#### disrespect

an expression of lack of regard or contempt for someone or something

*synonym*: impoliteness, rudeness, insult

#### sibling

a brother or sister; member of a family born to the same parents

synonym: brother, sister, relative

## jeopardize

to put something at risk or in danger; to threaten or endanger something or someone

synonym: endanger, imperil, risk

(1) jeopardize safety, (2) jeopardize reputation His reckless behavior could jeopardize his chances of getting hired for the job.

## boycott

to refuse to buy, use, or patronize a particular product or service as a form of protest or to bring about change; (noun) a deliberate and organized refusal to buy or use

a product, service, or organization as a form of protest or to apply pressure for change

synonym: protest, abstain, avoid

(1) **boycott** campaign, (2) **boycott** the discussion Many people have decided to **boycott** the company due to their unethical practices.

## unjust

adj. not fair or equitable; lacking in justice or impartiality; morally unacceptable or wrong

synonym: unfair, inequitable

(1) unjust verdict, (2) unjust accusation

The ruling was considered **unjust** by many people in the community.

## opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

*synonym*: suitable, timely, practical

(1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

#### outspoken

adj. frank and candid in speech or expression; not afraid to speak one's mind or voice one's opinions, even if unpopular or controversial

synonym: vocal, blunt, frank

(1) outspoken critic, (2) outspoken journalist

She was known for being outspoken and speaking her mind.

#### unaffected

adj. not influenced or emotionally impacted by external factors or events; calm, composed, and emotionally stable

synonym: untouched, unaffected, unaltered

(1) **unaffected** by weather, (2) emotionally **unaffected**Despite the chaos around her, she remained **unaffected** and focused.

#### authoritarian

adj. characterized by strict, absolute control and obedience to authority or rules; dictatorial and lacking in personal

## freedoms or individual rights

synonym: dictatorial, totalitarian, despotic

(1) **authoritarian** practice, (2) **authoritarian** government The **authoritarian** leadership style left no room for dissent or alternative opinions.

#### worldview

 a particular philosophy or cognitive orientation of life or conception of the world

synonym: perspective, position, viewpoint

(1) mainstream **worldview**, (2) the **worldview** of the ancient civilization

The war between the two countries was also a battle between competing **worldviews**.

# aspiration

 a strong desire to achieve something; the action or process of drawing breath

synonym: ambition, inhalation, intake

(1) no **aspiration** for fame, (2) **aspiration** into the lungs He has an **aspiration** to become a doctor.

#### corruptible

adj. capable of being made to do something dishonest or immoral

synonym: bribable, dishonest, venal

(1) **corruptible** officials, (2) **corruptible** judges
Bureaucracies are more **corruptible** than other systems or organizations.
