#### expansive

- synonym: large, extensive, vast

#### expanse

 a substance, such as water or oil, that flows freely and is neither a solid nor a gas synonym: stretch, field, spread

(1) vast expanse, (2) large expanses

She looked over the immense **expanse** of the sea.

#### confession

 a formal statement in which one admits that they have done something wrong or illegal

synonym: admission, avowal, acknowledgment

The prisoner made a full **confession** and admitted to his crime.

### stigma

 a mark of shame or disgrace associated with a particular circumstance, quality, or person

synonym: mark, blemish, disgrace

(1) social **stigma**, (2) **stigma** against obesity

The mental health **stigma** often prevents people from seeking treatment.

## imperfectly

adv. in a faulty or incomplete way

synonym: amiss, insufficiently, clumsily

(1) **imperfectly** developed, (2) **imperfectly** known disease He created an **imperfectly** shaped torso.

#### insecure

adj. not firm or firmly fixed; likely to fail or give way, or not assured of safety

synonym: uncertain, unsure, unconfident

(1) an **insecure** future, (2) **insecure** attachment

Children in an unstructured environment often feel insecure.

#### excite

- v. to make someone feel suddenly enthusiastic or eager synonym: thrill, exhilarate, animate
- (1) **excite** the crowd, (2) **excite** rebellion The news of her promotion **excited** her.

#### externalize

v. to give external form, expression, or material existence to something that was previously internal or subjective;

to make explicit or apparent something that was previously unconscious or repressed

synonym: express, manifest, materialize

- (1) **externalize** responsibilities, (2) **externalize** costs It's important to **externalize** your feelings and not keep them bottled up.

synonym: application, software

(1) killer **app**, (2) cannot log in to the **app**The discovery of a critical bug caused the company to delay the **app's** release.

to pay out money, usually from a fund or account; to distribute or give out resources or benefits

synonym: spend, payout, distribute

(1) disburse money, (2) disburse dividends

The company will **disburse** funds to the employees once the paperwork is processed.

 dense, wet, and dirty matter or waste, often found in soil or on the ground; animal waste

synonym: dirt, mud, droppings

(1) construction **muck**, (2) **muck** on clothes

The horses waded through the **muck** in the field after the rainstorm.

synonym: kin, family, clan

(1) kindred feeling, (2) kindred souls

The **kindred** spirits bonded over their shared love of art and music.

#### misunderstand

#### yell

v. to shout in a sudden and loud way

synonym: shout, scream, cry

#### inhabit

synonym: settle, occupy, populate

# propagate

 to spread or promote something widely, particularly beliefs, ideas, or plants and animals through reproduction

synonym: propagate, multiply, reproduce

(1) propagate a rumor, (2) propagate plants

The company is working hard to **propagate** their brand message to as many people as possible

#### misinformation

*n.* information that is false or inaccurate, or the act of giving wrong information, especially deliberately

*synonym*: falsity, misreport, misstatement

(1) **misinformation** about a vaccine, (2) combat **misinformation** on social media

The government called for caution against pseudoscientific **misinformation** about vaccines.

### superfluous

adj. unnecessary; more than what is needed or requiredsynonym: extra, unnecessary, redundant

(1) **superfluous** information, (2) **superfluous** words

The recipe called for a **superfluous** amount of salt and made the dish too salty.

#### inflate

v. to fill something with air or gas so that it becomes bigger and rounder

synonym: blow up, expand, puff up

(1) **inflate** a tire, (2) **inflate** expense reports She **inflated** the balloons for the party.

synonym: despairing, helpless, futile

#### sliver

n. a small, thin, narrow piece or fragment of something, often characterized by its length or its sharpness or thinness; a small portion or amount of something, often used in a metaphorical sense to describe a trace or a hint of something

synonym: splinter, shard, fragment
