The ship was **submerged** in the ocean for many years before it was finally discovered.

gulp

v. to swallow quickly and forcefully; to take in a large amount of air or liquid quickly and audibly because of surprise, fear, or excitement

synonym: swallow, chug, gulp down

(1) gulp water, (2) gulp air

He had to **gulp** down his coffee before rushing to work.

mettle

 a person's ability to cope with difficult situations or face adversity with courage, resilience, and determination; one's character or temperament

synonym: courage, spirit, fortitude

(1) demonstrate your **mettle**, (2) **mettle** for challenges Despite her injury, the athlete's true **mettle** was revealed when she won the gold medal.

imaginative

adj. having or showing new and creative ideas synonym: creative, innovative, inventive

(1) capable of **imaginative** creation, (2) **imaginative** as a child

She is a hard worker but not very **imaginative**.

dedicate

 to give all of your energy, time, etc., entirely to a specific person, activity, or cause; to set apart for a particular purpose or use

synonym: consecrate, devote, commit

(1) **dedicate** a few hours, (2) **dedicate** a chapter to the subject

He **dedicated** his life to helping others.

# disappoint

v. to fail to meet someone or their hopes or expectations; to make someone feel sad

synonym: sadden, dismay, frustrate

(1) **disappoint** the audience, (2) don't **disappoint** me She worked very hard not to **disappoint** her boss's expectations.

#### **swimsuit**

- n. a piece of clothing worn for swimmingsynonym: bathing suit, swimwear, bathers

# goggle

v. to look at someone or something with amazement; to look stupidly; (noun, plural) tight-fitting spectacles that are worn to prevent particulates, water, or chemicals from striking the eyes

synonym: gaze, gawk, gape

(1) **goggle** his eyes, (2) infrared **goggles**The software company bought the VR **goggles**manufacturer.

# unwavering

- adj. not changing or becoming weaker in any way; remaining steadily fixed or resolute in purpose or commitmentsynonym: steadfast, resolute, firm
- (1) **unwavering** commitment, (2) **unwavering** confidence She showed **unwavering** loyalty to her friend through thick and thin.

# paralyze

v. to cause a person or part of the body to become unable to move or feel

synonym: immobilize, disable, numb

(1) paralyze a city, (2) paralyze a person

The venom from the snake bite **paralyzed** his arm.

# penguin

a flightless sea bird that is found in the Southern
Hemisphere and is known for its distinctive black and
white coloring and its upright, waddling gait

(1) Adelie **penguin**, (2) **penguin** habitat

We took a boat tour to witness the magnificent **penguin** colony along the rugged coastline.

# jellyfish

 a marine creature with a soft, jelly-like body and tentacles for stinging

synonym: medusa, sea nettle, moon jelly

(1) spineless jellyfish, (2) jellyfish sting

The beach was filled with hundreds of **jellyfish**, so swimming was not recommended.

#### distract

v. to draw someone's attention away from what they are trying to do

synonym: divert, preoccupy, confuse

#### chafe

v. to rub or graze against something, causing irritation, soreness, or annoyance; to become irritated or annoyed due to frustration or impatience

synonym: irritate, rub, abrade

(1) **chafed** against my shoulders, (2) **chafe** under pressure The new shoes are starting to **chafe** my feet after walking for hours.

# quitter

 a person who gives up easily or does not have the determination to finish what they have started

synonym: coward, deserter, surrender

(1) easy quitter, (2) serial quitter

He was labeled as a **quitter** after he abandoned the project halfway.

#### unmotivated

adj. lacking in drive or ambition; not motivated; lacking enthusiasm or interest in something

synonym: uninspired, lazy, lethargic

(1) unmotivated to learn, (2) feel unmotivated

The company's **unmotivated** employee was let go due to a lack of productivity.

# depress

v. to make someone feel sad, low in spirits, or without hope; to make markets, businesses, etc., less active

synonym: sadden, discourage, deflate

#### chore

 a routine or tedious task, often related to household or manual labor

synonym: task, duty, job

Cleaning the house is a **chore** that only some enjoy.

### pun

 a humorous play on words or use of words that sound similar but have different meanings, often for a comedic effect; a form of wordplay

synonym: joke, quip, wordplay

(1) witty **pun**, (2) silly **pun** 

The comedian's **pun** had the audience laughing out loud.

#### shiver

 to shake or quiver with cold, fear, or excitement; to tremble or vibrate rapidly

synonym: quiver, tremble, shake

(1) **shiver** with delight, (2) **shiver** in fear

I **shiver** in the cold winter air as I wait for the train.

#### posit

v. to suggest or accept something as fact or as a basis for argument or consideration

synonym: assert, declare, assume

(1) **posit** the existence of life after death, (2) **posit** the premise

We should **posit** several hypotheses to discuss the matter.

orca

 a species of large marine mammal, also known as the killer whale, found in Arctic and temperate waters worldwide, known for their intelligence, social behavior, and hunting prowess

synonym: killer whale, sea wolf
