

synonym: dismay, anguish, misery

despair at the future, (2) untold despair
 His friend's death drove him to despair.

blank

adj. without any writing or printing; empty or devoid of ideas, information, or meaning; unable to remember or recall information

synonym: empty, void, barren

(1) blank expression, (2) blank paper

The computer screen displayed nothing but a **blank** white screen

recover

- v. to return to a former condition, health, mind, or strength synonym: come back, convalesce, heal

punch

v. to strike someone or something with one's fist; to make a hole in something

synonym: hit, strike, slap
