determinant

 a factor, circumstance, or condition that contributes to the shaping, influencing, or determining of a particular outcome or result

synonym: cause, factor, element

One **determinant** of success is having a positive attitude and a strong work ethic.

imaginable

adj. capable of being imagined

synonym: conceivable, plausible, possible

pollute

synonym: contaminate, corrupt, degrade

stimming

a behavior often exhibited by individuals on the autism spectrum characterized by repetitive bodily movements or sounds, such as hand flapping or rocking, often used as a form of self-regulation or sensory stimulation

synonym: self-stimulation, repetitive behaviors

(1) autistic **stimming**, (2) **stimming** therapy

Autistic children may engage in **stimming** behaviors, such as rocking or hand flapping, to self-regulate.

pathogen

 a bacterium, virus, or other microorganism that causes disease

synonym: germ, microbe, bacterium

transistor

a semiconductor device that can be used to amplify or switch electronic signals and power which is an essential component in modern electronics

medicinal
