feverish

argument

well-being

dissertation

neon

n. a chemical element of atomic number 10 that is a gas with no smell or color, does not react with other chemicals, and shines with a bright light when electricity is passed through it

protest

a strong expression of disagreement, disapproval, or opposition

nativism

n. a political ideology or belief system that prioritizes the interests and rights of people considered native or indigenous to a particular country or region, often involving advocation for policies that restrict immigration or limit the rights of non-native residents and associated with fears of cultural or economic displacement

frame

resonance

remarkable

assume

reinforce

v. to strengthen or support something, especially by adding another material to it; to make emotion, idea, etc.

volume

 the amount of space occupied by an object or substance; the magnitude of sound

intense

rescue

uplift

tolerate

tide

 the cyclical rise and fall of sea level caused by the moon's gravitational pull

overthrow

v. to defeat or remove a leader or a government from a position of power by force

n. a limitation or constraint placed on something, or the act of limiting or constraining something




