## atrocity

- n. brutal act; an extremely wicked or cruel actsynonym: evil, horror, iniquity
- commit atrocity, (2) cold-blooded atrocity
   The atrocity of the war left many children orphaned.

#### massacre

 n. the brutal and indiscriminate killing of a large number of people; a violent and bloody event that typically results in the death of many individuals

synonym: slaughter, bloodbath, butchery

### courtroom

- n. a room in which a court of law is heldsynonym: law court, tribunal
- (1) **courtroom** drama, (2) **courtroom** trial

  The eyewitness took the stand in the **courtroom** and gave testimony crucial to the case.

#### counterattack

- n. an attack made in response to an attack by an enemy or opponent often intended to stop or oppose against it
   synonym: retaliation, reprisal, response
- (1) gear up for a **counterattack**, (2) launch a **counterattack** The company launched a **counterattack** against its rivals with a new marketing campaign.

# mockery

- n. the act of ridiculing or making fun of someone or something, often in a contemptuous or mocking manner synonym: ridicule, derision, taunt
- (1) **mockery** of the situation, (2) public **mockery**The comedian's **mockery** of the recent political scandal drew laughs from the crowd.

# housekeeping

 the management and upkeep of a household, hotel, or other living or working space, including cleaning, maintenance, organization, and other related tasks

synonym: cleaning, housework, tidying up

(1) **housekeeping** duties, (2) daily **housekeeping**The hotel's **housekeeping** staff does a great job keeping the rooms clean and tidy.

# grandparent

- n. a parent of one's father or mother
- (1) great- **grandparent**, (2) person of **grandparent** age She was close to her paternal **grandparents** and often spent summers with them.

#### cafeteria

n. a restaurant where customers serve themselves from a counter and pay for what they have taken, often found in factories, colleges, hospitals, etc.

synonym: canteen, mess hall, restaurant

(1) cafeteria lunch, (2) office cafeteria

The university's **cafeteria** was busy with students and staff grabbing a quick lunch.

#### deterrent

 something that prevents or discourages someone from doing something or taking a particular action; a hindrance or obstacle

synonym: hindrance, obstacle, impediment

(1) criminal **deterrent**, (2) nuclear **deterrent** 

The threat of punishment serves as a **deterrent** for many people who might consider committing a crime.

#### rescind

v. to officially revoke or cancel a decision, law, or agreement; to undo or annul something previously established

synonym: cancel, revoke, annul

(1) rescind a decision, (2) rescind a contract

The company had to **rescind** its new policy when it caused employee outrage.

# deport

- v. to force someone to leave a country, typically on the grounds of illegal status or for having committed a crime
   synonym: expel, banish, repatriate
- (1) **deport** a refugee, (2) **deport** dissidents from the party The government has decided to **deport** illegal immigrants back to their home countries.

# grit

 very small pieces of stone or sand; mental toughness and determination or perseverance in the face of challenges or obstacles

synonym: determination, fortitude, courage

(1) **grit** determination, (2) **grit** washer She has a lot of **grit** and determination to succeed.

#### unicorn

 a mythical horse-like creature with a single horn on its forehead; a privately held startup company that reached a valuation of \$1 billion

synonym: mythical creature, fantasy animal, legendary horse

(1) **unicorn** beetle, (2) **unicorn** investors
In medieval times, people believed that the **unicorn** horn had magical powers that could cure diseases.

#### cofounder

- one of several people who establishes an organization or starts a business
- (1) cofounder of the university, (2) late cofounderHe is the cofounder and chairman of this tech company.

#### curator

a person whose job is to manage the objects or artworks in a museum, art gallery, etc.

synonym: conservator, custodian, administrator

(1) curator of a library, (2) interim curator

The museum **curator** conserved the ancient manuscripts.

# improvisation

 the act of making something up on the spot or creating or performing something without preparation

*synonym*: spontaneity, ad-lib, extemporization

(1) improvisation on stage, (2) jazz improvisation

He created a beautiful piece of music using only improvisation.

## nanny

 a caregiver, usually a woman, who provides child care services in the home of the children's parents or guardians, either on a part-time or full-time basis

synonym: childcare provider, babysitter, nurse

(1) part-time nanny, (2) professional nanny

She works as a **nanny** for a family with two young children.

## reclaim

v. to take back something previously lost, given, or paid, or ask to have it back

synonym: recoup, regain, retake

(1) **reclaim** a competitive position, (2) **reclaim** land from the sea

You may be entitled to **reclaim** some tax.
