### discovery

#### mention

- v. to speak or write about something or someone briefly synonym: reference, allude, cite

# pornography

 materials such as films, photographs, or written descriptions that depict or describe sexual activity graphically or explicitly, often intended to be sexually

### arousing

synonym: obscenity, indecency, smut

(1) pornography addiction, (2) violent pornography The rise of digital technology has made the sharing of pornography easier than ever before.

#### attend

- to be present at an event, to go to a place *synonym*: go, be present, accompany
- (1) **attend** a meeting, (2) **attend** service We must **attend** to this matter.

### inspire

- to make somebody fill with the desire, confidence, or enthusiasm, especially to do something creative *synonym*: boost, encourage, enlighten
- (1) inspire a feeling of curiosity, (2) inspire him to write a novel

The unique style of this martial arts **inspired** many action film producers.

### exciting

adj. causing a lot of interest or excitement synonym: exhilarating, stimulating, thrilling

(1) **exciting** football player, (2) **exciting** news The findings of the experiment were both **exciting** and unexpected.

glaze

to cover or coat with a thin layer of film, particularly a shiny or glossy layer, such as a layer of protective material on ceramics or a top coat of paint on a surface; to apply a thin, glossy coating to food, often using a sauce or syrup

synonym: coat, enamel, varnish

shiny coating.

(1) glaze a window, (2) glaze over eyes The baker used a brush to **glaze** the donuts with a sweet, tune

 a musical composition or set of musical notes that are played or sung; (verb) to adjust or set something to a specific condition or standard

synonym: melody, harmony, (verb) adjust

outfit

 a set of clothing worn together, typically for a particular occasion or activity; any cohesive unit such as a company, military, etc.

synonym: ensemble, set, suit

explode

v. to burst or break open violently and noisily; to cause something to burst or break open

laughter

n. the act or sound of laughing

synonym: laugh, chuckle, giggle

hoot

to make the sound of a hoot or loud, raucous laugh; to express disapproval or scorn; (noun) the sound made by an owl or a similar bird, usually a low-pitched, repetitive "hoo" or "whoo" sound

*synonym*: jeer, taunt

The audience **hooted** with laughter at the comedian's jokes.

violent

adj. involving or caused by physical force or aggression against someone or something

synonym: aggressive, intense, turbulent

(1) victim of a **violent** crime, (2) **violent** incident The protesters became **violent** when the police tried to disperse them.

#### intractable

adj. difficult to manage or control; stubborn or obstinate synonym: obstinate, stubborn, unyielding

(1) **intractable** pain, (2) **intractable** situation The **intractable** problem defied a solution.

#### disease

 a disorder or illness that affects the body or mind, often characterized by specific symptoms or abnormal functioning of organs or systems

synonym: illness, ailment, affliction

(1) **disease** prevention, (2) **disease** control

The doctor diagnosed him with a rare **disease** that had no known cure.

### prevention

 the action, process, or strategy of stopping something undesirable or harmful from happening; the act of preventing, interfering, or hindering unwanted events or outcomes

*synonym*: precaution, hindrance, obstruction

(1) **prevention** of crime, (2) **prevention** strategy

The company will need to invest in fire **prevention** equipment to ensure the safety of its employees.

#### demonstrate

 to display something or give an exhibition to an interested audience

synonym: show, illustrate, display

(1) **demonstrate** a difference, (2) **demonstrate** mastery How can you **demonstrate** that the earth is a sphere?

#### abuse

- n. the use of something in an incorrect or harmful mannersynonym: misuse, misconduct, vilification
- (1) the problem of drug **abuse**, (2) victim of sexual **abuse** Our company has an audit team that monitors directors for

### abuse of authority.

### prevalent

adj. existing very commonly in a particular area or in a specific time

synonym: common, ubiquitous, rampant

(1) prevalent in Japan, (2) prevalent belief

This virus is **prevalent** in many tropical nations.

### bully

 a person who uses strength or power to harm or intimidate those who are weaker; (verb) to intimidate, harass, or mistreat someone weaker or less powerful

synonym: tormentor, intimidator, aggressor

The schoolyard **bully** terrorized the other children and made their lives miserable.

### property

- n. a thing or things that belong to someonesynonym: belongings, possessions, equity

*n*. the act of killing yourself intentionally

### vape

v. to inhale and exhale the vapor (= the gaseous state of a substance) produced by an electronic cigarette or similar device; to smoke a vapor; (noun) the act or practice of inhaling and exhaling vapor produced by an electronic cigarette

synonym: smoke, puff, inhale

(1) vape pen, (2) vape smokes

#### elusive

adj. difficult to find, define, achieve, or remember synonym: mysterious, ambiguous, inapproachable

#### hunt

novel

v. to go after and try to catch wild animals to kill them for food, sport, or profit

synonym: chase, pursuit, quest

- an extended fictional work in prose; usually in the form of a story; (adjective) original and of a kind not seen before

### unexpected

adj. not anticipated or regarded as likely to happen synonym: surprising, unanticipated, incredible

### emerging

adj. starting to exist, mature, or become well-known synonym: arising, occurring, state-of-the-art

#### threaten

 to utter intentions of injury or punishment against someone

*synonym*: endanger, terrorize, intimidate

(1) **threaten** a healthy relationship, (2) **threaten** national security

### perpetrator

- n. a person who carries out a harmful or illegal act, particularly one that involves violence or deceptionsynonym: culprit, wrongdoer, offender
- (1) **perpetrator** identity, (2) culprit **perpetrator**

The police have not yet caught the **perpetrator** of the crime.

#### blame

- v. to think or say that someone or something did something wrong or is responsible for something badsynonym: condemn, rebuke, find fault with

### percentage

 the number, amount, or rate of something, which is usually the amount per hundred

synonym: rate, ratio, portion

#### coincidence

- n. an occasion when two or more similar things happen at the same time by chance, in a surprising waysynonym: co-occurrence, concurrency, accident
- (1) the **coincidence** of an opinion, (2) by a strange

coincidence

It was a pure coincidence that we met her in the library.

### unhealthy

adj. not conducive to good health; detrimental to physical or mental well-being

synonym: unwholesome, detrimental, insalubrious

(1) unhealthy diet, (2) unhealthy habit

Sitting for long hours in front of the computer is considered **unhealthy**.

#### relation

 the way two persons or groups of people feel and act toward one another

synonym: association, linkage, connection

(1) **relation** between cause and effect, (2) **relation** of inclusion

The industrial **relations** laws were passed with little to no alteration.

### investigate

v. to conduct a systematic or formal inquiry to identify and evaluate the facts of a crime, problem, statement, etc. to establish the truth

synonym: examine, analyze, look into

(1) **investigate** the matter, (2) **investigate** a data leak The committee **investigated** several apparent inconsistencies.

peer

- n. a person who has the same age, status, or abilitysynonym: fellow, associate, counterpart
- (1) **peer** group, (2) **peer** review

Among young people, peer pressure can be pretty influential.

#### conduct

- v. to organize and carry out a particular activitysynonym: behave, lead, carry on
- (1) **conduct** a background check, (2) **conduct** research Police will **conduct** random breath testing for drunk driving.

### explicit

adj. stated clearly and in detail, leaving no room for confusion or doubt

synonym: clear, unambiguous, unequivocal

(1) **explicit** content, (2) **explicit** instructions

The movie had an **explicit** sex scene that some viewers might find offensive.

# apparently

adv. based on what you have heard or readsynonym: evidently, obviously, supposedly

(1) apparently simple, (2) apparently unrelated

The police **apparently** believed this explanation was plausible.

#### fulfill

v. to meet the requirements or expectations; to achieve or realize

*synonym*: satisfy, complete, accomplish

(1) **fulfill** a contract, (2) **fulfill** a lifetime dream It was the first time for her, but she **fulfilled** the role of Priest.

#### involve

v. to include or affect someone or something as a necessary part of something else

synonym: implicate, include, engage

(1) **involve** a lot of paperwork, (2) **involve** a high degree of risk

The investigation **involves** several government agencies and is expected to take several months.

#### enthusiastic

- adj. having or showing great excitement, interest, or eagerness; energetic or passionate about somethingsynonym: ardent, fervent, crazy
- (1) **enthusiastic** football fan, (2) **enthusiastic** audience She was **enthusiastic** about starting her new job.

#### consent

*n.* permission or agreement to do something, especially given by somebody in authority

synonym: approval, authorization, concession

(1) **consent** for surgery, (2) give silent **consent**She gave her **consent** to the company's proposal.

### inclined

- adj. having a tendency or preference for something; likely or disposed to think, feel, or behave in a certain waysynonym: disposed, prone, likely
- (1) **inclined** to think, (2) **inclined** angle I am **inclined** to believe that she is telling the truth.

### soon-to-be

adj. used to describe someone or something that will soon become something else or will soon be in a different

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### state or position

synonym: upcoming, imminent, future

(1) **soon-to-be** parents, (2) **soon-to-be** graduates

The **soon-to-be** bride was busy planning all the details of her upcoming wedding.

#### denounce

 to speak out against; to strongly criticize something or someone

synonym: condemn, disapprove, criticize

(1) **denounce** a statement, (2) **denounce** a heresy He **denounced** the actions of the corrupt official.

#### staunch

adj. firmly loyal and devoted, unyielding or resolute synonym: strong, loyal, firm

(1) **staunch** conviction, (2) **staunch** opponent

She was a **staunch** supporter of the cause, always willing to speak out for her beliefs.

#### defend

v. to protect someone or something from attack, criticism, danger, etc.

*synonym*: protect, guard, support

(1) **defend** my country, (2) **defend** against a threat International law allows each nation to **defend** itself when its rights and interests are illegally violated.

### scholarly

adj. relating to or characteristic of academic study synonym: academic, learned, erudite

(1) **scholarly** article, (2) **scholarly** attainment

The **scholarly** journal published articles on various academic subjects.

### exploration

 the activity of searching and finding out about something through a place

synonym: inquiry, quest, investigation

(1) future of space **exploration**, (2) an Arctic **exploration** He called for a careful **exploration** of the consequences.

### genuine

adj. real and exactly; not pretended; sincerely felt or expressed

synonym: actual, honest, unpretending

(1) a **genuine** article, (2) show **genuine** regret Is this painting **genuine** or forged?

### misogyny

 a dislike of, contempt for, or ingrained prejudice against women

synonym: sexism, chauvinism

(1) **misogyny** issue, (2) the **misogyny** of medieval Christianity

His speech was filled with **misogyny** and caused widespread outrage.

### empower

- v. to give someone the power or authority to do something synonym: authorize, endow, entitle
- (1) **empower** my life, (2) **empower** the secretary to do the same

The company **empowered** employees to buy low-price items without approval to achieve efficient purchasing.

### singular

- n. being only one of its kind; unique
- synonym: unique, sole, individual
- (1) singular purpose, (2) singular goal

The **singular** beauty of the night sky never ceases to amaze him.

# emerge

v. to move out of or away from something and become visible

synonym: arise, occur, appear

(1) **emerge** as a butterfly, (2) **emerge** from poverty During colonial eras, new migratory patterns **emerged**.

# longitudinal

adj. relating to or measuring along the length of an object or course or longitude (= the angular distance between a point on any meridian and the prime meridian at Greenwich); running downwards rather than across

synonym: axial, lengthwise

(1) longitudinal axes, (2) longitudinal data

The researchers conducted a **longitudinal** study on the effects of the new medication.

### subsequent

adj. happening or occurring later or after something elsesynonym: later, following, ensuing

(1) over **subsequent** months, (2) reduce **subsequent** mortality

In the **subsequent** meeting, the team discussed ways to improve productivity.

### perpetrate

v. to commit or carry out a harmful or illegal act, particularly one that involves violence or deception; to be responsible for the creation or continuation of a negative situation

synonym: commit, perform, execute

(1) **perpetrate** harassment, (2) **perpetrate** a fraud The criminal decided to **perpetrate** another robbery despite his previous arrest.

#### definitive

adj. serving to provide a final solution or to end a situation; final and not able to be changed

synonym: conclusive, final, decisive

(1) definitive answer, (2) a definitive edition

The study provided **definitive** proof of the effectiveness of the new drug.

#### causal

adj. relating to or indicating a cause or the relationship between causes and effects; resulting from a cause

synonym: causative, contributory, connected

(1) causal chain, (2) causal effect

The study aimed to establish a **causal** relationship between smoking and lung cancer.

#### conclude

v. to come to an end or close; to reach a judgment or opinion by reasoning

synonym: complete, finish, decide

(1) **conclude** a meeting, (2) **conclude** that he is healthy We **concluded** a cease-fire.

#### adolescent

 a young person who is in the process of developing from a child into an adult

synonym: teen, preadult, youth

(1) **adolescent** girl, (2) pre- **adolescent** children Timely education about birth control might help reduce **adolescent** pregnancies.

#### associate

v. to mentally connect someone or something with someone or something else

synonym: tie in, link, consociate

(1) **associate** alcohol with gambling, (2) **associate** with people widely

The majority of consumers associate this brand with quality.

### negative

adj. having the quality of something bad or harmful; expressing refusal

synonym: minus, adverse, pessimistic

(1) have a **negative** effect, (2) a **negative** number The movie has received almost universally **negative** criticism.

#### outcome

*n.* the result or effect of an action, event, etc.

synonym: result, consequence, effect

(1) improved student **outcomes**, (2) a desirable **outcome**They awaited news of the **outcome** of the election.

#### tremendous

adj. very great in degree or extent or amount or impact; extremely good

synonym: enormous, giant, immense

(1) **tremendous** amount, (2) **tremendous** popularity

We had a **tremendous** time yesterday.

### complicated

adj. involving a lot of different things or parts in a way that is difficult to understand or analyze

synonym: complex, convoluted, intricate

(1) a **complicated** process, (2) become increasingly **complicated** 

He did **complicated** pen-and-ink drawings in just a few days.

#### industrious

adj. hardworking, diligent, and persistent in effort synonym: diligent, hardworking, assiduous

(1) industrious worker, (2) industrious student

He was known to be very **industrious** and would often work late into the night.

### capitalize

v. to write a whole letter or the first letter of the alphabet as a capital; to provide a company, etc. with the money; to take the chance to gain advantage from something

synonym: bankroll, finance, endow

(1) **capitalize** on an interest, (2) **capitalize** the 1st letter of a word

You must **capitalize** on your full of opportunities to become a professor.

#### fascination

*n.* the state of being intensely interested in someone or something, or a powerful attraction

synonym: allure, attraction, charm

(1) rapt in **fascination**, (2) the **fascination** with classical music

I looked at the painting in fascination.

#### chock-full

adj. completely filled or crowded with something; having no space or room for additional things

synonym: full, crowded, jam-packed

(1) **chock-full** schedule, (2) **chock-full** of flavor

The picnic basket was chock-full of sandwiches, fruit, and

drinks.

gag

ν. to prevent or restrict speech or expression, often through force or intimidation; to bind or cover the mouth to prevent speech; to cause someone to retch or choke; (noun) a device that is placed over someone's mouth to prevent them from speaking or making noise; an order that prohibits a person or group from discussing a particular topic or sharing certain information with others

synonym: muzzle, silence, suppress

(1) gag order, (2) gag a newspaper

The prisoner was **gagged** to prevent him from shouting for help.

slap

spit

 to strike something or someone with an open palm or flat object, producing a sharp sound or sensation; to place something firmly, suddenly, or unexpectedly

synonym: smack, hit, whack

- (1) **slap** on the back, (2) **slap** a heavy fine The politician tried to **slap** down the rumors about his personal life.
- v. to eject saliva or other liquid from the mouth synonym: expectorate, saliva, spew
- spit a bullet, (2) spit a mouthful of saliva
   She tried to spit out the gum that she had been chewing.

ejaculation

 a sudden and forceful expulsion of something from the body, especially of semen, during sexual activity; a sudden and forceful expression of emotion or sound, similar to a cry

synonym: climax, orgasm, cry

(1) **ejaculation** disorder, (2) inhibited **ejaculation**Diabetes and multiple sclerosis are among the medical conditions that can cause retrograde **ejaculation**.

### degrade

v. to make something worse, especially in quality; to show or treat someone in a way that makes them seem no value and do not have the respect or reasonable opinion of others

*synonym*: demean, disgrace, impair

(1) **degrade** his public image, (2) **degrade** environmental quality

You should not **degrade** yourself by allowing them to use you.

rap

 a type of music characterized by a strong, repetitive beat and lyrics that often focus on social and political issues; a reproach for some lapse or misdeed

*synonym*: hip-hop, emceeing, MCing

(1) rap music, (2) get a rap

The new **rap** album is getting a lot of attention.

critic

 someone who expresses opinions about the quality of books, music, etc.

synonym: pundit, analyst, attacker

(1) art critic, (2) severe critic

Advocates for legal reform hear less harsh words from their **critics**.

pretext

 a false reason or excuse that is given to justify an action or decision, often used to hide one's true motives or intentions

*synonym*: excuse, pretense, cover-up

(1) flimsy **pretext**, (2) under the **pretext** of illness
He used the **pretext** of going to the gym to sneak out of work early.

discriminating

adj. having or showing the ability to judge or discern, typically by distinguishing differences or making careful and considered choices; selective in a discerning way; showing refined taste or awareness of quality

synonym: selective, critical, discerning

(1) discriminating judgment, (2) discriminating eye

The restaurant has **discriminating** tastes when selecting the best ingredients for their dishes.

gay

adj. homosexual; happy, carefreesynonym: cheerful, lively, joyful

(1) gay couple, (2) gay rights

The **gay** pride parade was a celebration of diversity and acceptance.

**lesbian** 

 a woman who is attracted romantically and sexually to other women

synonym: gay woman, female homosexual, tribade

(1) **lesbian** love, (2) **lesbian** relationship

The **lesbian** couple was denied the right to marry due to the conservative laws in their state.

kink

 a tight curl, twist or bend in an object, particularly in a piece of wire, hose, or tubing; a peculiar or eccentric liking or habit

synonym: bend, twist, curl

(1) kink in the neck, (2) sexual kink

The **kink** in the hose was preventing water from flowing correctly.

fetish

 an intense or irrational devotion or interest in something, often sexual one; an object or item that is believed to have magical or spiritual powers or significance

synonym: obsession, fixation, mania

(1) fetish object, (2) sexual fetish

She had a **fetish** for cleanliness and would spend hours cleaning her house.

overboard

adv. to an extreme or excessive degree; to a point where something becomes unreasonable or irrational

synonym: recklessly, excessively

(1) fell overboard, (2) dumped overboard

He went **overboard** with his criticism, and it hurt her feelings.

indict

v. to formally charge or accuse someone of a crime, based on the decision of a grand jury or other legal authority; to bring a legal case against someone, typically to prosecute and punish them

synonym: accuse, charge, prosecute

(1) indict a suspect, (2) indict him of injuries

The FBI worked tirelessly to gather enough evidence to **indict** the corrupt politician.

scary

adj. causing fear or fright; frightening; intimidating

synonym: terrifying, frightening, alarming

(1) scary dream, (2) scary story

The horror movie was so **scary** that I couldn't watch it alone.

horrify

v. to shock or disgust greatly

synonym: shock, dismay, terrify

(1) horrify audience, (2) horrify victims

The series of terrorist attacks horrify the entire nation.

claim

v. to assert that something is true; to demand or request something as one's own; to lay legal or moral right to something; (noun) a demand or assertion of a right or something that one believes to be true

synonym: assert, declare, maintain

(1) claim responsibility, (2) false claim

He wants to **claim** ownership of the abandoned property.

brain

 the organ inside the head that is responsible for one's movement, thought, memory, and feeling

*synonym*: intellect, mind, encephalon

(1) basic **brain** function, (2) permanent **brain** damage X-rays revealed a small tumor in his **brain**.

#### mainstream

*n.* the ideas, opinions, beliefs, etc., that are considered normal or accepted by most people

synonym: prevailing, average, common

(1) join the **mainstream**, (2) **mainstream** political beliefs His thinking is **mainstream** in the country's culture.

#### intent

 a strong determination or attention to do or achieve something; (adjective) having a strong determination to do or achieve something

synonym: purpose, aim, goal

(1) the **intent** of a question, (2) **intent** gaze

The designer's **intent** was to create a minimalist aesthetic for the interior of the building.

### instantly

adv. immediately

synonym: immediately, right away, directly

(1) **instantly** cope with, (2) be killed **instantly** I remembered that person **instantly** and never forgot.

### poison

n. a substance that can cause illness, injury, or death when ingested, inhaled, or absorbed through the skin; something harmful, malicious, or toxic; the act of damaging or ruining a relationship; (verb) to introduce a substance into something or someone harmful and potentially deadly

synonym: toxin, venom, pollutant

(1) **poison** ivy, (2) **poison** bilateral relations

The plant's leaves contain a deadly **poison** that can cause hallucinations and seizures.

# compulsive

adj. relating to or involving an irresistible urge to do something repeatedly or excessively, often in a way that is harmful or detrimental to one's well-being or relationships

synonym: compelling, obsessive, uncontrollable

compulsive gambling, (2) compulsive behavior
 He had a compulsive need to check the stove was turned off

every time he left the house.

### ideology

 a set of beliefs or philosophies that an economic or political system is based on

synonym: credo, doctrine, principles

(1) the **ideology** of the left, (2) political **ideology**Racial equality is an integral part of democratic **ideology**.

### ubiquitous

adj. being or existing everywhere at oncesynonym: universal, omnipresent, everywhere

(1) **ubiquitous** computing, (2) **ubiquitous** across ecosystems

Sugar is **ubiquitous** in food.

### guarantee

v. to promise something will happen formally, especially that certain conditions about a product, service, or transaction would be met

synonym: assure, promise, warrant

(1) **guarantee** a high quality, (2) **guarantee** women equality We cannot **guarantee** enough raw material sources.

### smartphone

- a mobile phone that functions as a computer and connects to the Internet
- (1) **smartphone** app developer, (2) **smartphone** addict Internet traffic volumes have increased significantly with the advent of **smartphones**.

# definitely

adv. without any question and beyond doubt; clearly synonym: absolutely, certainly, indeed

(1) **definitely** become a problem, (2) say **definitely** The paper is **definitely** worth reading thoroughly.

#### nation

 a large organized community of people living in a particular country or region and having a particular culture

synonym: country, state, sovereign entity
