#### tectonics

n. the study of the processes that shape the Earth's surface, including the movements of tectonic plates, earthquakes, and volcanic activity

Global **tectonics** plays a critical role in the formation of mountain ranges and the movement of Earth's crustal plates.

## liquid

 a substance, such as water or oil that flows freely and is neither a solid nor a gas

synonym: fluid

## oxygen

- n. the chemical element with the symbol O that is present in air and water and is necessary for people, animals, and plants to live

## atmosphere

n. the mass of air that surrounds the Earth; the pervading tone or mood of a place, situation, or creative work

## pivotal

adj. relating to or acting as a pivot or central point; crucial or essential to the success or outcome of something

#### evolution

- a gradual process of transformation of living things
- synonym: elaboration, expansion, transition

#### observe

to watch or notice something carefully, often to gather ν. information or insights; to take note of something or someone; to celebrate or commemorate a special event or occasion

synonym: watch, monitor, scrutinize

(1) **observe** a tradition, (2) **observe** wildlife It is important to **observe** safety procedures in the workplace

to prevent accidents.

#### crawl

to move forward slowly, as people or animals with their bodies near the ground

synonym: creep, drag

(1) **crawl** across the floor, (2) **crawl** away from a car Along the gravel roads, sizeable yellow school buses crawl.

## microscopic

adj. tiny; exceedingly precise and detail-oriented; of or used in microscopy

synonym: infinitesimal, tiny, atomic

(1) **microscopic** inquiry, (2) **microscopic** analysis Inspectors noticed **microscopic** cracks in the submarine's hull.

#### bacteria

n. single-celled or noncellular spherical or spiral or rod-shaped organisms that exist in large numbers in the air, water, and soil, and also in living and dead creatures and plants, and are often a cause of disease

synonym: microorganism, microbe

- (1) pathogenic **bacteria**, (2) harmless **bacteria Bacteria** prevalent in hospitals are often resistant to antibiotics.
- any preserved remains, impression, or trace of any once-living thing that has become hard and turned into rock

## preserve

#### structure

fossil

#### stromatolite

n. a type of fossilized microbial mat formed by the growth and mineralization of cyanobacteria and other microorganisms, typically found in ancient sedimentary rocks and of great significance to the study of the Earth's early history and evolution

synonym: microbialite, fossilized stromatolite

trace

destroy

v. to ruin or damage severely or completely; to eradicate or eliminate completely

## deformity

- n. a physical abnormality or distortionsynonym: abnormality, malformation, disfigurement

## puzzle

 a situation that is difficult to follow or solve; a game, problem, or toy that tests a person's ingenuity or knowledge; (verb) to cause someone to feel confused because of something difficult to understand

synonym: plight, maze, (verb) perplex

(1) crossword **puzzle**, (2) mathematical **puzzle**This jigsaw **puzzle** is challenging because there are no pictures.

## volcanic

adj. relating to or produced by or consisting of volcano

(1) effects of **volcanic** eruptions, (2) increase in **volcanic** activity

This study indicates volcanic activity affects global warming.

## landscape

an expanse of scenery that can be seen in a single view;
 a large area of land, especially in the country and
 relating to its appearance

synonym: geography, terrain, topography

(1) a peaceful **landscape**, (2) **landscape** painting Recent electoral shocks have shaken the political **landscape** in Europe.

clue

 an object, a piece of evidence, or some information that helps someone to find the answer to a problem, question, or mystery

synonym: hint, indication, inkling

- (1) a **clue** about the crime, (2) a **clue** to the diagnosis. The police couldn't find a **clue** to her whereabouts.
- n. the first existence or beginning of somethingsynonym: root, source, ancestor

## origin

## (1) origin of information, (2) racial origin

There are various hypotheses concerning the **origin** of life.

## bunch

 a grouping of several similar things which are growing or fastened together

synonym: group, assemblage, bundle

(1) a **bunch** of trees, (2) a **bunch** of schoolgirls

One bad apple spoils the whole **bunch**.

#### wrinkle

 a small line or fold in something, especially fabric or the skin of the face; a minor difficulty

#### mound

 a raised area of ground or dirt, often used for burial, construction, or as a fortification; a large, rounded pile or heap

## peculiar

#### mentor

- a person who helps and advises a younger or less experienced person over time, usually at work or school synonym: adviser, coach, tutor

#### resemble

- to look like or be similar to someone or something synonym: look like, be similar to
- (1) **resemble** each other, (2) **resemble** her mother The brothers **resemble** each other in the hobby.

## hook

- a curved device used for suspending, holding, or pulling something, especially one attached to a surface for hanging things on; a sharp curve or crook
- (1) a hat **hook**, (2) the curved shape of a **hook** Please hang your towel on a hook.

## pond

a small, shallow lake synonym: lake, pool, basin

synonym: buckle, pin, curve

(1) a garden **pond**, (2) **pond** water The freshwater **pond** was home to many different types of fish and was a popular spot for fishing.

#### chemical

- adj. relating to or connected with chemistry; synonym: chemic, synthetic
- (1) toxic chemicals, (2) a chemical compound The firm has grown into a large **chemical** manufacturing.

## undergo

to go through something unpleasant or that involves a change

synonym: experience, suffer, endure

(1) **undergo** surgery, (2) **undergo** a decrease The train has to **undergo** rigorous safety checks.

## complexity

 the state or quality of being complicated or intricate and difficult to understand

synonym: intricacy, sophistication, elaboration

(1) cognitive **complexity**, (2) **complexity** theory

The project's **complexity** made it difficult for the team to complete it on time.

#### environment

 the natural world such as air, water, and land in which humans, animals, and plants live

synonym: atmosphere, surroundings, climate

environment affairs, (2) chaotic environment
 Every human is responsible for taking care of the Earth's environment.

#### dissolve

v. to be or cause to be absorbed by a liquid to form a part of the solution; to close down or dismiss

synonym: disband, disappear, liquefy

(1) **dissolve** the sugar, (2) officially **dissolved** the marriage The political party **dissolved** after much internal fighting.

#### mineral

- a solid inorganic substance occurring in nature having a definite chemical composition
- (1) vitamin and **minerals**, (2) **mineral** rights

  The robust economy of the country is based on its **mineral** resources.

## underlying

adj. significant as a cause or basis of something but not immediately apparent or stated clearly

synonym: fundamental, latent, basic

(1) an **underlying** motive, (2) an **underlying** cause of an accident

The **underlying** principle of every business was identical.

## organic

adj. of or derived from biological substance; producing plants and animals for food and other items without the use of synthetic chemicals

synonym: biological

## compound

 an item composed of two or more distinct elements combined; a chemical formed by the combination of two or more elements

synonym: combination, mixture, blend

## manufacture

v. to make goods in large numbers, usually in a factory using machines

synonym: create, fabricate, assemble

#### cellular

adj. of or connected with the cells of animals or plants; of or connected with a mobile telephone system that uses several short-range radio stations instead of wires

This factory employs a **cellular** manufacturing system.

## hydrothermal

adj. relating to hot water or steam, especially in the Earth's crust, and the thermal energy and chemical reactions that occur as a result

synonym: geothermal, thermal, volcanic

(1) **hydrothermal** vents, (2) **hydrothermal** chemistry The **hydrothermal** activity in this area creates a unique environment for marine creatures.

vent

 a small opening to escape or release gas, air, liquid, etc.; activity or process that frees or expresses strong creative energy or emotion

synonym: duct, outlet, venthole

He gave **vent** to his anger by playing the guitar.

## discovery

 the act or process of finding information, a place, or an object, or learning about something that was previously not known

synonym: finding, uncovering, detection

## locate

 to specify or determine the exact position of someone or something

synonym: discover, find, place

(1) locate a missing pet, (2) locate a tumor

The robot can accurately locate construction material.

#### arc

- n. the shape of a portion of a circle or other curved linesynonym: turn, bow, angle
- (1) the **arc** current, (2) an **arc** of a circumference A ball flew in a big **arc**.

#### billow

v. to surge or rise in a large, swelling mass, especially of smoke or water; (noun) a large wave or swell of something, especially water or smoke

synonym: wave, swell, surge

(1) **billow** cloud, (2) **billow** like a sail

The smoke billowed out of the chimney and into the sky.

## chimney

 a vertical structure that channels smoke or gas from a fire or furnace out of a building; a hollow column or tube that facilitates air or fluid flow throughout a system

synonym: flue, smokestack, stack

(1) smoke **chimney**, (2) **chimney** sweep
The **chimney** in the factory was constantly emitting dark smoke.

#### fluid

- n. a substance that can flow and is not solidsynonym: liquid, aqua, sap
- (1) plenty of **fluids**, (2) **fluid** assetsShe was diagnosed with a **fluid** buildup in her lungs.

#### scenario

- a description of possible actions or events in the future;
   a written outline of a play, film, or literary work
- synonym: plan, scheme, procedure

The president prepared several possible **scenarios** for an enemy attack.

## probabilistic

adj. characterized by the influence of chance or probability; involving the use of statistical models or methods to estimate likelihoods or risks

synonym: probable, statistical, likely

(1) **probabilistic** model, (2) **probabilistic** approach In a **probabilistic** system, the outcome is uncertain and can vary based on chance.

#### abundant

adj. present in great quantity

synonym: ample, plentiful, generative

### alternative

- n. one of two or more available possibilities or choicesynonym: choice, option
- (1) an **alternative** plan, (2) there is no other **alternative** Doctors are gradually coming around to the idea of using **alternative** medicines.

## perspective

a confident attitude toward something; a particular style of thinking about something

*synonym*: viewpoint, standpoint, outlook

(1) a **perspective** view, (2) the **perspective** of the battle His father's death changed his whole **perspective** on life.

#### conclude

to come to an end or close; to reach a judgment or opinion by reasoning

synonym: complete, finish, decide

(1) **conclude** a meeting, (2) **conclude** that he is healthy We **concluded** a cease-fire.

#### volcano

a mountain or hill, typically conical, having a crater or vent through which lava, rock fragments, hot vapor, and gas are or have been erupted from the earth's crust.

synonym: mount, peak, crater

(1) volcano alert level, (2) active volcano

The island was formed by a **volcano** millions of years ago.

## geology

a science that deals with the history of the earth as recorded in rocks

synonym: earth science

(1) bureau of **geology**, (2) local **geology** 

He was a visiting **geology** professor at the University of Tokyo.

#### candid

adj. honest, straightforward, and frank in someone's words or actions

synonym: honest, frank, straightforward

(1) candid conversation, (2) in my candid opinion

The **candid** photography captured the genuine emotions of the moment.

#### debatable

adj. open to discussion or argument; capable of being disputed or doubted

synonym: questionable, uncertain, open to discussion

(1) the validity of the theory is **debatable**, (2) **debatable**

#### flourish

## eventually

#### cosmic

adj. relating to the universe or cosmos; vast or limitless synonym: astronomical, celestial, outer-space

#### communal

adj. belonging to or used by a group rather than individuals; for common use

synonym: collaborative, combined, collective

## geologist

- a scientist or specialist who studies geology
- (1) planetary **geologist**, (2) marine **geologist**

These issues baffled **geologists** for many years.

refer

v. to direct someone's attention, thoughts, or questions to another source or person; to mention, cite, or allude to something as evidence or support

synonym: cite, allude, mention

oxide

- a chemical compound that contains at least one oxygen atom and one other element

imply

v. to indicate the truth or existence of something without referring to it

meter

a device used to measure the amount of a particular substance or attribute, such as length, volume, or time; (prosody) the accent in a metrical foot of verse

exposed

adj. having no protection or shield from something, such as bad weather, attack, or criticism

#### gorge

- a deep narrow valley between hills or mountains, usually with steep sides and a river running through it
- synonym: canyon, gully, ravine

#### carve

- v. to create something by cutting wood or stone; to turn sharply
- *synonym*: sculpt, engrave, cut

#### nation

- a large organized community of people living in a particular country or region and having a particular culture
- synonym: country, state, sovereign entity
- (1) **nation-state**, (2) a seafaring **nation**The **nation** of Japan is known for its unique culture and advanced technology.

#### arrival

- the act or situation of coming or being brought to a place; accomplishment of an objective
- *synonym*: reaching, appearance, coming
- (1) **arrival** and departure gate, (2) **arrival** at a conclusion Weather forecasters are predicting the **arrival** of a heatwave.

#### evolve

- v. to develop gradually, or to cause the development of something or someone gradually
- synonym: develop, mature, grow
- (1) **evolve**, (2) **evolve** over the past decade Eyeless fish **evolved** in dark caves.

#### ozone

- a poisonous gas with the chemical formula O3, which has a strong smell
- (1) ozone depletion, (2) atmospheric ozoneThe ozone layer is vital for blocking some harmful sun rays.

#### modern

adj. of or belonging to the present time or recent times synonym: contemporary, stylish, current

(1) **modern** poetry, (2) pre- **modern** agricultural society Their headquarters are in a **modern** skyscraper.

## radiation

n. the energy that comes from a nuclear reaction in the form of rays, waves, or particles and that can be hazardous to health

synonym: dissemination, emission, irradiation

(1) exposure to **radiation**, (2) electromagnetic **radiation**He tried every possible treatment, including chemotherapy and **radiation** therapy.

ironic

adj. using words to express something different from and often opposite to their literal or usual meaning, often for humorous or rhetorical effect

synonym: sarcastic, wry, sardonic

## twist

- v. to bend or turn something into a certain shapesynonym: wrench, turn, twirl

#### microbe

 a tiny living thing that can only be seen with a microscope and that may cause disease

synonym: germ, microorganism, bacterium

#### essence

n. the basic or most important part or quality of something that makes it what it is

synonym: core, nature, disposition

the matter.

## relinquish

v. to give up power, control, or possession

*synonym*: surrender, give up, abandon

(1) relinquish control, (2) relinquish all hope

She decided to **relinquish** her role as the leader of the group.

## reign

 the period of time during which a monarch or government holds power; (verb) to be the king or queen

*synonym*: rule, governance, sovereignty

(1) **reign** of a dictator, (2) **reign** as sovereign

The dictator's **reign** was characterized by widespread human rights abuses and suppression of political opposition.

#### fossilized

adj. transformed into a fossil (= something preserved in rock for a very long period) or preserved in the form of a fossil; antiquated or inflexible

synonym: petrified, ossified, preserved

fuel

 a substance that is typically burned to generate heat or energy

synonym: energy, power, gas

## pump

 to cause water, air, gas, etc. to move from one place to another by using mechanical equipment; to get or supply something such as money, information, etc. in significant quantities

synonym: drain, inject, send

(1) **pump** a secret out of success, (2) **pump** blood throughout the body

He was alert and could not **pump** any critical information out of him.

vast

adj. enormous in size, number, amount, or quantitysynonym: expansive, extended, boundless

(1) vast majority, (2) vast desert

A **vast** audience viewed the broadcast.

#### carbon

- a chemical element that can be found in pure form as diamond or graphite, and it is also an essential part of coal and oil and is found in all plants and animals
- carbon dioxide, (2) carbon emission
   Trees absorb carbon dioxide and give off oxygen.

#### predecessor

 a person who held a position or office before the current holder

synonym: antecedent, forerunner, precursor

#### substantial

adj. fairly large in size, value, or importance synonym: significant, notable, actual

#### demise

n. death or the end of something

synonym: death, passing, end

## intelligent

adj. having the capacity for thought and reason, especially to a high degree

synonym: brilliant, clever, competent
