unsurprising

adj. not surprising, and what was expected; able to be predicted

synonym: predictable, expected, foreseeable

(1) **unsurprising** success, (2) **unsurprising** result The **unsurprising** outcome of the election was a victory for the incumbent candidate.

arid

 adj. lacking in moisture or rainfall; dry and barren; lacking in interest, life, or vitality

synonym: dry, parched, barren

(1) arid terrain, (2) semi- arid zone

The desert is known for its **arid** climate and lack of rainfall.

decommission

 to take a machine, building, weapon, or other equipment out of use or service, often permanently or due to age or disrepair

synonym: retire, dismantle, disable

(1) **decommission** the dam, (2) **decommission** ship After years of protests from environmental activists, the government decided to **decommission** the nuclear power plant.

hydroponic

adj. relating to the cultivation of plants in nutrient-rich water instead of soil, often using specialized equipment or systems to optimize growth and production

synonym: soilless, aquaponic, aquacultural

aeroponic

adj. relating to a technique of growing plants without soil by suspending the roots in a mist or aerosol of nutrients

synonym: aerospace, hydroponic, mist

urethane

 a synthetic organic compound used as a monomer to manufacture flexible and rigid polyurethane foams, adhesives, and coatings

synonym: ethyl carbamate

The car's bumper was coated with a **urethane** layer for extra protection.

sponge

- a soft material with many microscopic pores that can absorb a large amount of liquid and is used for washing and cleaning

biodegrade

- to decay naturally by microorganisms, such as bacteria and fungi

peat

- n. a type of soil made up of partially decayed organic matter (usually moss) that accumulates in wetlands or bogs, often used as fuel for heat and cooking in some regions of the world

moss

perlite

pellet
