brag

smite

to say something in a boastful manner, to impress others, or make oneself feel superior

synonym: boast, swagger, vaunt

- to strike with a heavy blow or weapon; to defeat or conquer decisively; to afflict with sudden or severe pain or affliction

synonym: hit, strike, batter

The hero was able to **smite** the monster with a single blow.

hesitant

- adj. unsure or uncertain about what to do or how to act: reluctant or unwilling to take action or make a decision synonym: indecisive, uncertain, reluctant

hypocrite

a person who claims to have certain beliefs or values but acts in a way that contradicts those beliefs or values; a person who pretends to be virtuous or moral but behaves in an unethical or deceitful way

synonym: pretender, two-faced, insincere

(1) environmental hypocrite, (2) religious hypocrite She accused her boss of being a hypocrite for advocating for workers' rights while mistreating his employees.

tweet

- a short, high sound made by a small bird; a message sent using Twitter, the social media application *synonym*: peep, chirp, post (on Twitter)
- (1) a chick's tweet, (2) his latest tweets

We could hear the **tweet** of baby birds.

snark

 n. sarcastic or cutting remarks or comments intended to ridicule or undermine someone, often with a tone of superiority or disdain

synonym: criticism, sarcasm, irony

(1) media **snark**, (2) political **snark**She couldn't resist adding a little **snark** to her online comment.

offend

- v. to cause someone to feel upset, angry, or annoyed synonym: insult, hurt, anger
- (1) **offend** his sensibilities, (2) **offend** a customer His rude comments **offended** many people at the party.

smartphone

- a mobile phone that functions as a computer and connects to the Internet
- (1) **smartphone** app developer, (2) **smartphone** addict Internet traffic volumes have increased significantly with the advent of **smartphones**.

peril

synonym: hazard, danger, threat
